

# Louisiana Medicaid Hospital Presumptive Eligibility (HPE) Summary Sheet

<b>What is Hospital Presumptive Eligibility (HPE)?</b>	Participating hospitals may take advantage of HPE to immediately enroll individuals likely to be eligible for Medicaid.
<b>When did HPE become effective?</b>	January 1, 2014, in accordance with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, also referred to as ACA.
<b>To participate as a Hospital Presumptive Eligibility Qualified Entity (HPEQE), the hospital must:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• be enrolled as a Louisiana Medicaid provider under the Medicaid state plan or a Medicaid 1115 Demonstration;</li> <li>• not have been suspended or excluded from participating in the Medicaid Program;</li> <li>• notify Louisiana Medicaid of its election to make HPE determinations</li> <li>• agree to adhere to Louisiana Medicaid rules and regulations governing participation in the HPE Program; and</li> <li>• be trained and certified by Louisiana Medicaid to make HPE determinations.</li> <li>• assist individuals with completing an application for regular Medicaid</li> </ul>
<b>What populations are eligible through HPE?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dependent children under age 19</li> <li>• Pregnant Women</li> <li>• Parents and Caretaker Relatives</li> <li>• Former Foster Care Children under age 26</li> <li>• Childless Adults which includes certain individuals needing treatment for breast and/or cervical cancer (BCC)*</li> <li>• Take Charge</li> </ul>
<b>What services are covered under HPE programs?</b>	Covered services are the same as for the corresponding Medicaid type case with the exception of HPE Pregnant Women which only covers ambulatory services.
<b>How are HPE eligibility determinations made?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• BHSF Form 1-HPE is the simplified assessment tool used to determine eligibility.</li> <li>• The individual must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Belong to an HPE population</li> <li>○ Have income within the Medicaid program limits</li> <li>○ Not be currently enrolled in Medicaid</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Louisiana requires two additional eligibility factors: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ State residency</li> <li>○ Citizenship Status</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Hospitals will use a simplified method to calculate income. Full Modified Adjusted Gross Income Criteria is not necessary.</li> <li>• Verifications shall not be required</li> </ul>

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<b>How long does it take for an individual to be approved for HPE?</b>	Approval is immediate upon completion of assessment. A copy of the BHSF Form 1-HPE is provided as proof of eligibility.
<b>What is the HPE certification period?</b>	The HPE certification period begins the day the hospital makes the HPE determination and ends either: (1) the day the state makes the full Medicaid determination*; or (2) the last day of the month following the month in which the hospital makes the HPE determination, whichever comes first.
<b>How many times may an individual be approved for HPE?</b>	Once every 12 months or once per pregnancy.
<b>What are the MEDS case types for HPE program?</b>	HPE cases will be indicated by category "16". Type case will be the same as the regular Medicaid MAGI case. For example, HPE for a pregnant woman would be 016-013 to correspond with the regular Medicaid case 003-013.
<b>Matching and recovery</b>	Regular FFP match. States will not be permitted to recoup money from the hospital for services rendered during the presumptive eligibility period.
<b>Are there any other special requirements of the hospital?</b>	See Table 1 for performance measure requirements.

<b>Table 1</b> Performance Indicator	Benchmark
Number of HPE enrollees who also file a BHSF Form 1-A for full Medicaid benefits.	<u>70</u> %
HPE determination also results in HPE enrollee's eligibility for full Medicaid benefits, based on full applications received.	<u>85</u> %
Verify that HPE enrollees have not received HPE coverage within the past 12 months, within the same facility.	<u>85</u> %
Verify that HPE enrollees are not currently enrolled in Medicaid.	<u>95</u> %

\*BCC screening and diagnosis must be by a provider certified in the Louisiana Breast & Cervical Health Program, funded by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and administered by the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center (LSUHSC)
