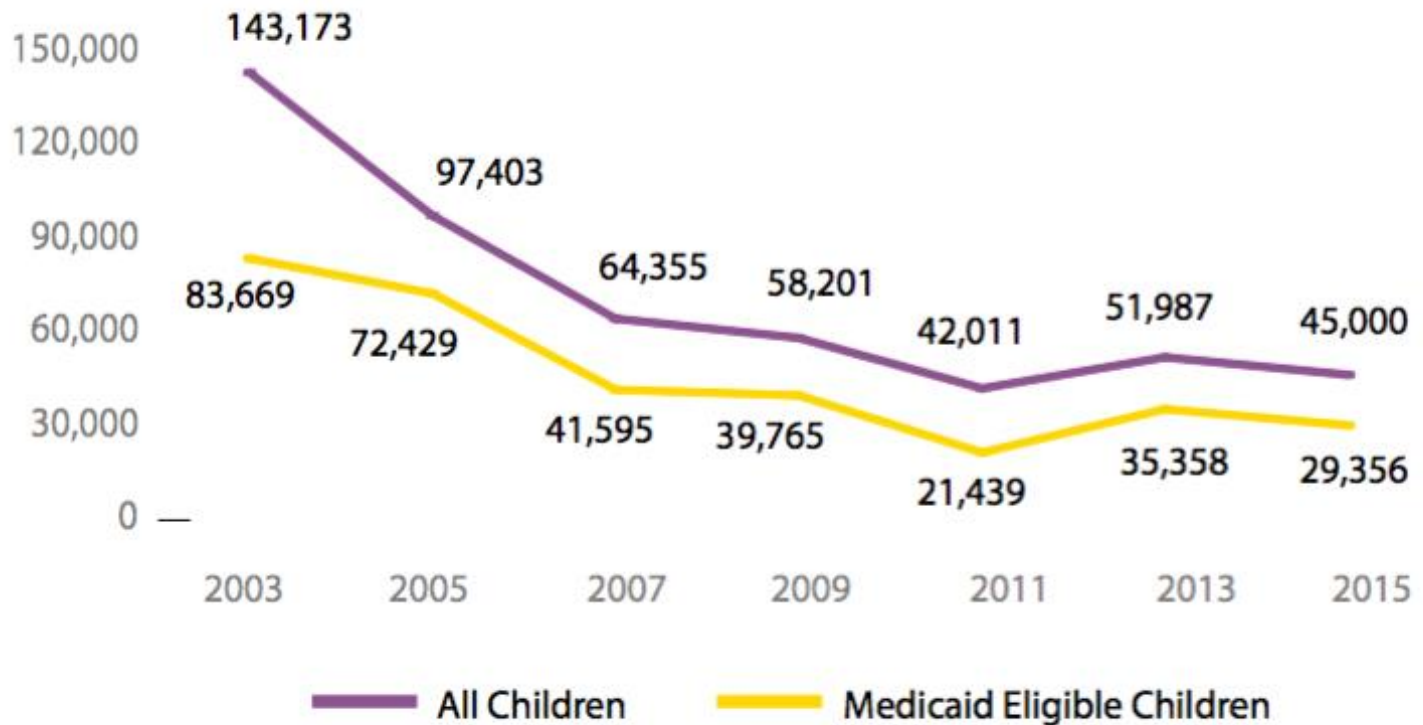
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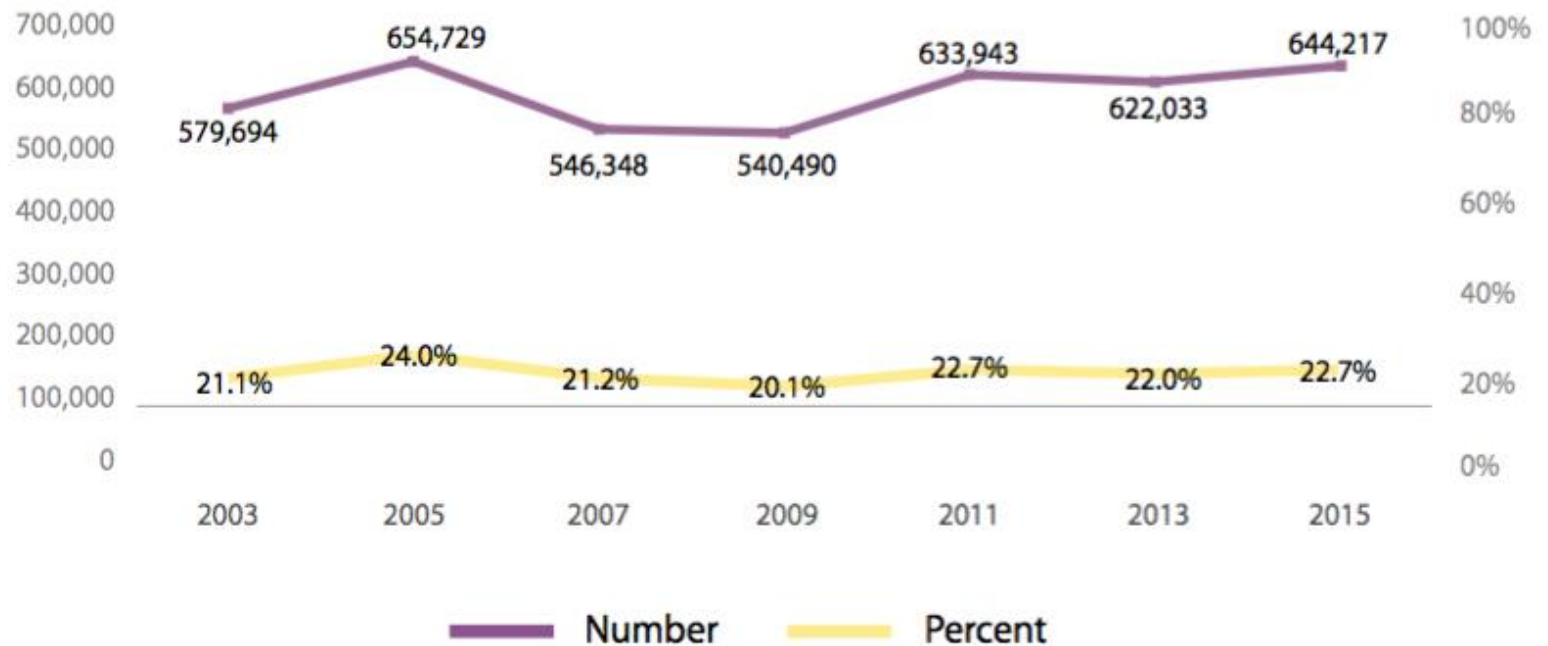

# Uninsured Adults by Federal Poverty Level

Uninsured Rate Adults (19-64) by FPL		
FPL Category	Rate	Number
Under 24% FPL	35.1%	99,559
24 - 100% FPL	38.1%	146,384
100 - 138% FPL	35.5%	81,778
138 - 150% FPL	37.3%	26,888
150-200% FPL	27.4%	79,098
200-250% FPL	22.7%	52,550
250-300% FPL	19.7%	42,159
300-400% FPL	13.0%	43,302
More than 400% FPL	9.1%	72,500

- Uninsured Rates are highest under 138% FPL, and decrease as income increases
- The uninsured rate under 24% FPL are slightly lower than next income group because parents under 24% FPL are eligible for Medicaid

Houma-Thibodaux 3	37.2%	26,180
Acadiana 4	37.6%	49,077
Central 6	39.5%	42,607
Northwest 7	36.6%	45,832
Northeast 8	39.5%	35,840
Northshore 9	37.0%	40,070

- Highest uninsured rates come from Central and Northeast Louisiana, traditionally poorer and more rural regions
- Lowest uninsured rate from Baton Rouge region, which has strong economy currently

# Uninsured Newly Eligible Adults by Region

Uninsured Adults Under 138% FPL by Region		
Region	Percent	Number
New Orleans 1	37.0%	51,529
Baton Rouge 2	32.1%	33,959
Houma-Thibodaux 3	38.4%	25,006
Acadiana 4	39.6%	47,776
Central 6	40.9%	41,207
Northwest 7	37.6%	43,403
Northeast 8	40.3%	34,585
Northshore 9	38.3%	37,958

- Difference between this and the under 138% FPL population (previous slide) is that parents under 24% FPL have been taken out

# Uninsured Parents vs Childless Adults

- Uninsured rate among parents: 17.1%
- Uninsured rate among childless adults: 25.3%
- There are still a lot of uninsured parents who were eligible for Medicaid before expansion
- Potential increase in enrollment from the “woodwork effect”

Uninsured	36.5%	327,720
Medicaid	23.9%	214,738
Employer sponsored	20.1%	180,523
Medicare	10.1%	90,606
Purchased	6.9%	62,364
Former Employer	5.3%	47,829
Military	3.7%	33,221
Not in Household	2.7%	24,062

- Not **all** adults under 138% FPL are uninsured
- Largest source of coverage for adults under 138% FPL is Medicaid (parents, disabled), but approximately 1/5 have employer sponsored insurance.

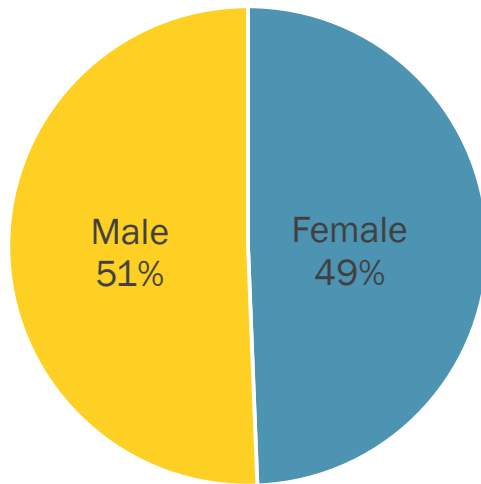




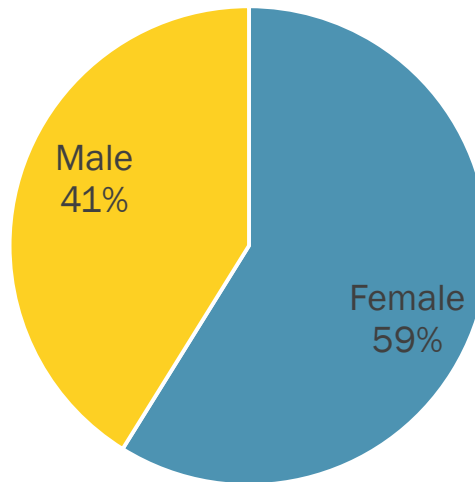

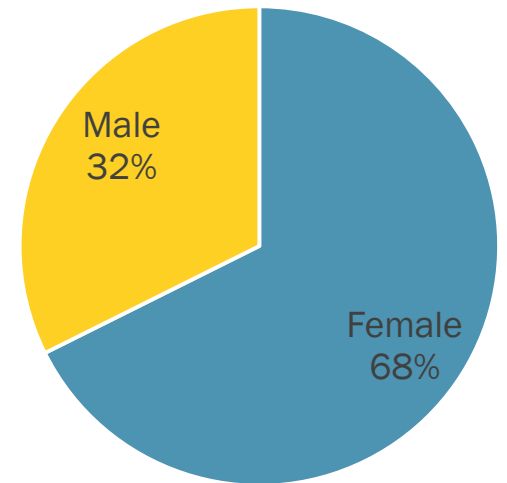

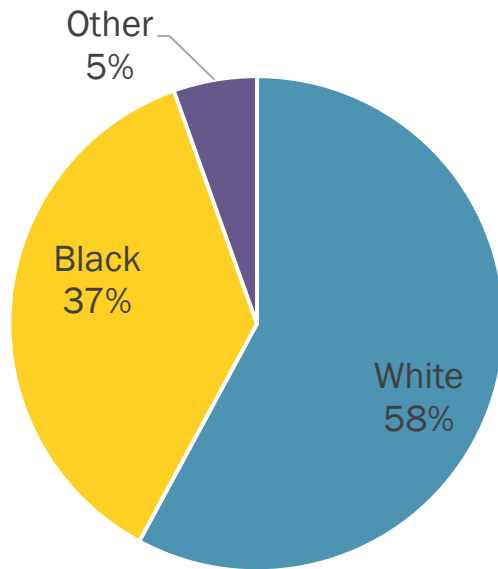

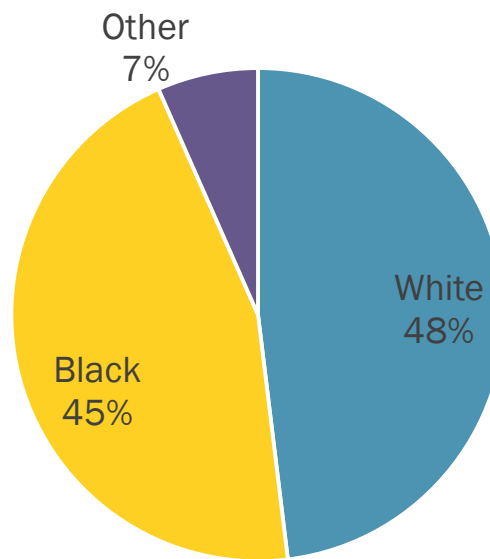

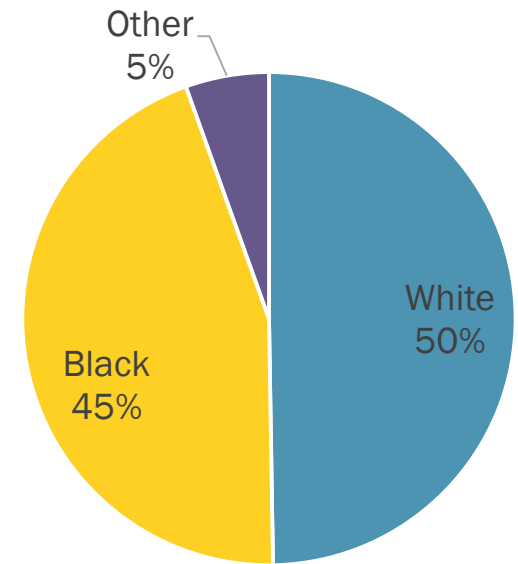

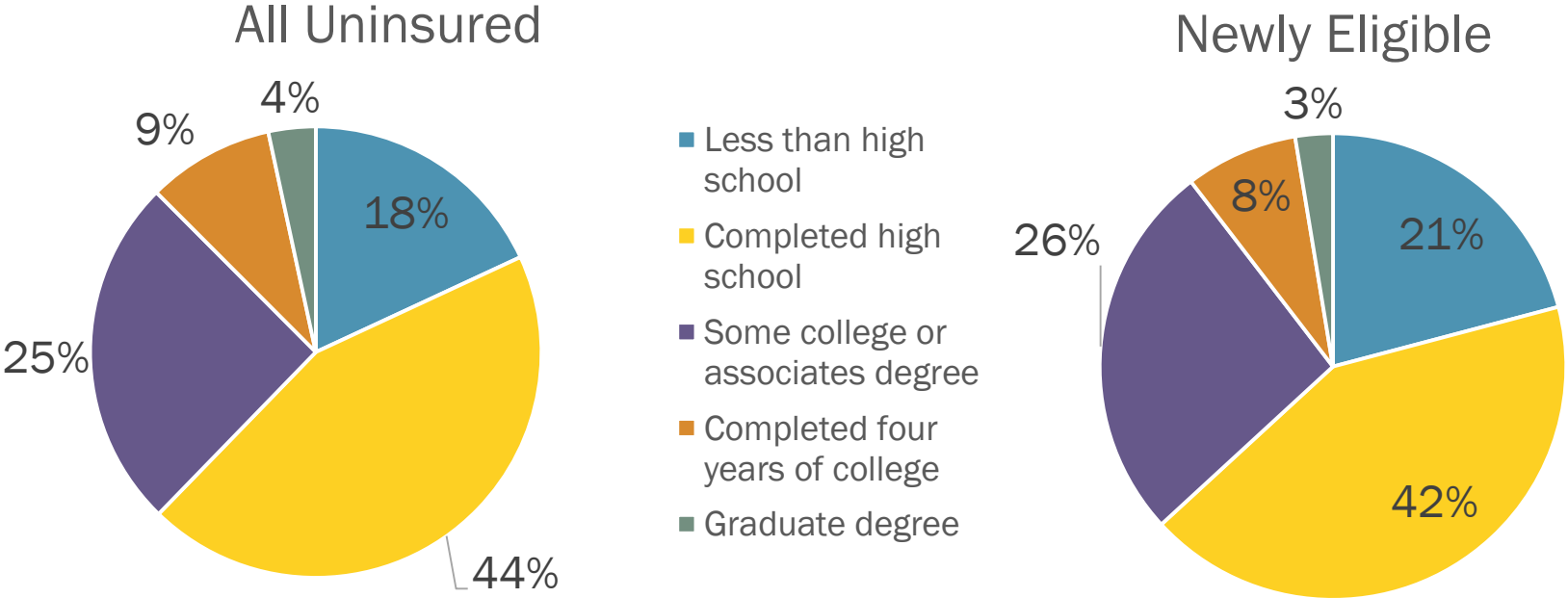


# AGE

to all uninsured

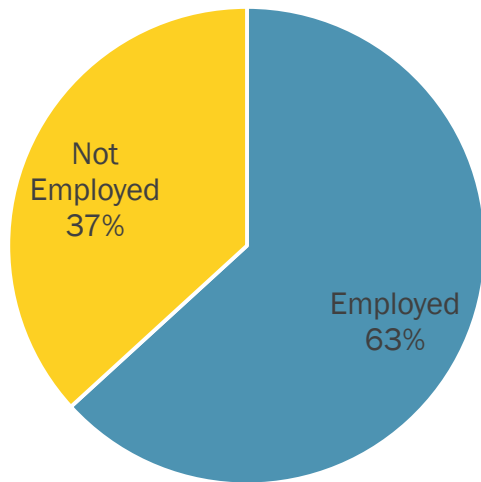

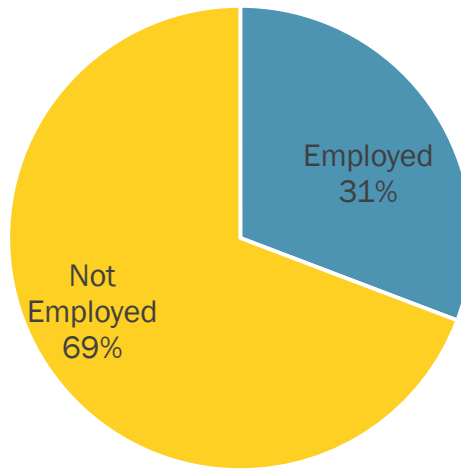
