In previous roles at OJJ, he was responsible for oversight of food services, facility and community-based treatment, and educational programs across the state. Williams will oversee a broad range of programming, including all of the long-term care programs that serve senior citizens and people with adult-onset disabilities in Louisiana. Some of the initiatives under Williams' leadership will include the Community Choices Waiver, Long-Term Personal Care Services, Adult Protective Services, Permanent Supportive Housing and Louisiana's Traumatic Head and Spinal Cord Injury Trust Fund Program.

Prior to OJJ, Williams was a state budget management analyst in the Louisiana Office of Planning and Budget. He previously worked for many years at an executive level in finance and banking.
