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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

SB 57 (Act 117) of the 2013 Regular Session requires the Department of Health and Hospital to form the Louisiana Sickle Cell Commission. Act 117 outlines membership on the commission and the function of the committee. Membership is by appointment of the Governor, subject to Senate confirmation and is inclusive of a representative from each of the following:

- The Sickle Cell Center of Southern Louisiana – Tulane University School of Medicine
- Children's Hospital – New Orleans
- The Louisiana Primary Care Association
- The Baton Rouge Sickle Cell Anemia Foundation, Inc.
- Northeast Louisiana Sickle Cell Anemia Technical Resource Foundation, Inc.
- Sickle Cell Disease Association of America, Inc.- Northwest Louisiana Chapter
- The Sickle Cell Anemia Research Foundation, Alexandria
- The Southwest Louisiana Sickle Cell Anemia, Inc.
- The Secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals or a Designee
- One member of the Louisiana Senate
- One member of the Louisiana House of Representatives

The functions of the committee are to: 1) Ensure delivery of sickle cell services to affected person in all parishes in Louisiana and assist in establishing geographical service delivery boundaries, 2) Promulgate guidelines for creating uniformity of service delivery to sickle cell patients, 3) Submit budget recommendations to the legislature and the governor, prepare and publish an annual report on sickle cell.

The commission has formed the following workgroups that will focus on the mandates outlined in the Act: Medical Services, Patient Navigation, Education & Advocacy, Data & Surveillance and Budget. The report below details the membership of the commission and the activities proposed by the workgroups during the 2014-2015 Fiscal Year.

THE LOUISIANA SICKLE CELL COMMISSION

INTRODUCTION

Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) is an inherited disorder of a protein called hemoglobin in red blood cells. Red blood cells are responsible for carrying oxygen in the blood to the body's tissues. Normal red blood cells contain Hemoglobin A and are round shaped. However, the presence of Hemoglobin S causes red blood cells to become sickle shaped and this distortion can cause the red blood cells to block off blood vessels and impede the delivery of oxygen. The effects of this can be severe pain (also known as sickle cell crisis) and can lead to permanent damage of the brain, liver, kidneys, bones and spleen.

Each year, approximately 80 infants are born with SCD in Louisiana. It is estimated that there are approximately 3000 children and adults living with SCD in the state.

In the past, the life expectancy for patients living with SCD was not much past the twenties. However, with improved identification and treatment, the life expectancy has greatly improved and patients can live well into their 60s with the proper resources. However, the provision of the proper resources for patients with sickle cell disease is limited.

Because of unstructured service delivery, Sickle Cell Disease has placed a tremendous burden on medical services, especially with Medicaid. Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) was the top diagnosis category with readmissions for Louisiana Medicaid patients in 2011 – of 1,630 Medicaid discharges, 313 (19.2%) resulted in readmissions. 77.7% of readmissions were for adult patients over the age of 18. Of the 1,630 Medicaid SCD discharges from inpatient settings, 17.25% of the SCD discharges involved behavioral health comorbidities.

Due to the increase in SCD life expectancy, the adult SCD population is considered a relatively new population and is growing. Currently, there are very few resources and a lack of access to care for adult SCD patients in Louisiana:

- Few adult hematologists specialize in the care of SCD patients.
- Preventive and specialized acute and non-acute services for SCD patients are limited due to low Medicaid reimbursement rates.
- Adult patients experience difficulty obtaining insurance coverage once they turn 18 due to the gap in time before they are covered by Medicaid.
- There are almost no programs geared toward individuals who are transitioning from the pediatric to the adult SCD treatment arena.

While access to care for SCD is typically not an issue for pediatric patients, the following additional opportunities for intervention have been identified for the pediatric and adult SCD populations as a whole:

- Currently no registry/database or program exists to track SCD patients throughout their lifetime to ensure that they are not lost to follow-up.
- There are deficits in SCD patient and family education and engagement in both the pediatric and adult populations.

The overall goal of the Louisiana Sickle Cell Commission is to address these concerns and formulate actions to reduce the burden of SCD in Louisiana.

Partnerships

Along with the organizations and individuals appointed by the Governor, other state agencies and stakeholders have expressed interest in attending the commission's public meetings. Partnerships include Louisiana Medicaid, Bayou Health Plans, Genetic Diseases Program, Title V Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs Programs, LSU Medical Centers (New Orleans and Shreveport) and private citizens affected by SCD.

Workgroup Activities

During meetings over the past year, the committee has selected a chairperson (Lorri Burgess) and a vice-chairperson (Dr. Renee Gardiner) and developed workgroups that will provide guidance on promulgating the activities of the commission. The information below outlines the goals objectives, relevant activities and performance measures of each workgroup.

1. Medical Services

Goal: To improve medical access and care for people with sickle cell disease while reducing health care cost in Louisiana

Objectives:

- a) Improve access to acute pain treatment
- b) Improve chronic pain management
- c) Create a patient centered medical home
- d) Improve access to specialized sickle cell outpatient care

Relevant Activities

- a) Create sickle cell day hospitals to provide appropriate care for acute pain and minimize ER visits an hospital admission
- b) Create multidisciplinary pain management teams to reduce ER utilization, manage narcotic dependence and reduce overall narcotic use
- c) Work with primary care physicians to create a patient centered medical home which will decrease inappropriate referrals and duplication of care
- d) Train and engage more outpatient practitioners in the care of sickle cell care

Performance Measures

- a) Decrease ER visits and hospital admissions
- b) Decreased ER utilization, decreased narcotic utilization
- c) Sickle cell centers in LA are approved patient centered medical homes
- d) Patients will have easier access to sickle cell specific outpatient care (decreased wait time to see a sickle cell specialist)

2. Patient Navigation

Goal: To provide education and guidance to improve physical health care, mental health care, social services, and public education for a person living with sickle cell disease.

Objectives:

- a) Establish confidence and trust with clients and families
- b) Establish partnerships with agencies and medical professionals
- c) Establish advocacy and support groups for clients

Relevant Activities:

- a) Assist clients in securing a medical home
- b) Assist clients in connecting with other social service providers
- c) Assist clients in establishing educational and job search opportunities
- d) Outreach activities that include health fairs

Performance Measure:

Performance measures will be determined by the number of clients that were able to establish a medical home, and referrals made

3. Education & Advocacy

Goal: To educate citizens and other stakeholders on Sickle Cell Disease

Objectives:

- a) Establish state wide print and media campaign to be inclusive of all activities.
- b) Coordinate with Louisiana Sickle Cell Association (LASCA) for Annual Sickle Cell Disease State Conference.
- c) Establish links to Louisiana Sickle Cell Foundations from the Genetics Program's section on DHH website.
- d) Assemble a sickle cell disease state-wide informational publication, to include PSAs (video/audio) and directory, featuring each state agency/organization.

Relevant Activities:

- a) Coordinate with state DHH media representative
- b) Plan state-wide conference
- c) Each agency/organization with present link to DHH media representative
- d) A profile sheet will be designed for each agency/organization to provide information, pictures, etc., for publication, PSAs and directory

Performance Measures:

Evaluations will be conducted after each activity to assess the effectiveness of the activity

4. Data & Surveillance

Goal: To maintain an active surveillance system for Sickle Cell Disease patients in Louisiana.

Objectives:

- a) Develop surveillance system/registry for the tracking of sickle cell disease in Louisiana with the following info:

- i. Demographics characteristics and geographic distribution of sickle cell patients in Louisiana
- ii. Health care utilization, costs of care, and the geographic variation of specific services
- iii. Current sickle cell patients on the rosters of Sickle Cell Foundations and Office of Public Health's Genetic Diseases Program

Relevant Activities:

- a) Review data sources that should be included in surveillance system
- b) Develop report utilizing Medicaid data to show the distribution and costs of Sickle Cell disease in Louisiana

Performance Measures:

Creation of surveillance system by March 2015

5. Budget Recommendations

Patient Navigator Program - \$440,000

The Sickle Cell Commission has determined that many sickle cell patients could benefit from a Patient Navigation program to provide linkages to specialty care. This proposal from the five Sickle Cell Foundations would include eight patient navigators located statewide based on the geographic location of Sickle Cell patients established utilizing Medicaid data. The Patient Navigators would be versed in health education and preferably have Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES) certification. Utilizing individuals with CHES certification would tremendously decrease spending on training costs.

These patient navigators would also serve as the outreach coordinator, coordinating family educational sessions as well as serving as patient case managers, directly contributing to the continuum of care for both the patient and family. Furthermore, patient navigators would be responsible for identifying and contacting patients, conducting home visits with patients' family members, and coordinating care for patients. Patient Navigators would also undergo care coordination training and training on eliciting patient involvement as active participants and decision-makers within their *own* care. Patient navigators would provide one-on-one guidance and assistance to individuals as they move through the health care continuum from prevention to end-of-life care. The principal function of the navigator would be to eliminate any and all barriers to timely screening, diagnosis, treatment, and supportive care for each individual.

Salary & Benefits	\$45,500 (\$35,000 salary + \$10,500 benefits @ 30%)
Training Costs	\$1,000 per navigator (Training at Harold P. Freeman Patient Navigation Institute)
Travel	\$2,500 per navigator (mileage for home visits, travel to training at Navigation Institute)
Equipment/Supplies	\$1,000 per navigator (Laptop, educational materials, office supplies)
Administrative Costs	\$5,000 per navigator (10% overhead costs for foundations to support patient navigators)

CONCLUSION

If managed properly, patients with Sickle Cell Disease, can live longer, productive lives and reduce the burden of medical costs on the medical infrastructure of the state. This initial report provides a snapshot of the initial activities of the Sickle Cell Commission to combat sickle cell disease in Louisiana. It is recommended that funds are made available to the Louisiana Sickle Cell Commission based on proposed budget recommendations to fulfill workgroup activities. Also, included as an attachment to this report is a data report which provides a context for the costs associated with Sickle Cell patients (children and adults) who are on Medicaid.

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



Executive Summary

- This work is a sample of those with Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) in Louisiana. It is not the total number of known cases which would include those not on Medicaid and/or without a recent Medicaid SCD claim.
- What follows is a summary of Medicaid claims in Calendar year 2013 related to those in The Registry created exclusively for this research.
- The Registry includes 5,749 persons in Louisiana who were both eligible for Medicaid and incurred a SCD related Medicaid claim between Jan-2009 and May-2014.
- Results are associated with each person's last known address in the Medicaid Eligibility Determination System (MEDS) as of May 2014, not necessarily residence at the time of claim.
- 436 (7.5%) were either not eligible on or after Apr-2012, when location tracking of eligible began, or we were otherwise unable to assign any geographic identifiers to them (i.e. aged out of eligibility since, out of state, etc.)
- This Medicaid sub-population represents 0.41% of the total Medicaid Population and 2.5x that (1.0%) of the total Medicaid Cost (FY13 Medicaid Report).
- This Medicaid sub-population had:
 - an average cost of \$11,720 per person, (overall per member cost of Medicaid, \$4,511; FY13 Medicaid Report)
 - an average of \$3,964 SCD related claims per member,
 - an average of \$488 SCD related ER claims per member
- We were unable to place 263 (4.6%) individuals to an address so their geographic identifiers were left "unassigned" though their claims were included.
