

## What is My Place Louisiana?

My Place Louisiana helps physically-disabled, elderly, and developmentally-disabled adults and children transition out of a qualified institution and back into home and community-based living settings.

This program repurposes Medicaid funds that would have paid for eligible individuals to receive care in a nursing home, intermediate care facility, or hospital and uses that money to establish them in home or community-based services.

Even after a participant's transition from a facility, My Place Louisiana continues to follow and support participants for the next 365 days to ensure a successful transition.

## What We Do

Once a participant meets all of the qualifications, a My Place Louisiana transition coordinator then provides support with the logistics of moving and helps with establishing the supports and services the participant will need to live safely and successfully in the community.

By providing customized care plans and personal assistance for program participants to move safely into their own homes - either independently or with family - we give people an opportunity to live in the community that they otherwise may not have had.



## My Place Louisiana is administered by two Louisiana Department of Health offices:

### Office of Aging and Adult Services (OAAS)

OAAS administers long-term care programs that serve Louisiana's senior citizens (65 and older) and adults (who developed a disability at age 22 or later) with physical disabilities.

### Office for Citizens with Developmental Disabilities (OCDD)

OCDD oversees public and private residential services and other services for children and adults with developmental disabilities.

## Who is eligible for My Place Louisiana?

- Must qualify for Medicaid
- Must qualify for an OAAS or OCDD waiver
- Must currently reside in a nursing facility, intermediate care facility, or hospital for at least 60 consecutive days
- Must qualify for home and community-based services\*

\* As determined by the Louisiana Medicaid Office and local Regional Offices
