OAAS also operates one nursing facility, Villa Feliciana Medical Complex, located in Jackson, LA, that provides specialized care and rehabilitative services to medically complex residents.

Adult Protective Services

Adult Protective Services is responsible for investigating reports and arranging for services to protect vulnerable adults ages 18-59 and emancipated minors, who are at risk of abuse, neglect, exploitation or extortion.



Adult Protective Services investigates:

- ▶ Physical abuse
- Sexual abuse
- ▶ Emotional abuse
- ▶ Financial exploitation
- Caregiver neglect
- ▶ Self-neglect

ALL Louisiana citizens are required to report suspected cases of abuse and neglect. The Office of Aging and Adult Services is here to help. Reports may be made 24 hours a day, seven days a week by contacting the Adult Protective Services Hotline.
