R.S. 49:950 et seq., the secretary hereby gives notice that rulemaking procedures have been initiated to promulgate amendments to the rules governing the administration of Council on the Purchase of Goods and Services of Individuals with Disabilities.

> This proposed rule change will allow individuals with disabilities to work alongside individuals without disabilities in non-segregated settings earning a fair wage. The proposed rule also includes changes to remove references to sheltered workshops and replace with supported employment provider in addition to making the necessary people first language changes. The proposed amendment is to update the Rule pursuant to ACT 312 of 2019 Regular Legislative Session.

The proposed rule also includes changes to remove references to sheltered workshops and replace with supported employment provider in addition to making the necessary people first language changes. The proposed amendment is to update the Rule pursuant to ACT 312 of the 2019 Regular Legislative Session.

Chapter 9. Council on the Purchase of Goods and Services of Individuals with Disabilities

§901. General Rules

A. The purpose of this program is to further the state of Louisiana/DSSLouisiana's policy of encouraging and assisting citizensindividuals with disabilities to achieve maximum personal independence by engaging in useful and productive employment activities and, in addition, to furnish products and services to the provide state, and to reduce the need for institutionalization. agencies, departments, and institutions and political subdivisions of the state with a method for achieving conformity with requirements of nondiscrimination and affirmative action in employment matters related to individuals with disabilities. This jobemployment opportunities program will provide for personsindividuals with severe disabilities, thereby reducing their need for financial and other forms of assistance from government.

B. The Program for the Purchase of ProductsGoods and Services of Severely Disabled Persons is designedProvided by Individuals with Disabilities created pursuant to facilitate R.S. 39:15951604.4, Act 109 of 1984 which provides that every governmental body shall giveagency gives a preference in its purchasing practicepractices to goods manufactured and services performed by individuals with severe handicaps in state operated and state supported sheltered workshops, and Act 291 of 1986, R.S. 39:1594(I) which allows for competitive sealed bidding.

Purchases of goods manufactured by or services performed by individuals with severe handicaps in state-operated or state-supported workshops as defined in R.S. 39:1595.4disabilities, shall be exempt from the provisions of this Sectioncalled the State Use Council for the Purchase of Goods and Services Provided by Individuals with Disabilities hereinafter called Council.

C. The Council on the Purchase of Products and Services of Severely Disabled Persons, established The Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) shall establish a Council and the membership of the Council shall be determined by the secretary Secretary of LDH. the Department of Social Services (DSS), shall be responsible for the implementation, policies, supervision, and monitoring of the program

- D. The Council shall be responsible for the implementation, policies, supervision, and monitoring of the program including having the authority to designate and contract with a central nonprofit agency to assist supported employment providers.
- E. When contracting with a central nonprofit agency, the Council shall solicit and evaluate competitive sealed proposals pursuant to R.S. 39:1595, at least every five (5) years.

F.—D.All suitable products orgoods and services approved by the eCouncil in accordance with applicable specifications by or for any state agency shall be procured from such nonprofit workshops where such products organization, program or entity as defined by R.S. 12:201 et seq., where such goods and services are available within the period specified at the fair market price unless otherwise excluded.

§903. Definitions

Central Nonprofit Agency (CNA) - an entity designed as a central nonprofit agency pursuant to RS 39:1604.4.

Community Rehabilitation Program (CRP) -a government or nonprofit private program operated under criteria established by the Council and under which individuals with disabilities produce goods or perform services for compensation.

Council—when used in these rules shall refer to the Louisiana

Direct Labor-all labor involved in the manufacturework required for preparation, processing and packaging of goods or a good, or work directly relating to the performance of services a service; except for supervision, instruction, administration, and inspection or shipping goods.

Disability-a mental or physical impairment, including blindness, that impedes a person who is seeking, entering, or maintaining gainful employment.

Goods Manufactured and Services Performed by Severely Handicapped Individuals with Disabilities—goods and services for which not less than 7540 percent of the man-hours of direct labor required for manufacture or performance is provided by severely disabled individuals with disabilities.

Individuals with Disabilities-individuals with a physical, behavioral, developmental, intellectual, sensory, mental, or

addictive disorder which constitutes a substantial obstacle to their employment and is of such a nature as to prevent an individual from engaging in normal competitive employment.

Qualified Nonprofit Agency of the Severely Handicapped an agency

Supported Employment Provider—a nonprofit organization, program or entity that:

- 1. is incorporated under the Louisiana Nonprofit Corporation Law and operated as defined by R.S. 12:201 et seq operates in the interests of severely disabled individuals with disabilities and provides gainful, competitive, integrated employment for individuals with disabilities, and the income of which does not inure in whole or part to the benefit of any shareholder or other private individual, and compliance with a central nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities and
- 2. complies with any applicable occupational health and safety standards provided by the statutes or regulations of this state or of the United States.
- ______3. in Fiscal Years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021, supported employment provider shall also include any sheltered workshop transitioning to a supported employment provider as defined above.

Severely Disabled Individuals individuals with a physical, mental, or substance abuse disability which constitutes a substantial obstacle to their employment and is of such a nature as to prevent an individual from engaging in normal competitive employment.

Sheltered Workshop—a facility designed to provide gainful employment for severely disabled individuals who cannot be absorbed into the competitive labor market or to provide interim employment for such individuals when employment opportunities for them in the competitive labor market do not exist.

State-Operated Sheltered Workshop-a sheltered workshop staffed by state agency personnel.

State-Supported Sheltered Workshop-a sheltered workshop funded in whole or part by the state and staffed by personnel from a qualified nonprofit agency for the severely disabled.

§905. Organization of the Council

A. The eCouncil will be composed of no more than nine members to be known as the Council on the Purchase of ProductsGoods and of Severely Disabled Persons Individuals with Disabilities, including three state agency members and up to six appointed members. The state agency members shall be the director of State Purchasing of the Division of Administration or their designee; and the assistant secretary of the Office of Human Services, for Citizens with Developmental Disabilities, Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) and Hospitalsor their designee; and the director of Louisiana Rehabilitation Services designees designee. The six appointed members shall be recommended by the Council on the Purchase of ProductsGoods and Services of Severely Disabled Persons Individuals with Disabilities and approved by the secretary of the LDH. Department of Social Services. A chairman shall be recommended by the eCouncil to the secretary of the LDHDepartment of Social Services for appointment.

- _B. Reimbursement for necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of services in connection with the work of the ecouncil will be made as authorized by the secretary of D.S.SLDH.
- _C. The act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the eCouncil.

- _____3. to suspend and reinstate a workshop; supported employment
 provider;
- 4. to solicit and evaluate competitive sealed proposals pursuant to R.S. 39:1595 at least every 5 years to designate and contract with a central nonprofit agency to assist the eCouncil in performing its functions;

- §909. Certification of Eligibility of Participating
 WorkshopsSupported Employment Provider
- _A. The eCouncil shall certify each workshopsupported employment provider making application for participating in the Program for the Purchase of ProductsGoods and Services of the Severely Disabled based on the criteria contained in Act 109 LA RS, 1984.Provided by Individuals with Disabilities.
- 1. The applicant meets the necessary definition of a sheltered workshopsupported employment provider as specifieddefined in Act 109 LA RS, 1984.R.S. 39:1604.4.
- _____2. The applicant meets the necessary definition of a qualifiedcentral nonprofit agency for the severely handicapped as specifiedoutlined in Act 109 LA RS, 1984R.S. 39:1604.4, only if qualifiedcentral nonprofit agency status is a requirement that the program must have obtained to function legally as a sheltered workshopsupported employment provider under federal and/or state statutory requirements.
- ______3. The applicant conforms to the requirement for "Goods manufactured and services performed by severely handicapped individuals" Section 1. Act 109 LA RS, 1984 with disabilities as defined in R.S. 39:1604.4.

4. The applicant has demonstrated to the eCouncil's satisfaction that it is capable of providing goods and services for sale to the state that conform to the criteria for same, as established by the rules pursuant to Act 109 LA RS, 1984R.S. 39:1604.4.

§911. Central Nonprofit Agency

A. The eCouncil mayshall have the authority to designate and contract with central nonprofit agency to assist workshops supported employment providers in submitting applications for eligibility, suspendingthe selection of suitable goods and reinstating, workshops, facilitating the distributionservices, to facilitate the allocation —of orders among qualified workshops supported employment providers, in controlling quality control, and in assisting the eCouncil in carrying out its responsibilities. The central nonprofit agency may also assist workshops in training, contract negotiations and procurement, eosting, eash advancements against billing, no interest loans, product development, market research, networking, industry referrals, production, management, contract administration, liaison with government, and other duties as specified by the council. Payment, if any, for such assistance shall be by agreement with the individual workshop.

- B. The Council shall solicit and evaluate competitive sealed proposals pursuant to R.S. 39:1595, at least every five years to designate and contract with a central nonprofit agency.
- C. The central nonprofit agency may also assist supported employment providers in training, contract negotiations and procurement, costing, cash advancements against billing, no interest loans, credit checks and collections, public relations, consultations, goods development, market research, networking, industry referrals, production, management, contract administration, liaison with government, and other duties as specified by the Council. Payment, if any, for such assistance shall be by agreement with the individual supported employment provider.
- _BD._The eCouncil shall establish rates for marketing services to be charged the workshop to the supported employment provider by the central nonprofit agency.

- _EE. Purchase orders e issued by the appropriate
 purchasing agency for suitable productsgoods and services directly
 to a workshopsupported employment provider with copies to a central
 nonprofit agency, but no vouchers from that agency will be approved
 for payment by the purchasing agency. The purchasing agency will
 consult with the central nonprofit agency on questions of
 allocation before issuing a purchase order to any workshop.

 Provision. Provisions may also be made where permissible, to issue
 purchase orders directly to the central nonprofit agency which
 will in turn make payment to the workshopsupported employment
 provider.
- E.G. The central nonprofit agency will submit annually a detailed written report of its program and budget to the eCouncil. This report shall include:
- 1. the number of disabled persons according to their type of disability who are employed in workshops by supported employment providers participating the program for the purchase of products goods and services;
- _____2. the amount of annual wages paid to persons participating in the program;

3. a summary of the sale of productsgoods offered by the workshopssupported employment providers; 4. a list of productsgoods and services offered by the workshops supported employment providers; 5. the geographic distribution of the workshops; and supported employment providers; 6. other information specified by the eCouncil for its determination of rates for marketing services to be charged the workshopssupported employment providers by the central nonprofit agency-; 7. information regarding the financial operations and conditions of the central nonprofit; 8. a report of the extent to which activities were performed in accordance with 911.C above; 9. the number of persons with disabilities who transitioned to individual or supported employment opportunities. - §913. Suspension and Reinstatement of a Supported Employment Provider Workshop
- _A. The eCouncil, after notice and a hearing may suspend a workshopsupported employment provider from its right to receive purchase orders from this program for suitable productsgoods and services under any or all of the following circumstances:
- _____1. failure of delivered productsgoods and services to meet or exceed specification;
- _____2. failure to deliver ordered <u>productsgoods</u> and services as required in the specifications.
- _B. The eCouncil may reinstate a workshopsupported employment provider after a suspension only if the eCouncil makes an affirmative finding on each of the following:
- 1. that the workshopsupported employment provider has reimbursed the state for damages suffered by reason of any of the failures giving rise to suspension;
- 2. that the workshopsupported employment provider has made the necessary corrections to avoid these failures in the future.

§915. Value Added

_A. A workshop_supported employment provider may not act merely as a receiving and shipping facility, except under circumstances as approved by the eCouncil.

_A. The appropriate purchasing agency, at its option, may monitor workshopsupported employment provider manufacturing activities for compliance with specifications under existing contracts.

§919. Records

_A. The records of the eCouncil and of any nonprofit agency participating in this program which pertain to state purchases of the productsgoods services and of severely disabled personsindividuals with disabilities, shall be made available upon the inspection of representatives request to StateLegislative Auditor, Office of the Inspector General, the Governor's Division of Administration, Office of Planning and Budget Office, or the Legislative Budget BoardFiscal Office on the assurance that the information will be safeguarded, used only for the purpose for which provided, and not released to unauthorized persons.

_B. A request for information <u>from for</u> other records of the <u>eCouncil</u> which identifies <u>severely disabled persons individuals with</u> <u>disabilities</u> as a state agency client or former client will be forwarded to <u>the appropriate agencyLDH</u> for <u>releasereview</u>.

_C. DSSLDH is the depository for all records concerning the eCouncil's operations.

§921. Exceptions

A. Exceptions from the operation of the mandatory provisions of these rules may be made in any case where under the rules of the state purchasing agency, the <u>productgoods</u> or service so produced or provided does not meet the reasonable requirements of the office, department, institution, or agency.

No office, department, institution, or agency may evade the intent of these rules by slight variations from standards adopted by the appropriate purchasing agency, when the <u>productsgoods</u> or services produced or provided by <u>personsindividuals</u> with <u>severe</u> disabilities, in accordance with established standards, are reasonably adapted to the actual needs of the office, department, institution, or agency.

SUMMARY

In accordance with Section 953 of Title 49 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes, there is hereby submitted a fiscal and economic impact statement on the rule proposed for adoption, repeal or amendment. THE FOLLOWING STATEMENTS SUMMARIZE ATTACHED WORKSHEETS, I THROUGH IV AND WILL BE PUBLISHED IN THE LOUISIANA REGISTER WITH THE PROPOSED AGENCY RULE.

 ESTIMATED IMPLEMENTATION COSTS (SAVINGS) TO STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary)

It is anticipated that OCDD will expend \$950 SGF in FY 21 associated with promulgating the rule. The proposed rule change is pursuant to ACT 312 of the 2019 Regular Legislative Session and includes changes to remove references to sheltered workshops and replace them with supported employment provider and make technical changes.

Additionally, the proposed changes will likely result in an indeterminable increase in state expenditures for each new organization that will qualify for an exemption from the competitive bid process. More organizations may qualify for an exemption due to the expansion of preference given to organizations that employ individuals with behavioral, developmental, sensory, or intellectual disabilities and reduce the required ratio of direct labor by individuals with disabilities from no less than 75% to no less than 40%. The number of additional organizations that will qualify for an exemption cannot be determined.

Also, giving preference to these organizations may increase costs to the state if the goods or services could have been purchased at a lower price from a different provider through the competitive bid process.

II. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON REVENUE COLLECTIONS OF STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary)

The proposed rule change reduces the required ratio of direct labor by individuals with disabilities while expanding the admissible list of disorders that may contribute to the ratio. This is anticipated to expand the category of organizations that are eligible to claim the New Jobs corporate income tax credit and increase the volume of sales eligible for the Sheltered Workshops sales tax exemption. An increase of unknown magnitude in claims for these tax benefits is thus anticipated, which will result in a corresponding decrease to the state general fund and local funds. The extent of the decrease will depend on the number of additional workers determined eligible for employment under supported employment providers and the number of organizations that take advantage of the relaxed requirements to be designated a supported employment provider.

III. ESTIMATED COSTS AND/OR ECONOMIC BENEFITS TO DIRECTLY AFFECTED PERSONS, SMALL BUSINESSES, OR NON-GOVERNMENTAL GROUPS (Summary)

The proposed rule change will likely result in more organizations being classified as supported employment providers. Supported employment providers are exempt from the state of Louisiana's competitive bid process, which provides the economic benefit of being given preference for state contracts.

Additionally, to the extent there is greater access to employment for individuals with disabilities, these individuals and their families may enjoy the economic benefit of additional income.

IV. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON COMPETITION AND EMPLOYMENT (Summary)

The proposed rule change is anticipated to provide individuals with developmental disabilities greater access to employment opportunities.

Additionally, more organizations may qualify for an exemption from the competitive bid process due to the expansion of preference given to organizations that employ individuals with behavioral, developmental, sensory or intellectual disabilities and the reduction of the required ratio of direct labor by individuals with disabilities from no less than 75% to no less than 40%. The number of additional organizations that will qualify for an exemption cannot be determined.
