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Overview

Polycarbonate lenses are impact-resistant lenses that are thinner and lighter than plastic lenses. These lenses are shatter-proof and provide UV protection.

Clinical Criteria

March vision finds the following diagnoses medically necessary for polycarbonate lenses:

- Children aged 6 and under
- Autistic disorder
- Other childhood disintegrative disorder
- Asperger's syndrome
- Pervasive developmental disorders
- Chronic motor or vocal tic disorder
- Parkinson's disease
- Dementia with Lewy bodies
- Cognitive Impairment
- Multiple sclerosis
- Epilepsy or other seizure disorder
- Muscular dystrophy
- Myotonia or Myopathies
- Cerebral Palsy
- Retinal detachment
- Retinal tears
- Retinal holes
- Retinal defects
- Degenerative myopia
- Amblyopia
- Blindness in one eye
- Meniere's disease
- Vertigo
- Vestibular neuronitis
- Labyrinthitis
- Newborn intracranial brain injury or hemorrhage

- Marfan's syndrome
- Trisomy 21
- <u>Down syndrome</u>
- Interocular lens breakdown or displacement
- Prosthetic of one eye
