## **RE:** Notification of Louisiana Medicaid State Plan Amendment

In compliance with the provisions of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009, the Louisiana Department of Health, Bureau of Health Services Financing is taking the opportunity to notify you of its intent, in response to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Statewide Public Health Emergency, to invoke implementation of the waivers of eligibility and enrollment policies for application and redetermination, cost sharing and prior authorization requirements outlined in Louisiana's CHIP Disaster Eligibility and Enrollment State Plan Amendment (SPA) LA SPA TN 19-0022. The SPA was approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services on August 15, 2019.

In response to COVID-19, the State will also submit a SPA to:

- 1. Modify the tribal consultation process by shortening the number of days before submission of the SPA and/or conducting consultation after submission of the SPA;
- 2. Provide for an extension of the reasonable opportunity period for non-citizens declaring to be in a satisfactory immigration status, if the non-citizen is making a good faith effort to resolve any inconsistencies or obtain any necessary documentation, or the agency is unable to complete the verification process within the 90-day reasonable opportunity period; and
- 3. Provide temporary suspension of the premium lock-out period regardless of whether the family has paid their outstanding premium for existing beneficiaries who reside and/or work in a state or federally declared disaster or public health emergency area.

This may have an impact on your tribe.
