The provider shall ensure that there is only one primary case manager for each eligible beneficiary.

Services for Incarcerated Youth

Eligible juveniles as defined in §1902(nn) (individuals who are under 21 years of age and determined eligible for any Medicaid eligibility group, or individuals determined eligible for the mandatory eligibility group for former foster care children age 18 up to age 26, immediately before becoming an inmate of a public institution or while an inmate of a public institution) who are within 30 days of their scheduled date of release from a public institution following adjudication, and for at least 30 days following release.

Reimbursement for services to incarcerated youth are reimbursed at a flat rate for each approved unit of service. The standard unit of service is equivalent to one month. Payments made for targeted case management services will not duplicate payments made to public agencies or private entities under other program authorities for the same purpose.

Except as otherwise noted in the plan, state developed fee schedule rates are the same for both governmental and private providers of case management services. The agency's fee schedule was set as of July 1, 2025 and is effective for services provided on or after that date. All rates are published at www.lamedicaid.com.
