State Plan Amendments for Submittal to CMS

Request for Tribal Comments October 20, 2025

Federally-Facilitated Marketplace Assessments Effective date: October 1, 2025

Legislative changes enacted through Act 427 of the 2025 Regular Session prohibits the Department from accepting Medicaid eligibility determinations made by a Federally-Facilitated Exchange, including the Federally-Facilitated Marketplace established under 42 U.S.C. §18041(c).

The purpose of this SPA is to amend the provisions governing Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) eligibility determinations, to transition from a Federally-Facilitated Marketplace (FFM) Determination state whereas the state delegated authority to the FFM to make final eligibility decisions, to an FFM Assessment state whereas the FFM makes a preliminary assessment of eligibility and the State makes the final decision.

Doula Services

Effective date: January 20, 2026

In January 2025, Louisiana was selected as one of the states to participate in the CMS Transforming Maternal Health (TMaH) model, designed to focus exclusively on improving maternal healthcare for people enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP. The model supports development of a whole-person approach to pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum care with the goal of reducing disparities in access and treatment. It aims to improve experiences and outcomes for mothers and their newborns. The model urges states to address gaps in maternal healthcare by using doulas.

Doulas are individuals who have been trained to provide physical, emotional, and educational support to pregnant and birthing women and their families before, during and after childbirth.

Legislative changes enacted through Act 228 of the 2025 Regular Session, requires the State to cover doula services. The purpose of this SPA is to add doula services to the State Plan, establish what services a doula may provide, qualifications for doulas, and the reimbursement methodology for these services.
