Children's Special Health Services (CSHS) is the principal public agency ensuring that children and youth with special health care needs in Louisiana have access to health care services.

Children's Special Healthcare Services - Clinical Services (CSHS-Clinical Services) is a program for children in Louisiana with special health care needs. CSHS-Clinical Services offers the following services:

Medical Care & Assistance:

- Medical specialty care
- Referrals for medical testing, procedures, equipment, and supplies
- Medications and special diets
- Behavioral health and nutrition services

Support Services

- Referrals to home health services and therapies (occupational/physical/speech)
- Referrals to early childhood development agencies
- Care coordination
- Help with shifting to adult life and care (transition)

Family Support

- Referrals to parent and family support services
- Help finding community resources

<u>School-Based Health Centers</u> (SBHC) – offer medical and behavioral health services to students at no out-of-pocket cost to parents. The network of Office of Public Health SBHCs are located in 25 Louisiana parishes. Services at SBHC's include:



The Family Resource Center

Navigating resources can be overwhelming for both families and providers. The Family Resource Center (FRC) is here to help!

Our experienced staff are available to help identify and connect families to resources and services in their community and across the state based on their child's specific needs. In addition to health information, they can connect families to resources related to insurance, finances, education, food security, and more.

Some of the most common resources the FRC shares with families include...

- Services such as early intervention, childcare assistance, insurance, and disability support
- Healthcare and therapy options
- Parent-driven support organizations
- School-related information and accommodations
- Resources to help youth transition to adulthood, including those related to employment, independent living, education, insurance, and legal affairs

FRC staff can provide information directly to families or talk to providers to help figure out what resources would be the most beneficial for their patients.
