

What is the Children's Choice Waiver?

The Children's Choice (CC) Waiver provides home and community-based services to individuals from birth to age 20 who currently live at home with their families or who will leave an institution to return home. This waiver is intended to provide individualized supports to assist the individual in living in their home and community and designed for maximum flexibility.

Individuals will age out of this waiver when they reach their 21st birthday and will transition to the most appropriate waiver that meets their support needs as long as they remain eligible. At the age of 18, individuals may choose to transition to the Supports Waiver if they are interested in working.

This program is not intended to provide 24-hour-a-day support

**Individuals from birth to age 3 must meet the My Place eligibility requirements.*

**Individuals must access and use state plan services for which they qualify.*

Who can qualify?

Individuals **birth to age 20** who meet **ALL** of the following criteria:

- Meet Louisiana Medicaid eligibility
- Have an OCDD Statement of Approval
- Meet Louisiana's definition for developmental disability that manifested prior to age 22 [Revised Statute 28:451.2, Paragraph (12)]
- Meet intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) level of care criteria

What is the Supports Waiver?

The Supports Waiver (SW) provides home and community-based services for individuals 18 years of age or older who meet the eligibility criteria for waiver services. It is designed to offer meaningful opportunities for day and employment supports for community participation for individuals whose needs can be met with waiver services.

This program is not intended to provide 24-hour-a-day support.

Individuals **18 years of age and older** who meet **ALL** of the following criteria:

- Meet Louisiana Medicaid eligibility
- Have an OCDD Statement of Approval
- Meet Louisiana's definition for developmental disability that manifested prior to age 22 [Revised Statute 28:451.2, Paragraph (12)]
- Meet intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) level of care criteria

How can I request an OCDD waiver?

What is the Residential Options Waiver?

The Residential Options Waiver (ROW) program provides services in the home and community to individuals of all ages who are eligible to receive OCDD waiver services. It is a capped waiver where the person's individual annual budget is based upon the person's assessed support needs. An Inventory for Client and Agency Planning (ICAP) assessment determines the supports needs.

This program is not intended to provide 24-hour-a-day one-to-one support.

**Individuals must access and use state plan services for which they qualify.*



Who can qualify?

Individuals of any age who meet **ALL** of the following criteria:

- Meet Louisiana Medicaid eligibility
- Have an OCDD Statement of Approval
- Meet Louisiana's definition for developmental disability that manifested prior to age 22 [Revised Statute 28:451.2, Paragraph (12)]
- Meet intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) level of care criteria
- Meet one of four ROW priority group criteria

The New Opportunities Waiver (NOW) program provides services in the home and in the community to individuals 3 years of age or older who are eligible to receive waiver services.

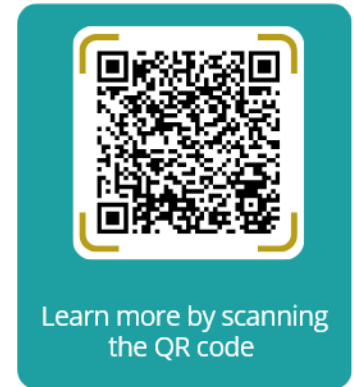
The NOW is intended to provide individualized supports to assist individuals in living in their home and community.

Individuals **age 3 and older** who meet **ALL** of the following criteria:

- Meet Louisiana Medicaid eligibility
- Have an OCDD Statement of Approval
- Meet Louisiana's definition for developmental disability that manifested prior to age 22 [Revised Statute 28:451.2, Paragraph (12)]
- Meet intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF/IID) level of care criteria
- Whose needs cannot be met in another OCDD waiver
