LDWF's Wildlife Diversity Program (formerly *Natural Heritage Program*) is responsible for conserving Louisiana's rare, threatened, and endangered plant and animal species, nongame birds, and natural communities. The program is set up as a "clearinghouse" for solicitations of views on multiple cross-cutters handled within the Department including Endangered or Threatened Plant & Animal Species and their Habitats (see *Item 6 above*), as well as Wild & Scenic Rivers. Program staff conduct, guide, fund, and facilitate research, monitoring, and inventory of Species of Greatest Conservation Need and their associated habitats as identified in LDWF's Wildlife Action Plan.

LDWF's Wildlife Diversity Program staff use a centralized database to review proposed construction projects to identify potential impacts to rare, threatened, or endangered species and natural communities.

-Review parameters (e.g. 1-mile radius of project boundary)

-Latitude/longitude and township, range, and section, if known.
