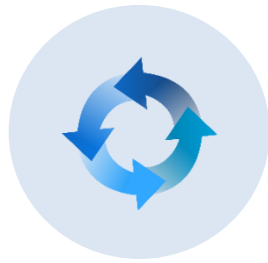
2018 - 2019 STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

“The mission of the Louisiana Healthcare-Associated Infections and Antibiotic Resistance Program is to protect patients by preventing healthcare-associated infections and the proliferation of resistant organisms through surveillance, outbreak response, and promoting infection control and antibiotic stewardship education across the provider spectrum.”



Goal 1:

Raise consumer awareness of appropriate antibiotic prescribing in 3 years.



Goal 2:

Improve facility and public health coordination for detection and response to novel, drug-resistant threats within 24h of receipt of report(s).



Goal 3:

Increase facilities with fully competent antibiotic stewardship programs by 30% in 3 years.



Goal 4:

Reduce HAI incidence by 20% in 3 years.



Goal 5:

Communicate HAI and AR progress with stakeholders annually.

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About the Healthcare-associated Infections & Antibiotic Resistance Program at the Louisiana Department of Health

The Healthcare-Associated Infections (HAI) Program was launched in 2009 in response to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) with the objectives to establish healthcare infection prevention and surveillance efforts for each of the 50 states, Washington, D.C., and Puerto Rico. National HAI efforts acknowledge that patient safety is necessary across the spectrum of healthcare, and establishes prevention efforts in a variety of healthcare settings: acute care hospitals, long term acute care hospitals, dialysis centers, inpatient rehabilitation facilities. In 2015, HAI programmatic efforts expanded to include infection control readiness across the provider spectrum in response to the Ebola epidemic. HAI programs then assumed antibiotic resistance (AR) surveillance efforts beginning in 2016.

Louisiana's team of epidemiologists and pharmacists coordinate with laboratory personnel at the Louisiana Public Health Laboratory to complete these efforts.
