Pediatric Moderna and Pfizer Vaccines

- FDA VRBPAC Committee is scheduled to meet on June 15th to discuss data on Moderna for 6 months through 5 years of age and Pfizer for 6 months through 4 years of age. CDC's ACIP is then scheduled to meet within several days of VRBPAC on June 17th and 18th
- Initial pediatric vaccine deliveries will begin the week of June 20th
- Providing as many COVID-19 pediatric providers as possible with vaccine is critical to achieving equitable vaccine access during product roll out
- Even if ordering a small amount of vaccine, avoiding missed opportunities is critical during vaccine roll out



Packaging/Diluent

- The packaging configuration for both products will be 10-dose vials in cartons of 10 vials each (100 doses total) pending FDA authorization
- Based on current information, its anticipated that once a vial is opened, doses must be used within 12 hours
- Both Pfizer and Moderna products have the same storage conditions as each manufacturer's other COVID-19 vaccine products
 - Pfizer: 12 months ULT Freezer and/or 10 weeks for Refrigerator
 - Moderna: 6 months Freezer and/or 30 days Refrigerator (check lot number https://eua.modernatx.com/covid19vaccine-eua/providers/vial-lookup)
- Pfizer COVID-19 pediatric vaccines will require diluent
 - The diluent will be provided with ancillary supplies which are configured specifically for use in this age group. NOTE reconstitution of the product for use on 6 months–5-year-olds uses a different volume of diluent than the 5-11-year old formulation and the adult formulation

Regardless of storage condition, vaccines should not be used after 12 months from the date of manufacture printed on the vial and cartons.

The vaccine is currently under emergency use authorization review by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for children 6 months through 4 years old.

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

Storage and Handling

All Vial Presentations

Local Storage Options for Unpunctured Vials

(up to the Date of Expiration)



Freezer

-50° to -15°C (-58° to 5°F)

• Do not store on dry ice or below -50°C (-58°F)



Refrigerator

2° to 8°C (36° to 46°F) up to 30 days prior to first use



Room Temperature

8° to 25°C (46° to 77°F) for a total of 24 hours

- · Store in original carton to protect from light
- · Do not refreeze a thawed vial

Transportation of Thawed Vials at 2° to 8°C (36° to 46°F)

- If transport at -50° to -15°C (-58° to 5°F) is not feasible, thawed vials may be transported for up to 12 hours at 2° to 8°C (36° to 46°F), under these conditions:
 - Shipped using shipping containers qualified to maintain 2° to 8°C (36° to 46°F)

AND

- Routine road and air transport conditions with shaking and vibration minimized
- Once thawed and transported at 2° to 8°C (36° to 46°F), vials should not be refrozen
- Thawed and transported vials should be stored at 2° to 8°C (36° to 46°F) until use

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Pediatric Vaccine: Second and Third Doses

- Pediatric doses <u>will not</u> have an automatic second dose sent 3 weeks later, as occurred with initial adult vaccine allocation
- LA also does not know what our future allocation of pediatric vaccine will look like so providers should order enough doses to cover 1st and 2nd doses for Moderna and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd doses for Pfizer
- Ex. If you expect to vaccinate 100 individuals in the first 2-3 weeks of pediatric vaccine availability, you will need to submit an order for 200 doses of Moderna vaccine (100 for first doses, and 100 for second doses) or 300 doses of Pfizer (100 for first doses, 100 for second doses and 100 for third doses)



Pediatric Vaccine: Minimum Pre-Order

- The minimum direct order size for both Pfizer and Moderna will be 100 doses (10-10 Dose vials)
- However, LDH will not require this large of a minimum order M& D will be filling all orders the first couple weeks
- By shipping our entire initial allocation to M&D, we will continue our low and wide approach/allow providers to pre-order as little as 30 doses of Pfizer (3-Dose Series) or 20 doses of Moderna (2-Dose Series)
- "Pre-ordering" has begun this week in LINKS and will be open through 5:00 p.m. Tuesday, June 14th.



The few slides explain how the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines will be delivered in minimum doses of 100 after the first wave of deliveries is completed. Vaccine will **NOT** be delivered like this initially to provider sites, as M & D will be repackaging all vaccine for delivery during the first wave.









The single use shipper should be disposed of after unpacking the vaccine. However, the Controlant monitor will need to be returned.



If authorized by the FDA, **Maroon Cap** vaccine vials and cartons you receive will be labeled as Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine

Initial shipments of Maroon Cap vials and cartons will have the following label characteristics:



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- The vial and carton labels may state
 2 years to <5 years of age or
 6 months through 4 years of age.
- Vials with labels that state for use in individuals 2 years to <5 years of age can be used for individuals 6 months through 4 years of age.

*Note: Prior to preparation of the vaccine, please review the EUA Fact Sheet (if authorized by the FDA) as the timeframe for use post-dilution has been extended to 12 hours

Initial Allocation

- Federal Government currently has enough pediatric doses on hand to meet the need of 6 month-5yr old US population, but doses will be allocated initially to prevent stockpiling/over ordering relative to demand
- Louisiana will receive an initial allocation of vaccine (to avoid a strain on the federal supply chain)
- We will then receive a weekly allocation for at least the first 3 weeks



Initial Allocation

- Please submit your initial order of vaccine through LINKS any time before
 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 14th
- Even though doses will not ship until later this month, all initial COVID-19
 vaccine orders need to be submitted during the pre-order period.
- Depending on the quantity of provider orders, and quantity of our state allocation, your order submission may be adjusted
- The Immunization Program will make every effort to ensure every provider who orders vaccine receives vaccine in this initial roll-out



Initial Allocation

- Providers will be notified of adjustments to their pediatric order quantity via email on June 17th, so they can begin any necessary planning
- Pending timely delivery from the federal government, vaccine deliveries may begin prior to ACIP/CDC recommendation
- Providers should prepare to receive and store doses early but not begin administration until full CDC and LDH authorization is given
- "Projected" pediatric vaccine administration start date is the week of June 20th
- Reminder do not set appointments until vaccines are physically received
- Deliveries involved in this initial pre-order wave of vaccines could arrive into the week of June 27th



Other Planning Considerations

- Pharmacies in the Federal Retail Pharmacy Program will be able to order vaccine to select pharmacy locations, however many pharmacies in Louisiana have indicated they do not plan to order
- To support increased logistics needed to push out large number of pediatric doses during the first week, other vaccine products, from both the federal government and Morris and Dickson, may experience delays during initial 6month-5-year rollout


- Log in to LINKS
- Go to the navigation menu. Click **Orders/Transfers**, then click **Create/View Orders**.





Ordering COVID Pediatric Vaccines Through LINKS

- Click on Create Order. This will bring you to your reconciliation page.
- Before you can proceed you will need to reconcile your inventory. Once completed, click **Submit Monthly Inventory**.





Ordering COVID Pediatric Vaccines Through LINKS

- Once you submit your monthly inventory, your Create Order page will be visible.
- Select your Order Set (for this case will be COVID-19 Pediatric/Distributor). Enter the Order Quantity (For COVID-19 pediatric vaccine, the minimum is 30 for Pfizer and 20 for Moderna). Select the Vaccine Name.
- Click Submit Order.
- It will take you to the Order/Transfer List and show; ex Order 529475
 Successfully created and Pending State Approval. You will know your order has been completed and is awaiting approval.
