Surveillance Summary

Data in this report includes cases diagnosed with HIV, AIDS, or Early Syphilis

- In 2020, Louisiana ranked 4th in the nation for HIV case rates (15.6 per 100,000 population) and 11th in the estimated number of HIV cases. The Baton Rouge MSA ranked 7th and the New Orleans MSA ranked 9th for HIV case rates (18.4 and 17.3 per 100,000, respectively), among the large metropolitan areas in the nation. The *CDC HIV Surveillance Report* (vol. 32) was released in May 2022. The CDC no longer provides AIDS rankings in the annual report.
- In 2020, Louisiana ranked 12th in the nation for primary and secondary (P&S) syphilis case rates (15.1 per 100,000 population) according to the 2020 CDC STD Surveillance Report.
- As of September 30, 2022, a total of **22,708** persons were living with HIV (PLWH) in Louisiana; of these individuals, **11,084** persons (49%) have an AIDS diagnosis.
- In 2021, **903** new HIV cases were diagnosed in Louisiana. Of these cases, **27%** (n=247) occurred in Region 1 (New Orleans) and **19%** (n=175) occurred in Region 2 (Baton Rouge).
- Between January 1 through September 30, 2022, a total of 1,073 persons were diagnosed with early syphilis* in Louisiana; 655 persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis, and 418 persons were diagnosed with early non-P&S syphilis. Of the total early syphilis cases, 17% (n=182) occurred in Region 1 (New Orleans) and 18% (n=193) occurred in Region 2 (Baton Rouge).
- The primary risk factor for new HIV diagnoses in Louisiana is gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men (GBM). In 2021, among new diagnoses who reported a risk factor, 57% reported being GBM, and an additional 2% reported being GBM and a person who injects drugs. As of September 30, 2022, 46% of all people with a reported risk factor living with HIV in Louisiana were GBM.
- The primary risk factor for early syphilis diagnoses in Louisiana is gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men (GBM). As of September 30, 2022, of the persons who reported a risk factor, **36%** reported being GBM, and **67%** reported engaging in heterosexual activity. *Persons could report multiple risk factors for syphilis diagnoses.*
- In Louisiana, 74% of new HIV cases, 68% of new AIDS cases, and 65% of the early syphilis diagnoses were among men.
- Black people in Louisiana experience severe health disparities in regards to HIV and STDs. In 2021, 65% of newly diagnosed HIV cases and 66% of newly diagnosed AIDS cases were Black. As of September 30, 2022, 59% of early syphilis cases with a reported race/ethnicity were Black. Only 32% of Louisiana's overall population is Black.
- A large percentage of new HIV and syphilis diagnoses occurred among adolescents and young adults. In 2021, 25% of all new HIV diagnoses occurred among persons 13-24 years old and an additional 33% occurred among persons 25-34 years old. As of September 30, 2022, 25% of all early syphilis diagnoses occurred among persons 13-24 years old and an additional 37% occurred among persons 25-34 years old and an additional 37% occurred among persons 25-34 years old and an additional 37% occurred among persons 25-34 years old.

Changes to Syphilis Case Definition

The Quarterly Report includes revisions to the surveillance case definition for syphilis as approved by the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) effective January 1, 2018. Of note, the nomenclature for "Early latent syphilis" has been changed to "Early non-primary non-secondary syphilis." Throughout the Quarterly Report it has been abbreviated to "Early non-P&S syphilis." Updates to HIV Transmission Categories

Starting in 2019, the Quarterly Report has updated HIV transmission category names using people first language. Men who have sex with men (MSM) is now "Gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men" (GBM). Injection drug use (IDU) is now "Persons who inject drugs" (PWID).

A significant number of women living with HIV do not meet the stringent "high risk" criteria for "Heterosexual contact" and are classified as "No identified risk." In an effort to better capture and present heterosexual transmission of HIV among women, the STD, HIV, & Hepatitis Program has used an algorithm from the Centers for Disease Control that re-categorizes many women formerly classified as "No identified risk" as now meeting the exposure criteria for "Female presumed heterosexual contact" (FPHC). The primary criteria for FPHC includes: sex at birth is female, answered 'yes' to sex with men, answered 'no' to injection drug use, and has no other documentation that would suggest an alternative mode of HIV acquisition.

From March 2020 - November 14, 2022, 5,963 persons living with HIV in Louisiana have been diagnosed with COVID-19. Among those who have been co-infected with HIV and COVID-19, 195 are deceased due to any cause of death. The table below shows demographic data for the 5,768 living, co-infected individuals. These values reflect the number of unique individuals diagnosed with COVID-19, not the number of positive tests.
