Louisiana HIV, AIDS, and Early Syphilis Surveillance Quarterly Report

December 31, 2021



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Surveillance Summary

Data in this report includes cases diagnosed with HIV, AIDS, or Early Syphilis

- In 2019, Louisiana ranked 4th in the nation for HIV case rates (19.0 per 100,000 population) and 12th in the estimated number of HIV cases. The Baton Rouge MSA ranked 4th and the New Orleans MSA ranked 6th for HIV case rates (23.5 and 22.2 per 100,000, respectively), among the large metropolitan areas in the nation. The CDC HIV Surveillance Report (vol. 32) was released in May 2021. The CDC no longer provides AIDS rankings in the annual report.
- In 2019, Louisiana ranked **9th** in the nation for primary and secondary (P&S) syphilis case rates (15.0 per 100,000 population) according to the 2019 *CDC STD Surveillance Report*.
- As of December 31, 2021, a total of 22,550 persons were living with HIV (PLWH) in Louisiana; of these individuals, 11,107 persons (49%) have an AIDS diagnosis.
- In 2020, **721** new HIV cases were diagnosed in Louisiana. Of these cases, **26%** (n=185) occurred in Region 1 (New Orleans) and **20%** (n=145) occurred in Region 2 (Baton Rouge).
- As of December 31, 2021, a total of 1,458 persons were diagnosed with early syphilis* in Louisiana;
 839 persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis, and 619 persons were diagnosed with early non-P&S syphilis. Of the total early syphilis cases, 27% (n=398 occurred in Region 1 (New Orleans) and 12% (n=170) occurred in Region 2 (Baton Rouge).
- The primary risk factor for new HIV diagnoses in Louisiana is gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men (GBM). In 2020, among persons who reported a risk factor, **55%** reported being GBM, and an additional **2%** reported being GBM and a person who injects drugs. As of December 31, 2021, **45%** of all people with a reported risk factor living with HIV in Louisiana were GBM.
- The primary risk factor for early syphilis diagnoses in Louisiana is gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men (GBM). As of December 31, 2021, of the persons who reported a risk factor, 46% reported being GBM, and 58% reported engaging in heterosexual activity. Persons could report multiple risk factors for syphilis diagnoses.
- In Louisiana, **74%** of new HIV cases, **67%** of new AIDS cases, and **70%** of the early syphilis diagnoses were among men.
- Black people in Louisiana experience severe health disparities in regards to HIV and STDs. In 2020, 70% of newly diagnosed HIV cases and 72% of newly diagnosed AIDS cases were Black. As of December 31, 2021, 60% of early syphilis cases with a reported race/ethnicity were Black. Only 32% of Louisiana's overall population is Black.
- A large percentage of new HIV and syphilis diagnoses occurred among adolescents and young adults. In 2020, 26% of all new HIV diagnoses occurred among persons 13-24 years old and an additional 33% occurred among persons 25-34 years old. As of December 31, 2021, 24% of all early syphilis diagnoses occurred among persons 13-24 years old and an additional 38% occurred among persons 25-34 years old.

^{*} A syphilis diagnosis with less than one year duration is considered to be "early syphilis." This designation covers the primary, secondary, and early non-P&S stages of syphilis.

Changes to Syphilis Case Definition

The Quarterly Report includes revisions to the surveillance case definition for syphilis as approved by the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) effective January 1, 2018. Of note, the nomenclature for "Early latent syphilis" has been changed to "Early non-primary non-secondary syphilis." Throughout the Quarterly Report it has been abbreviated to "Early non-P&S syphilis." <u>Updates to HIV Transmission Categories</u>

Starting in 2019, the Quarterly Report has updated HIV transmission category names using people first language. Men who have sex with men (MSM) is now "Gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men" (GBM). Injection drug use (IDU) is now "Persons who inject drugs" (PWID).

A significant number of women living with HIV do not meet the stringent "high risk" criteria for "Heterosexual contact" and are classified as "No identified risk." In an effort to better capture and present heterosexual transmission of HIV among women, the STD, HIV, & Hepatitis Program has used an algorithm from the Centers for Disease Control that re-categorizes many women formerly classified as "No identified risk" as now meeting the exposure criteria for "Female presumed heterosexual contact" (FPHC). The primary criteria for FPHC includes: sex at birth is female, answered 'yes' to sex with men, answered 'no' to injection drug use, and has no other documentation that would suggest an alternative mode of HIV acquisition.











WOMEN & GIRLS HIV prevention starts with ME

In 2018, there were an estimated 261,800 Women living with HIV in the United States.

This nationwide observance brings attention to how HIV and AIDS affect the health and well-being of women and girls in our communities.

If a mother with HIV receives appropriate antiretroviral treatment during pregnancy, labor, & delivery, does not breastfeed, and completes a treatment course for the newborn, there is a less than 1% chance the mother will transmit HIV to her child.

From 2010-2018, the annual number of new HIV diagnoses among women in the U.S. declined by 25%.

Among Black women, the number of diagnoses decreased by 30%.

HIV/AIDS Among Women and Girls in Louisiana



Louisiana are **women.**

6,292 women were living with HIV in Louisiana in 2019.

2 in 3 women living with HIV in Louisiana are virally suppressed.

Viral suppression is when a person has very low levels of HIV in their blood. People who are virally suppressed cannot pass HIV on to a sex partner.

Black women are affected by HIV more than other women in Louisiana.

Black women make up 33% of Louisiana's female population.



Black women make up 76% of Louisiana's female HIV diagnoses.



Approximately 150-160 women living with HIV in Louisiana give birth each year.

To prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV, it is Louisiana Law that all pregnant women be tested for HIV at their first prenatal care visit and again in the third trimester.

How You Can Prevent HIV Transmission:



If you are living with HIV, take your medications as prescribed to stay healthy and greatly reduce the risk of passing HIV to a partner.



If you are HIV-negative, ask your doctor about pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP), a daily pill to prevent HIV.



Regardless of your status, use a condom when you have sex. Condoms reduce the risk of getting HIV and other sexually transmitted infections.
