

Louisiana HIV, AIDS, Early Syphilis, & Congenital Syphilis Surveillance

Quarterly Report

September 30, 2023



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Surveillance Summary

Data in this report includes cases diagnosed with HIV, AIDS, and Early and Congenital Syphilis

- In 2021, Louisiana ranked **3rd** in the nation for HIV diagnosis rates (19.5 new diagnoses per 100,000 population) and **11th** in the estimated number of HIV diagnoses. The Baton Rouge MSA ranked **5th** and the New Orleans MSA ranked **6th** for HIV diagnosis rates (22.0 new diagnoses and 21.8 new diagnoses per 100,000, respectively), among the large metropolitan areas in the nation. The *CDC HIV Surveillance Report* (vol. 34) was released in May 2023. The CDC no longer provides AIDS rankings in the annual report.
- In 2021, Louisiana ranked **11th** in the nation for primary and secondary (P&S) syphilis diagnoses rates (21.5 new diagnoses per 100,000 population) according to the 2021 *CDC STD Surveillance Report*.
- As of September 30, 2023, a total of **23,974** people were living with HIV (PLWH) in Louisiana; of these individuals, **10,990** people (48%) have an AIDS diagnosis.
- In 2022, **858** people were newly diagnosed with HIV in Louisiana. Of people newly diagnosed, **24%** (n=207) occurred in Region 1 (New Orleans) and **19%** (n=167) occurred in Region 2 (Baton Rouge).
- Between January 1 and September 30, 2023, a total of **1,343** people were diagnosed with early syphilis* in Louisiana; **802** people were diagnosed with P&S syphilis, and **541** people were diagnosed with early non-P&S syphilis. Of all the people diagnosed with early syphilis, **24%** (n=320) occurred in Region 1 (New Orleans) and **19%** (n=258) occurred in Region 2 (Baton Rouge).
- The primary risk factor for people newly diagnosed with HIV in Louisiana is gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men (GBM). In 2022, among new diagnoses who reported a risk factor, **61%** reported being GBM, and an additional **2%** reported being GBM and a person who injects drugs. As of September 30, 2023, **46%** of all people with a reported risk factor living with HIV in Louisiana were GBM.
- The primary risk factor for people diagnosed with early syphilis in Louisiana is heterosexual activity. As of September 30, 2023, of the people who reported a risk factor, **61%** reported heterosexual activity, and **33%** reported engaging in any type of illegal drug use. Additionally, **39%** reported being gay, bisexual, or other men who have sex with men. *People could report multiple risk factors for syphilis diagnoses.*
- In Louisiana, **74%** of people newly diagnosed with HIV, **72%** of people newly diagnosed with AIDS, and **66%** of people diagnosed with early syphilis were men.
- Black people in Louisiana experience severe health disparities in regards to HIV and STDs. In 2022, **63%** of people newly diagnosed with HIV and **63%** of people newly diagnosed with AIDS were Black. As of September 30, 2023, **56%** of early syphilis cases with a reported race/ethnicity were Black. Only 32% of Louisiana's overall population is Black.
- A large percentage of new HIV and syphilis diagnoses occurred among adolescents and young adults. In 2022, **23%** of people newly diagnosed with HIV were 13-24 years old and an additional **35%** were 25-34 years old. As of September 30, 2023, **23%** of people diagnosed with early syphilis were 13-24 years old and an additional **36%** were 25-34 years old.
- In 2021, Louisiana ranked **3rd** in the nation for congenital syphilis case rates (191.5 per 100,000 live births). Between January 1 and September 30 2023, a total of **45** mothers and infants have been linked to a congenital syphilis case. Among them, 47% (n=21) resided in Region 1 (New Orleans), Region 4 (Lafayette), and Region 8 (Monroe). During that same period, 49% (n=22) of cases were among Black mothers, and 64% (n=29) were between the ages of 20 to 29 at delivery.

* A syphilis diagnosis with less than one year duration is considered to be "early syphilis." This designation covers the primary, secondary, and early non-P&S stages of syphilis.

Changes to Gender Variable

The gender variable now encompasses five genders: man, woman, transgender man, transgender woman, and additional gender identity. The gender category “additional gender identity” was added to include those who identified as gender queer, gender non-conforming, or non-binary. Gender defaults to birth sex unless a gender identity different from birth sex has been collected from medical chart review, case management notes, or during a partner services interview. People of transgender and additional gender identities are likely undercounted.

Changes to Syphilis Case Definition

The Quarterly Report includes revisions to the surveillance case definition for syphilis as approved by the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) effective January 1, 2018. Of note, the nomenclature for “Early latent syphilis” has been changed to “Early non-primary non-secondary syphilis.” Throughout the Quarterly Report it has been abbreviated to “Early non-P&S syphilis.” Please refer to the following documentation for additional information on all other syphilis case definition revisions: <https://www.cdc.gov/std/stats/DCL-syph-case-def-sept-4-2017.pdf>.

Congenital Syphilis Case Definition

A case of congenital syphilis (CS) occurs when a pregnant woman diagnosed with inadequately treated syphilis passes the infection on to her infant in utero or during delivery. This may result in stillbirth, death of the newborn, or significant future health and developmental problems. A wide spectrum of severity exists, from inapparent infection to severe cases that are clinically apparent at birth. An infant or child (aged less than 2 years) may have signs such as hepatosplenomegaly, rash, condyloma lata, snuffles, jaundice (nonviral hepatitis), pseudoparalysis, anemia, or edema (nephrotic syndrome and/or malnutrition). An older child may have stigmata (e.g., interstitial keratitis, nerve deafness, anterior bowing of shins, frontal bossing, mulberry molars, Hutchinson teeth, saddle nose, rhagades, or Clutton joints).

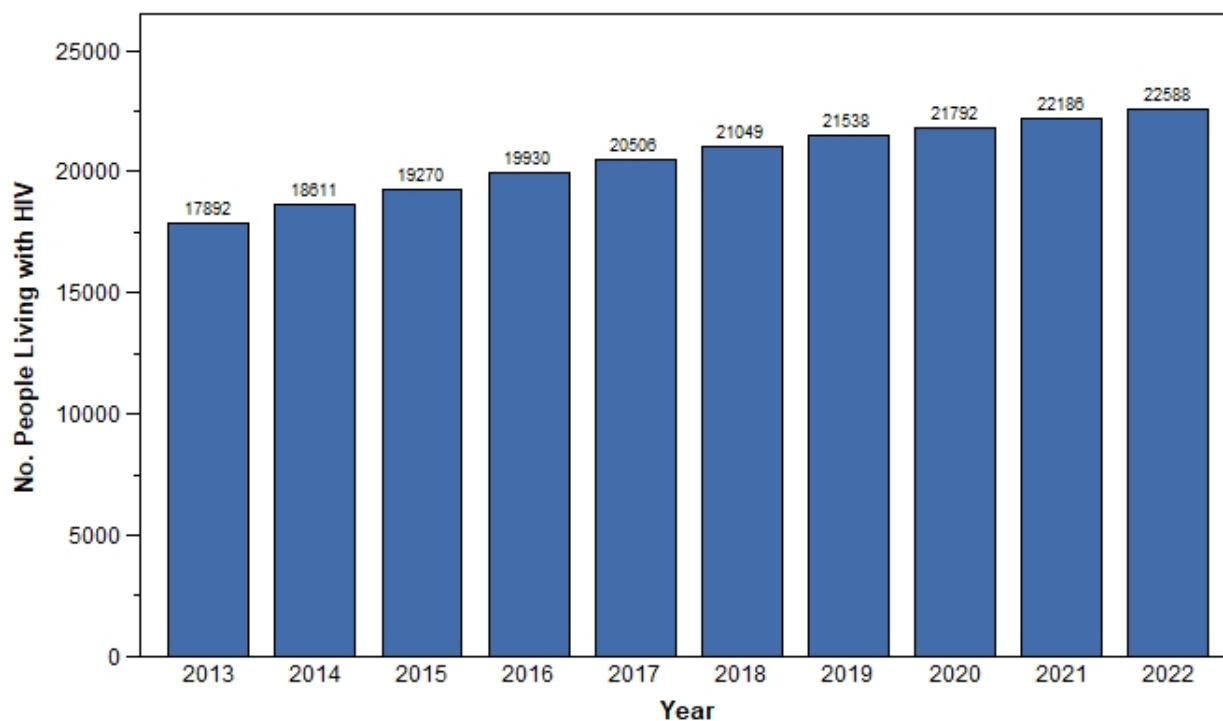

Persons Newly Diagnosed with HIV Louisiana, January - December 2022

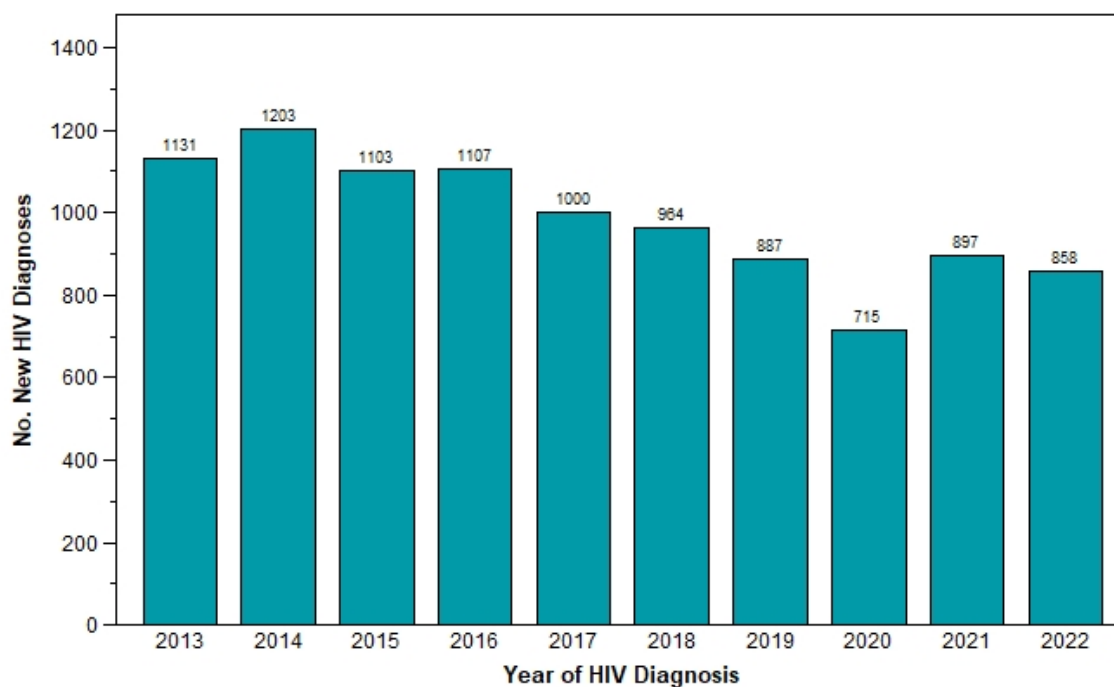

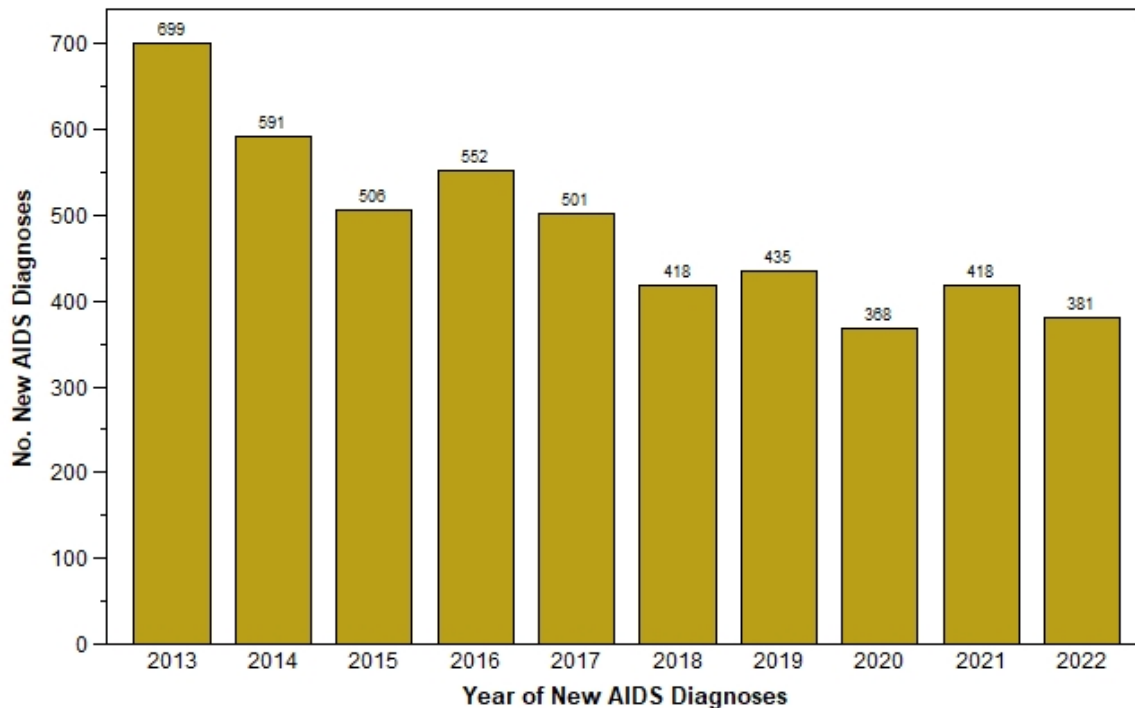

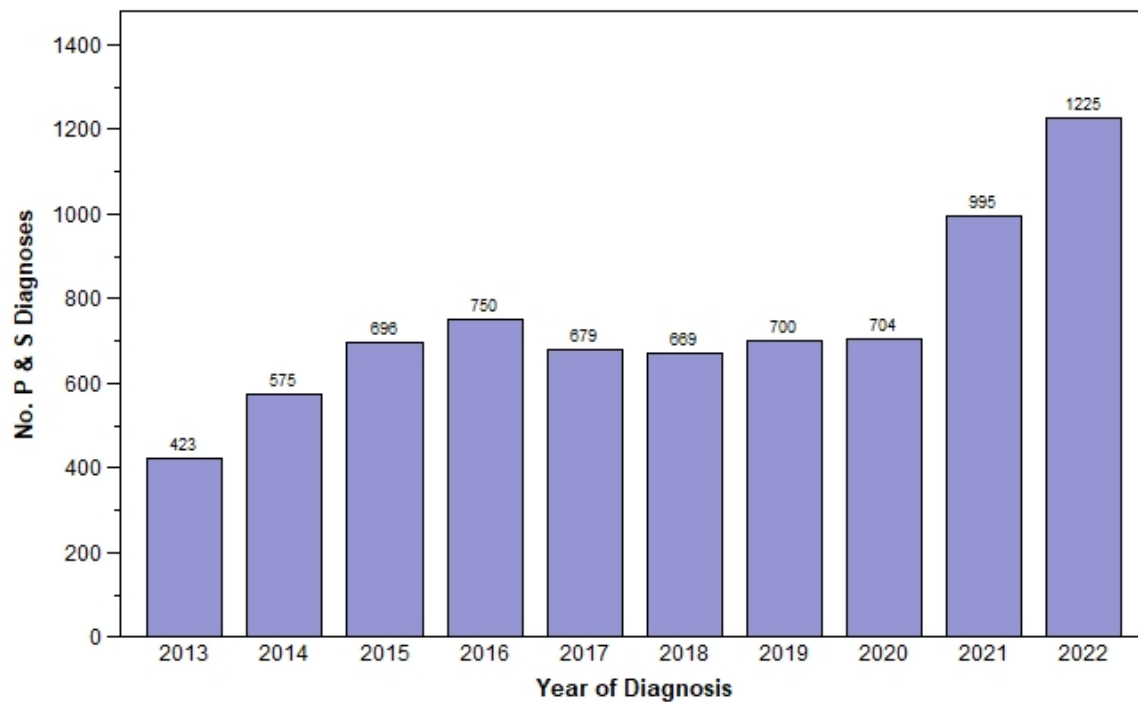

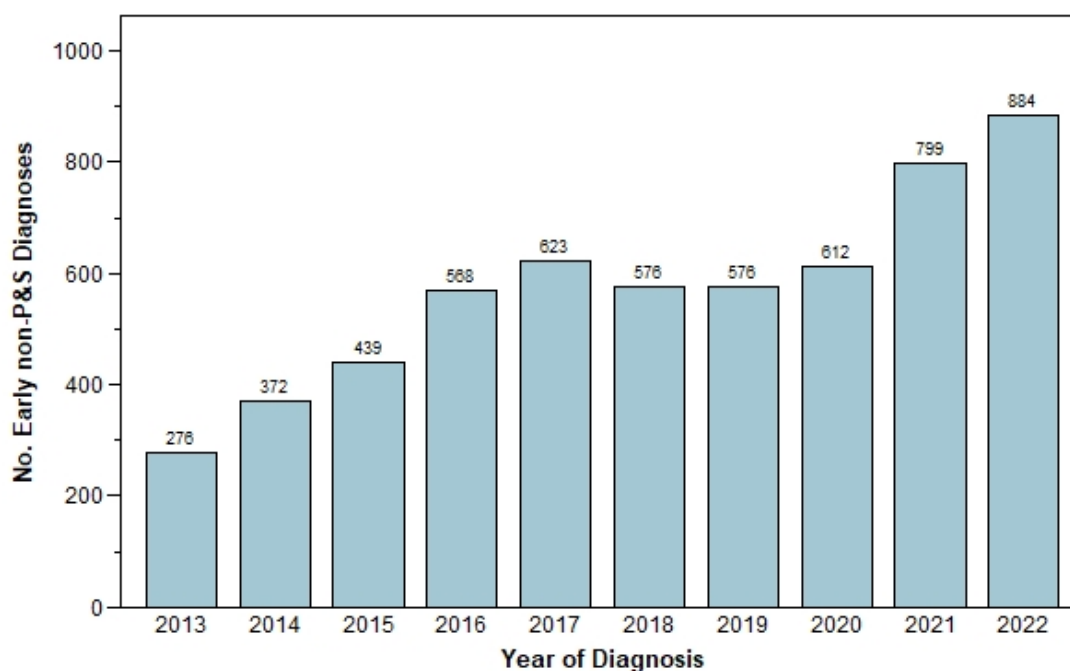

10-Year Trends in Early non-P&S Syphilis Diagnoses Louisiana, 2013-2022

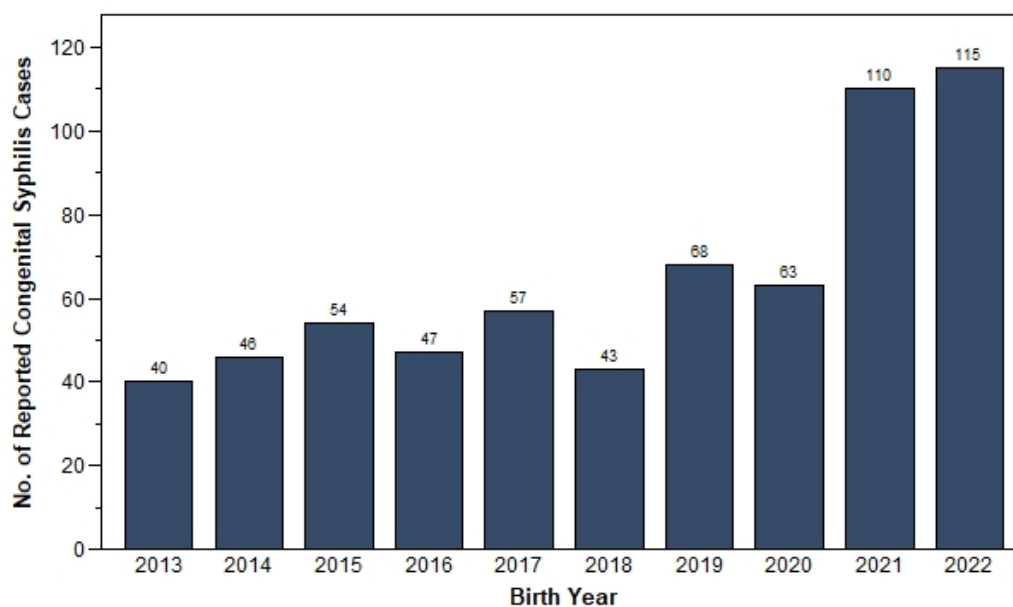

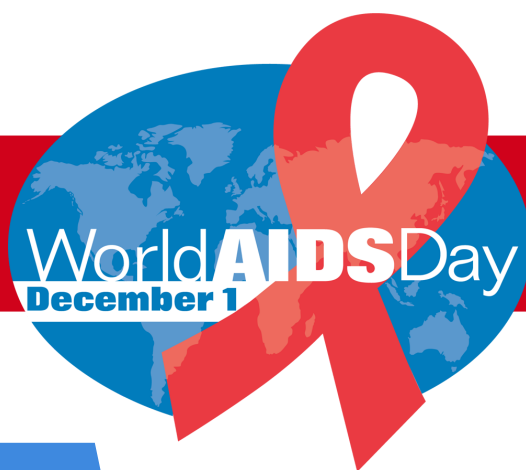

Around the World

-  In 2022, an estimated **39 million** people were **living with HIV**.
-  Since the start of the epidemic, an estimated **40.4 million** people have **died from an AIDS-related illness**.
-  An estimated **1.3 million** people were **diagnosed with HIV** in 2022, a **38% decrease** since 2010.

HIV & AIDS in the United States

- There are over 1 million Americans living with HIV.
- In 2021, over 35,000 people were diagnosed with HIV.
- In 2021, over 16,000 people were diagnosed with AIDS.

HIV and AIDS in Louisiana



In 2022 there were **858 new HIV diagnoses in Louisiana.**

It is estimated that **1 in 6** people living with HIV in Louisiana are **undiagnosed** and **do not know** their HIV status.



In 2022, there were **22,588 people living with HIV** in Louisiana. **Almost half** of people living with HIV had a prior **AIDS diagnosis.**

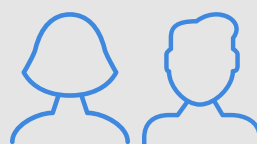
Among persons living with HIV in 2022...

People with HIV who take their medications as prescribed and keep virally suppressed or undetectable **cannot pass HIV on to sex partners.**

How YOU can prevent HIV transmission:

If you are living with HIV, **take your HIV medicine** to stay healthy & reduce the risk of passing HIV on to a partner.



Know your status and your partner's status. **Get tested for HIV.**



Avoid sharing needles and other injecting equipment.



If you are HIV-negative, ask your doctor about **PrEP**. **The daily pill to prevent HIV.**



Use **condoms** correctly every time you have oral, anal, or vaginal sex.



Get tested and treated for other sexually transmitted diseases (STDs).
