Figure 6A.1: HIV/AIDS Status of Respondents (N=83)

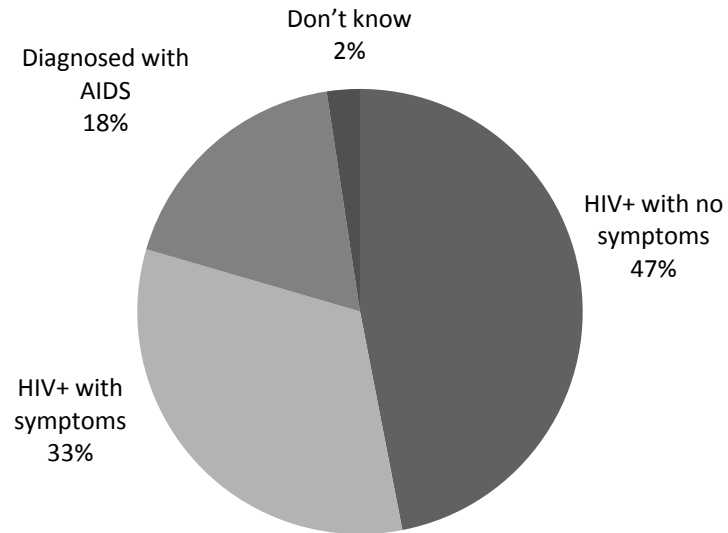
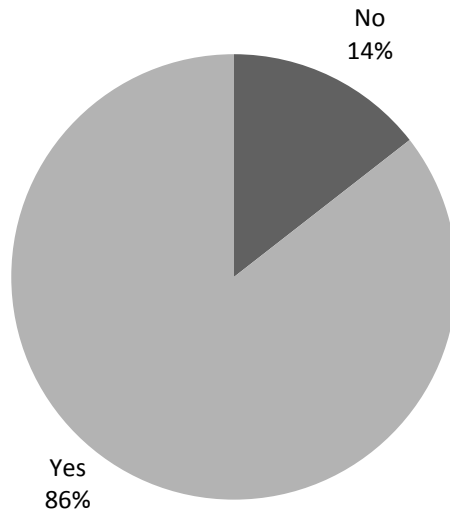

**Figure 6A.2: Respondents Living in Louisiana at Time of HIV Diagnosis (N=83)**

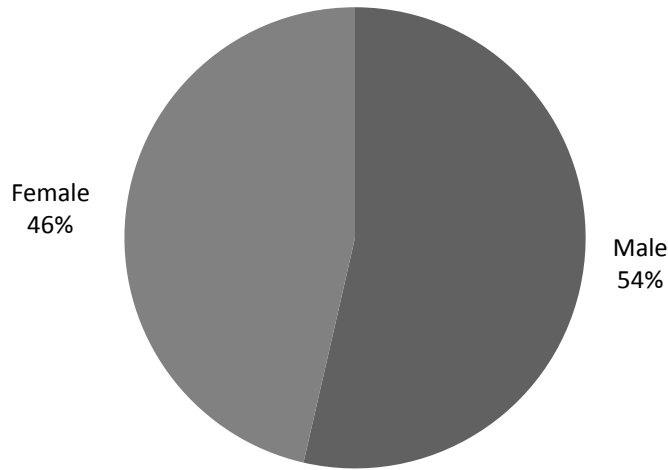

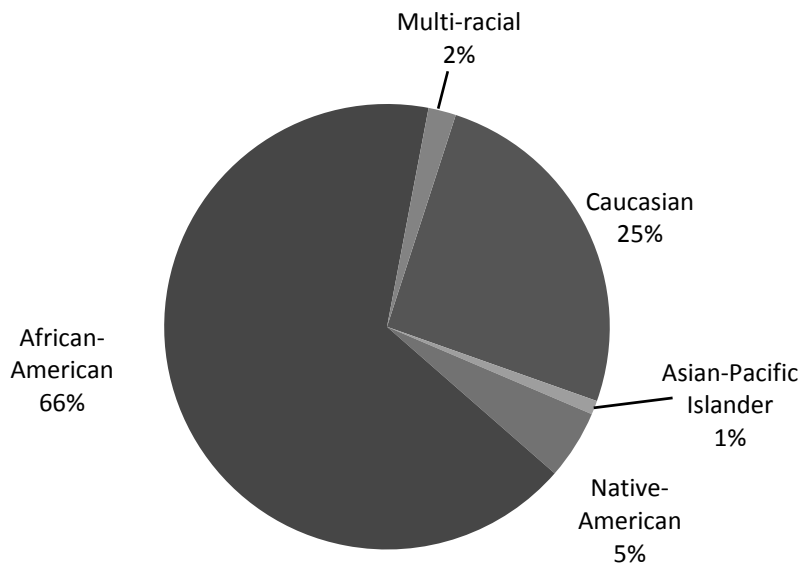

**Figure 6A.3: Gender of Respondents (N=84)**

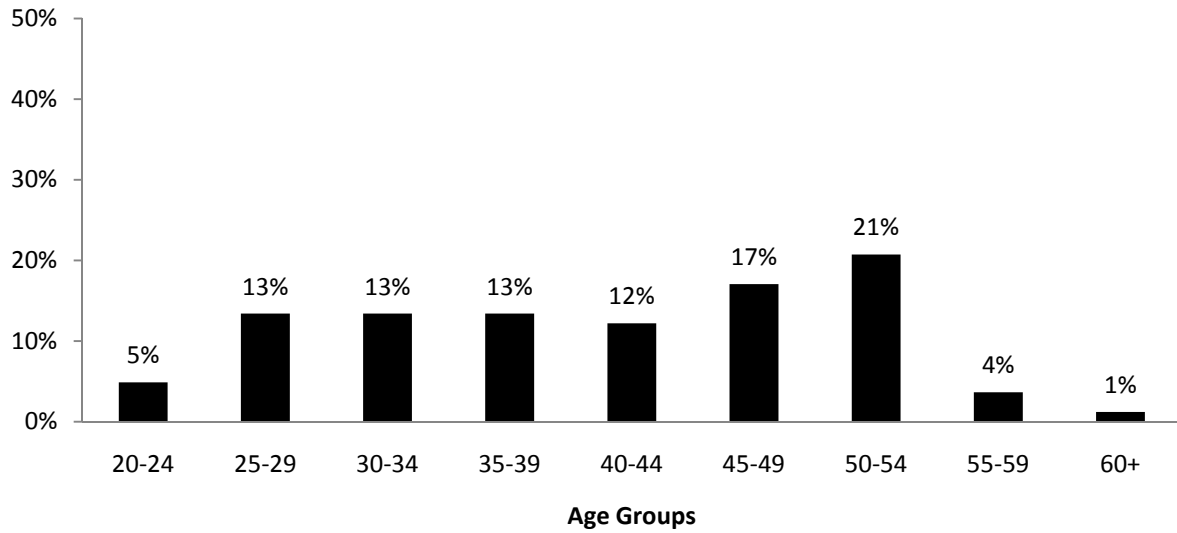


**Figure 6A.4: Race of Respondents (N=83)**

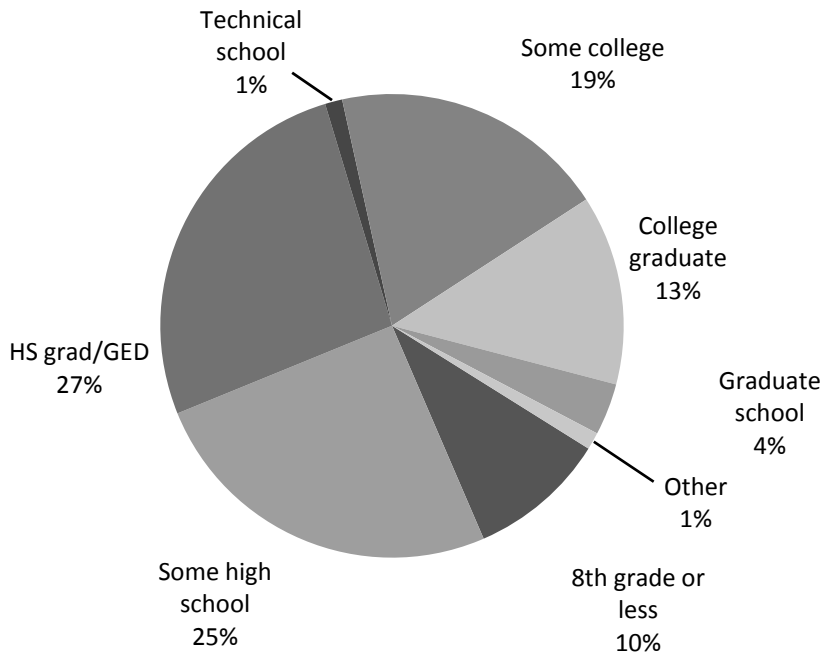

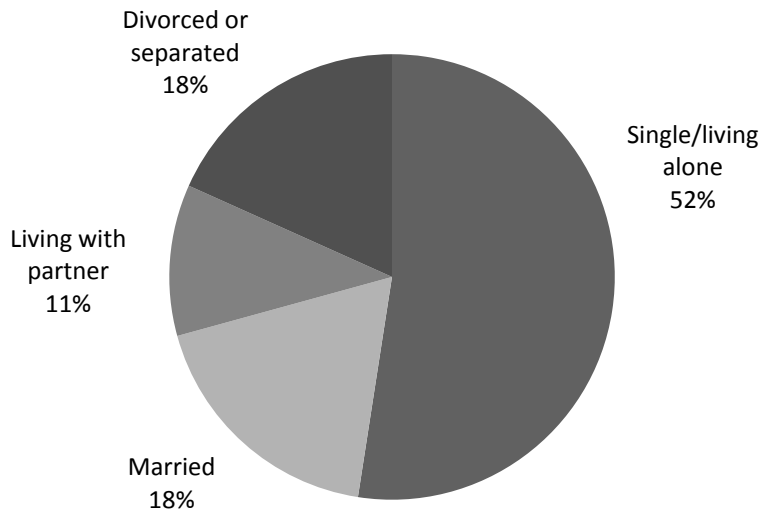
**Figure 6A.5: Age of Respondents (N=82)**

Figure 6B.1: Health Insurance Needs and Services Used

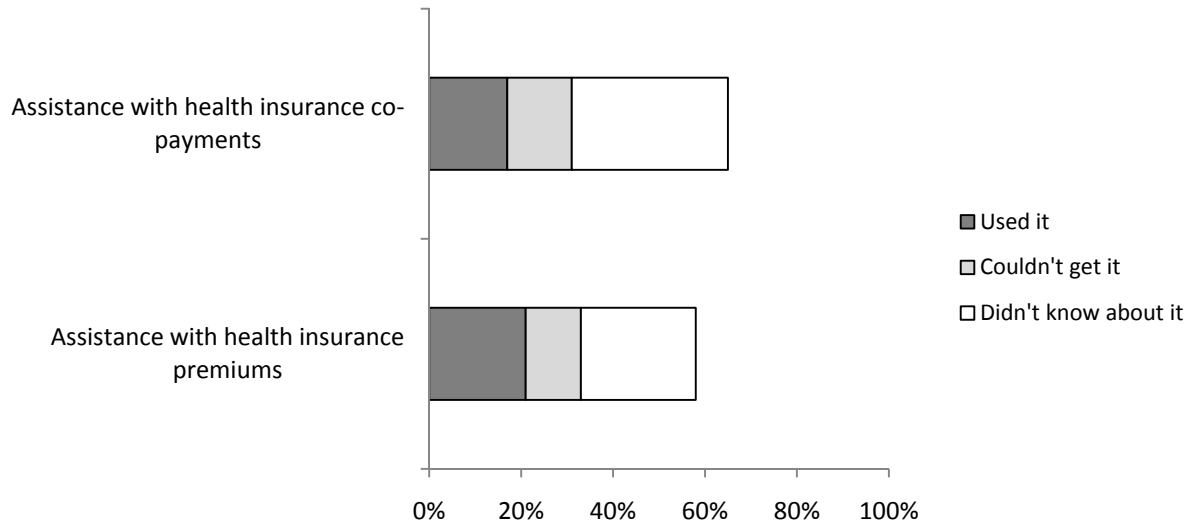
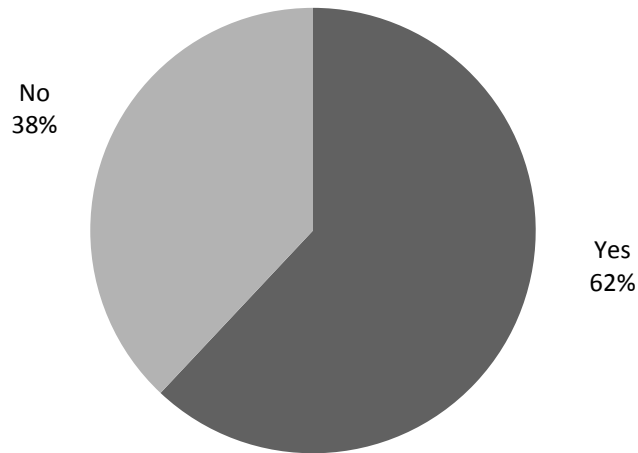

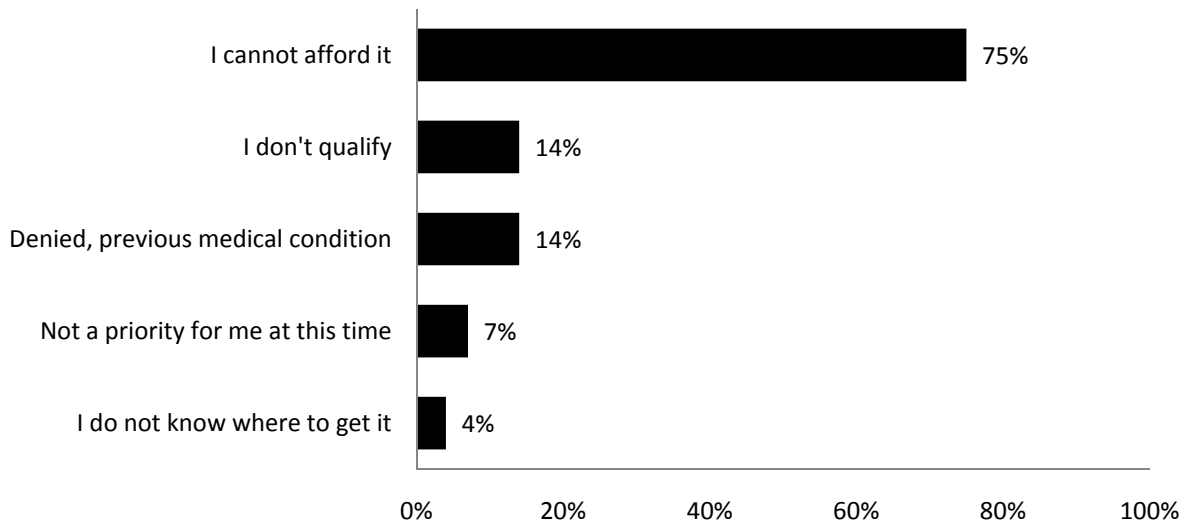

**Figure 6B.2: Health Insurance Covers HIV/AIDS Related Medical Care (N=82)**



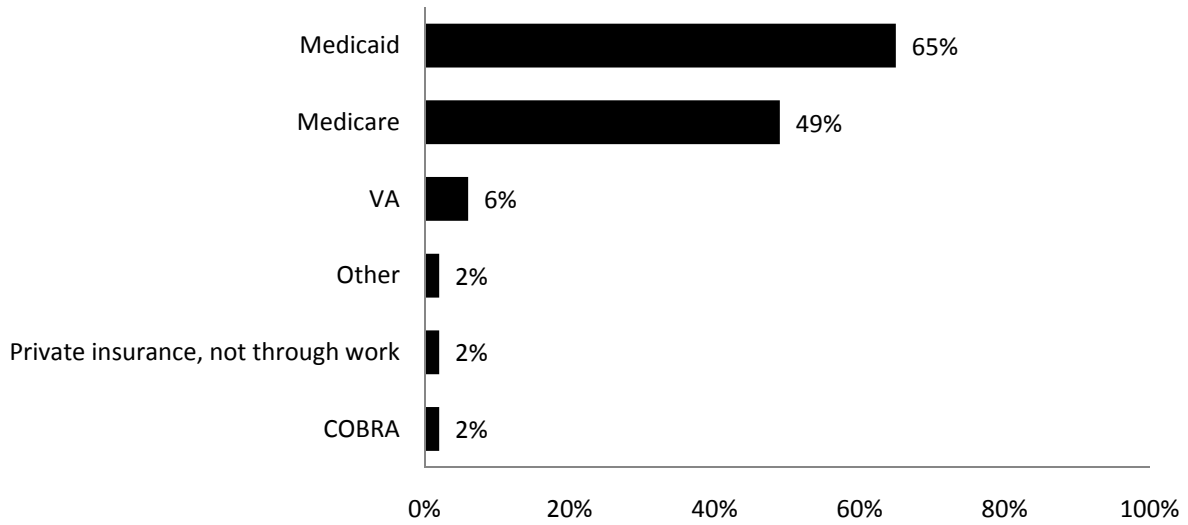
**Figure 6B.3: Barriers to Obtaining Health Insurance Coverage (N=28)**

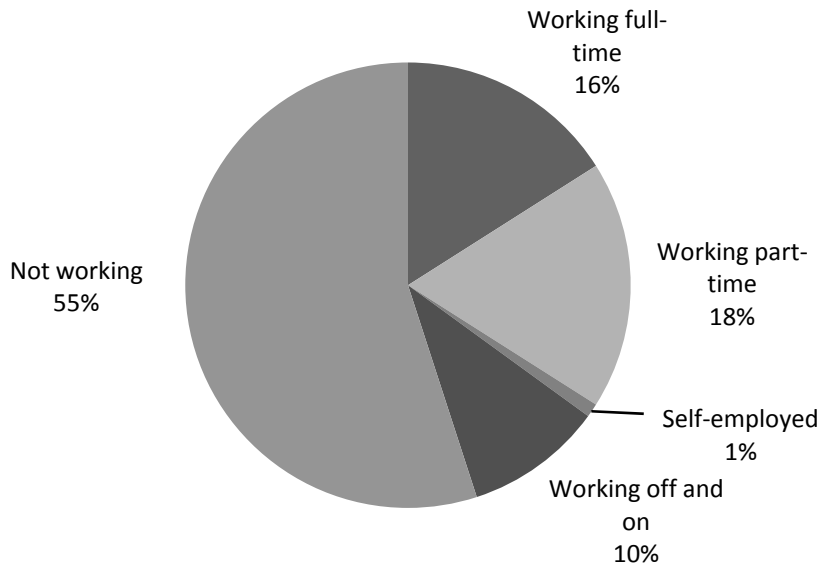
**Figure 6B.4: Sources of Health Insurance for Respondents With Insurance (N=51)**



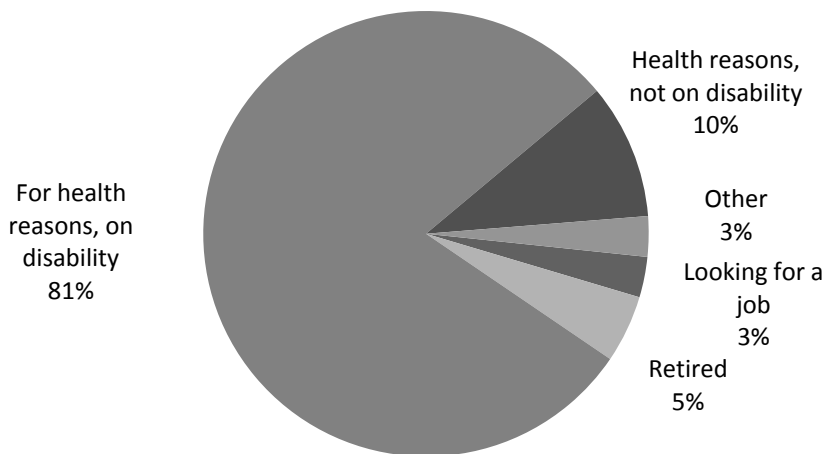

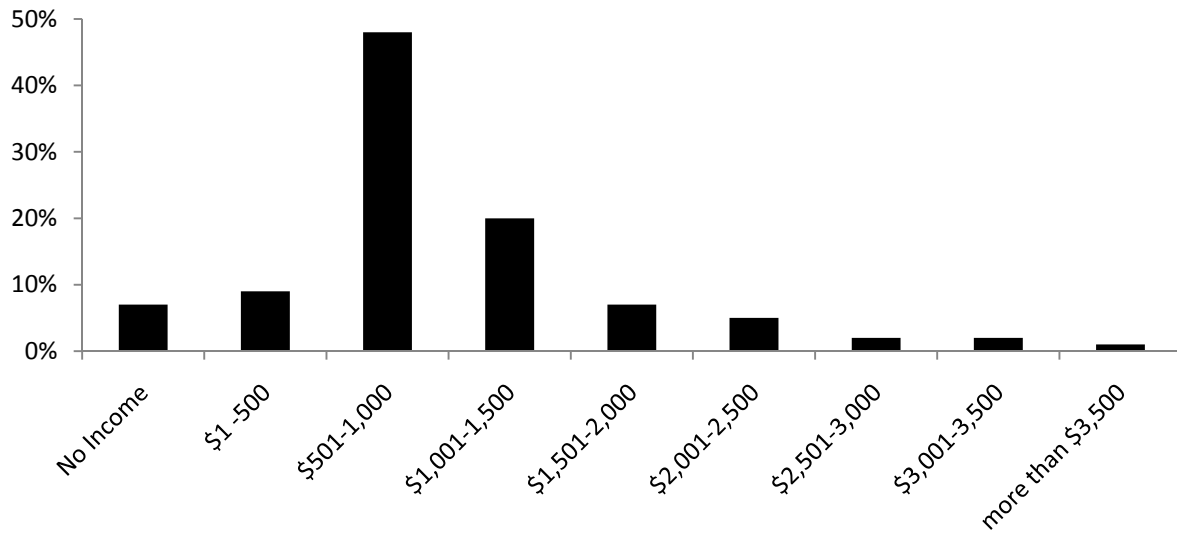
**Figure 6B.5: Employment Situation in the Last Six Months (N=83)**



**Figure 6B.6: Reasons for Not Being Employed in the Last Six Months (N=41)**



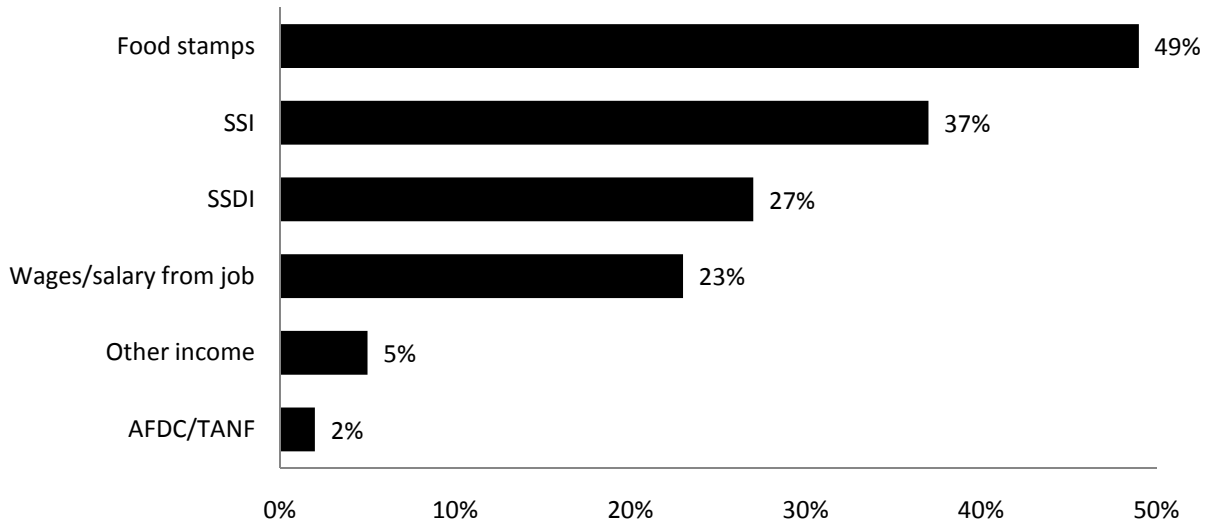
**Figure 6B.7: Reported Monthly Income of Respondents (N=81)**

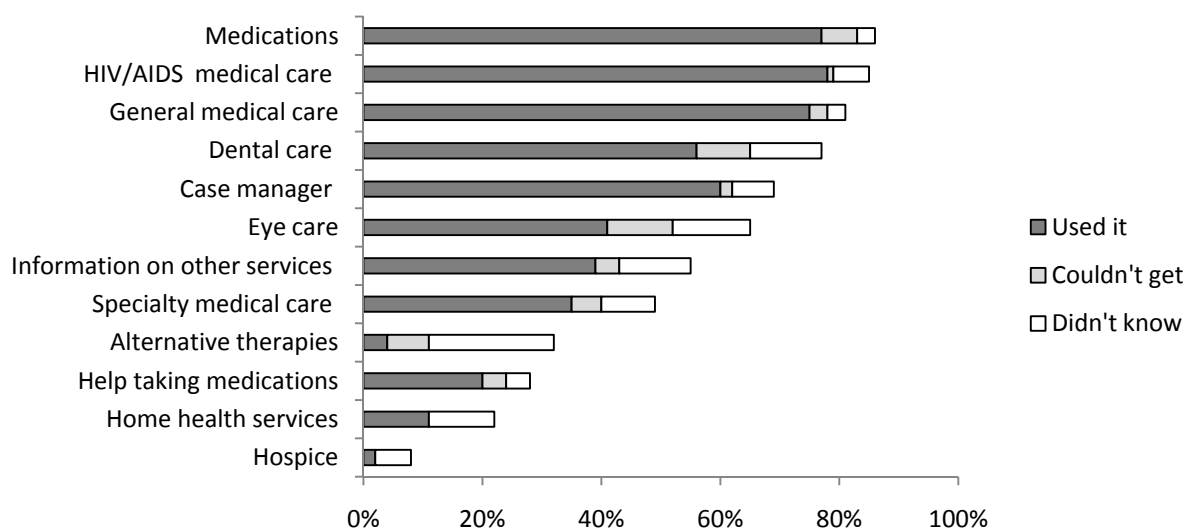
**Figure 6B.8: Sources of Household Income (N=84)**

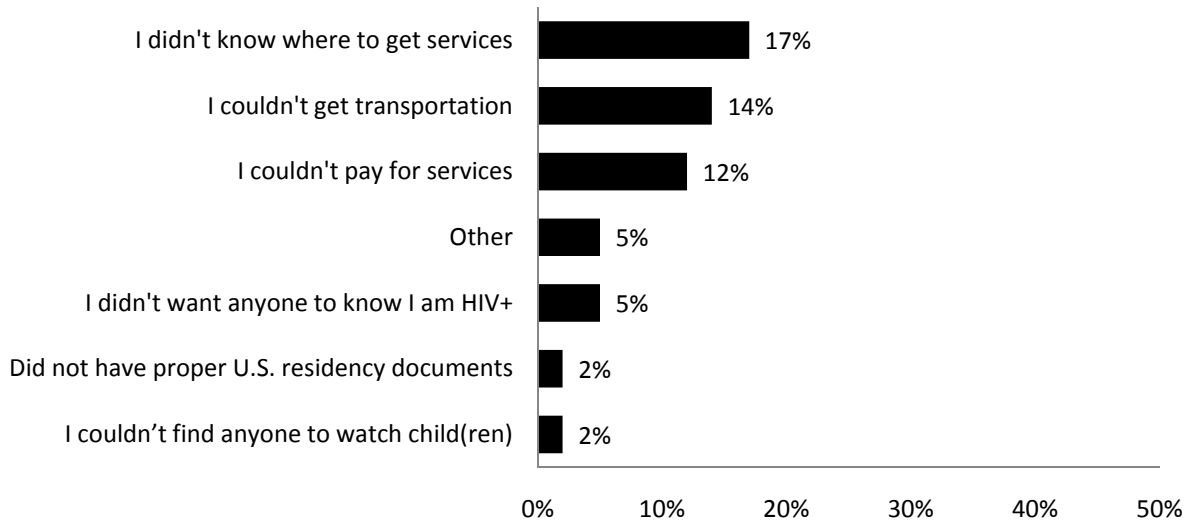
**Figure 6C.1: Need and Use of HIV/AIDS-Related Medical Services in the Last Six Months**

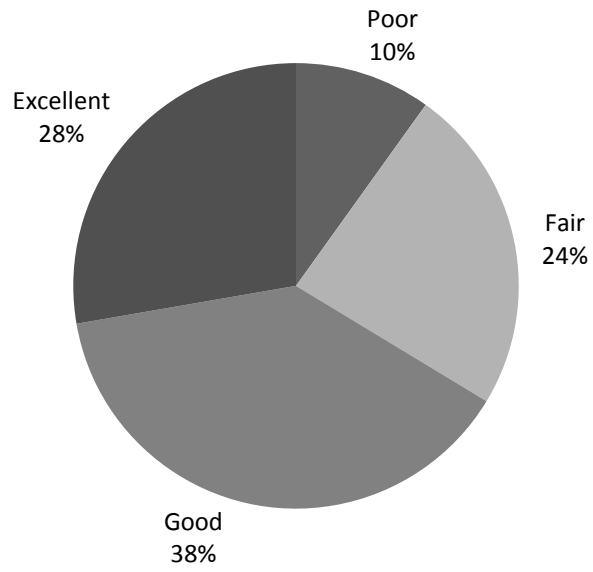
**Figure 6C.2: Barriers to HIV/AIDS-Related Medical Services in the Last Six Months (N=42)**

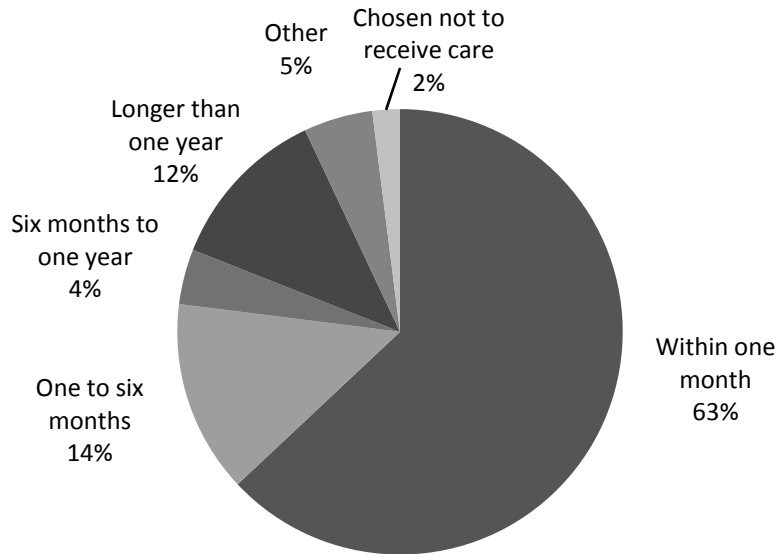
**Figure 6C.3: Self-reported Overall Health Status (N=83)**



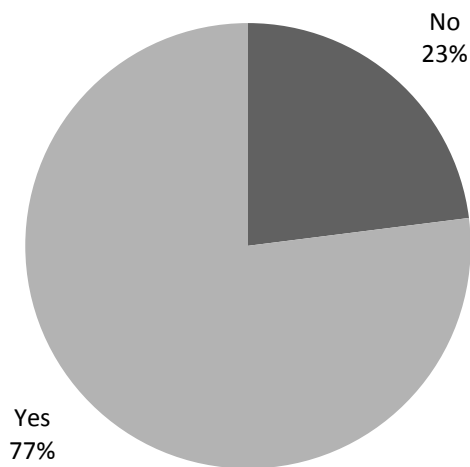

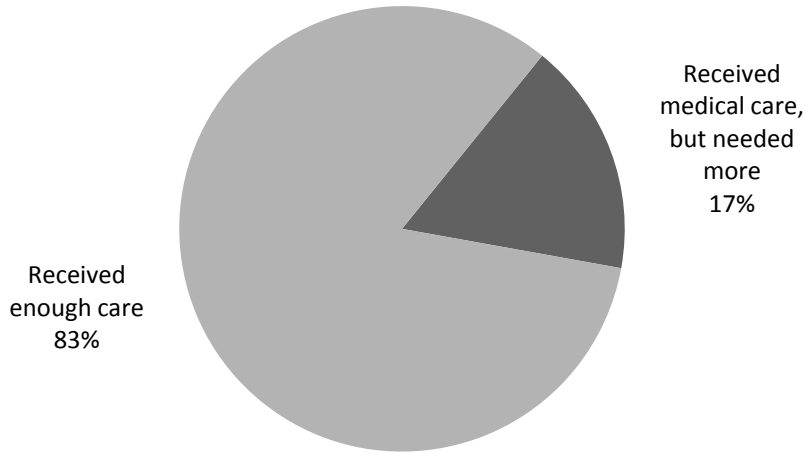
**Figure 6C.4: Time From HIV Diagnosis to HIV/AIDS-Related Medical Care (N=81)**



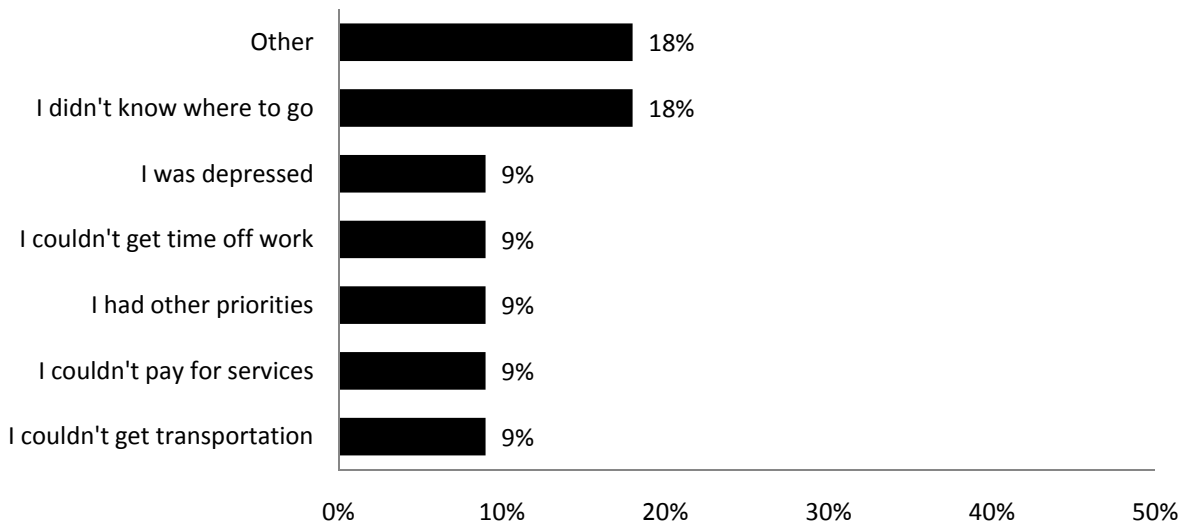
**Figure 6C.5: Have Sought HIV/AIDS-Related Medical Care in Last Six Months (N=81)**



**Figure 6C.6: Level of Medical Care Received by Respondents (N=60)**

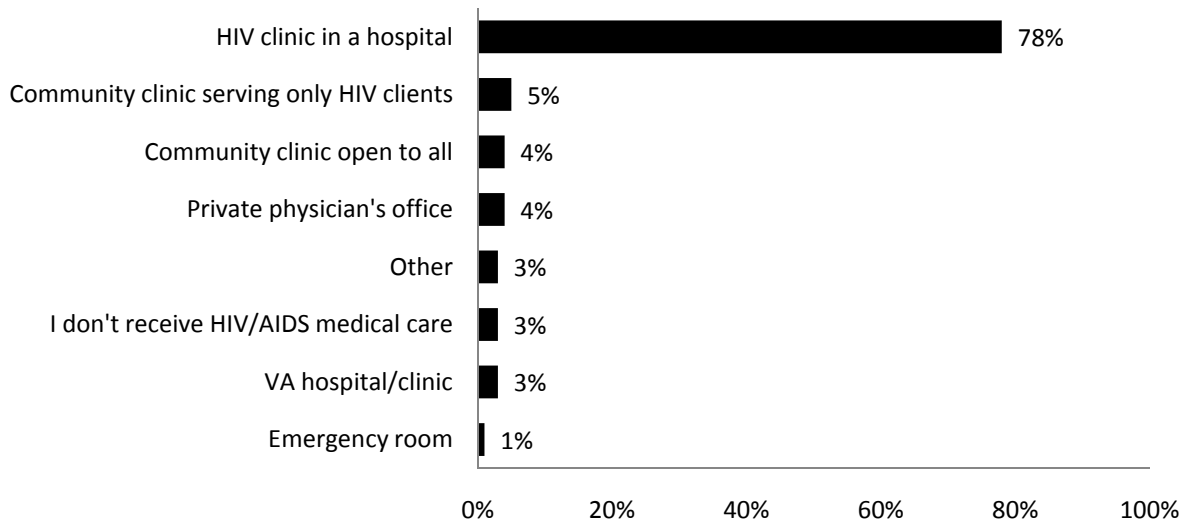


**Figure 6C.7: Reasons for Not Seeking HIV/AIDS-Related Medical Care in the Last Six Months (N=11)**



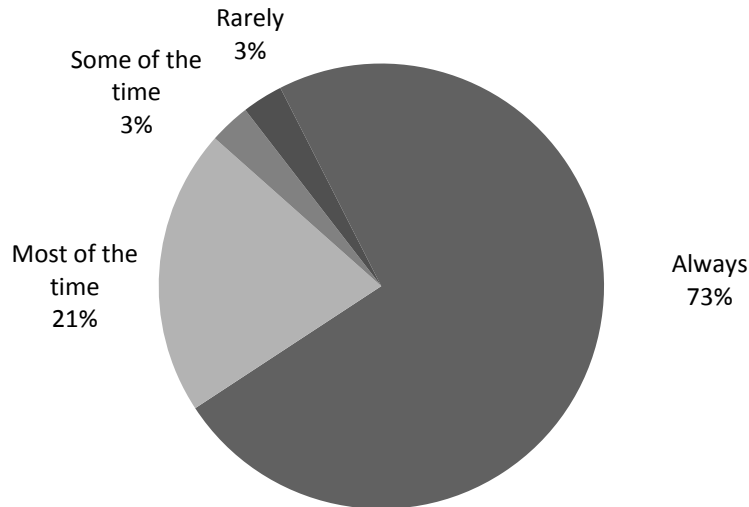

**Figure 6C.8: Places Where Respondent Regularly Receives HIV/AIDS-Related Medical Care (N=79)**



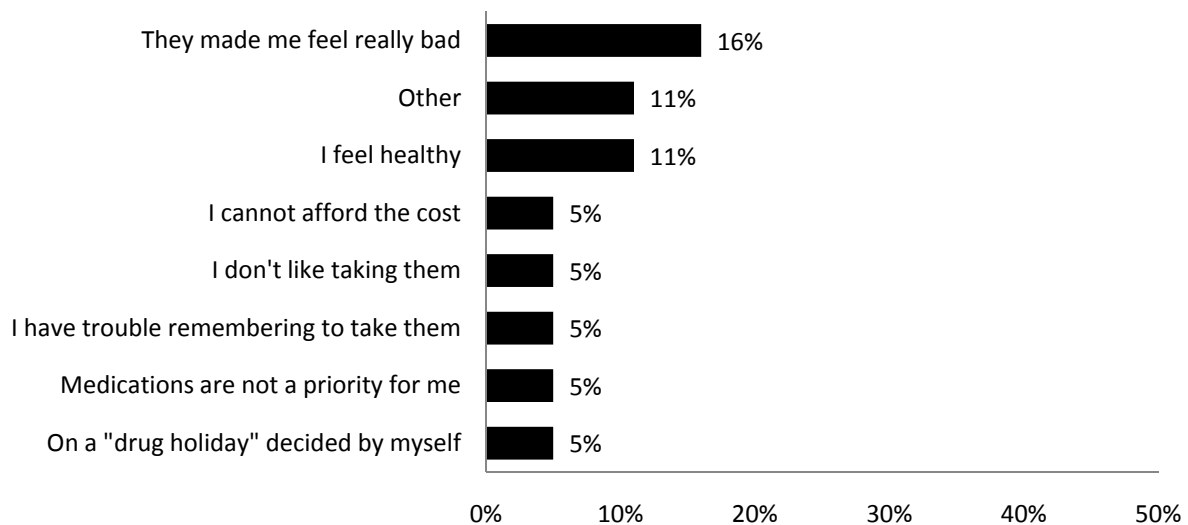

**Figure 6C.10: Reasons for Not Taking HIV/AIDS Medications (N=19)**



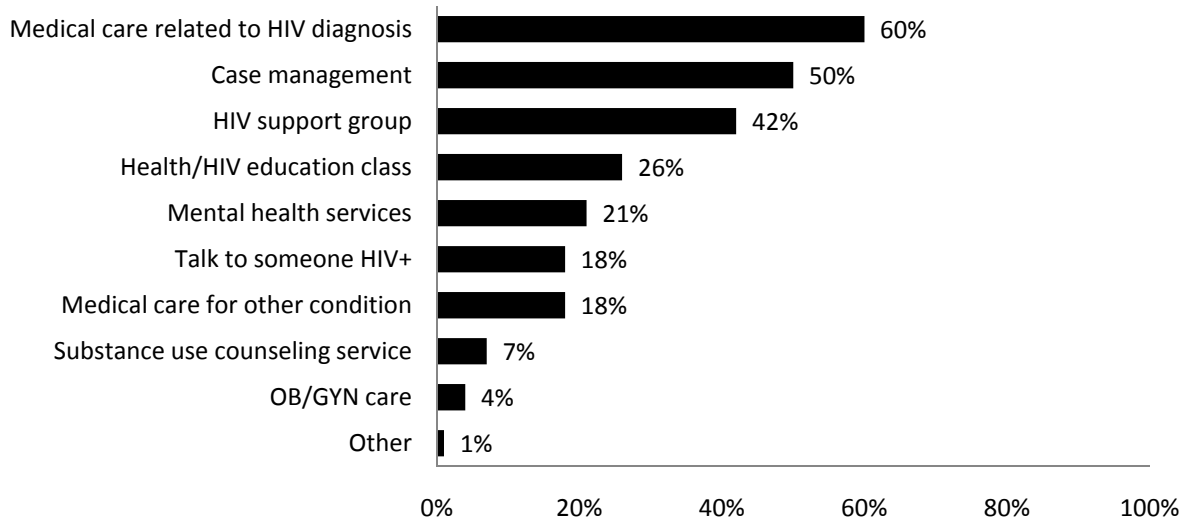

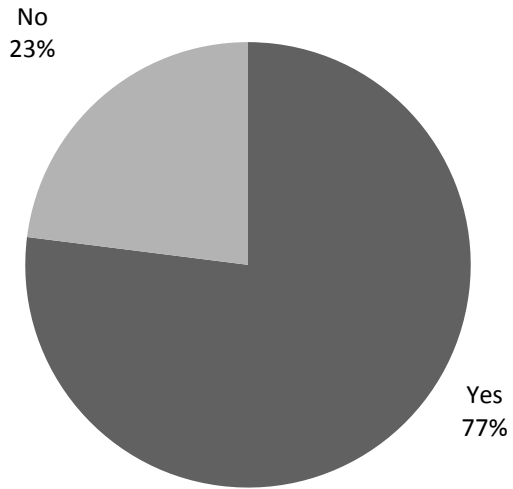
**Figure 6C.11: Service Referrals at the Time of HIV Diagnosis (N=72)**



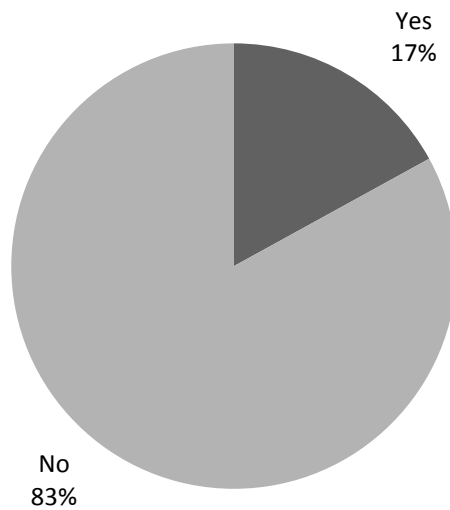

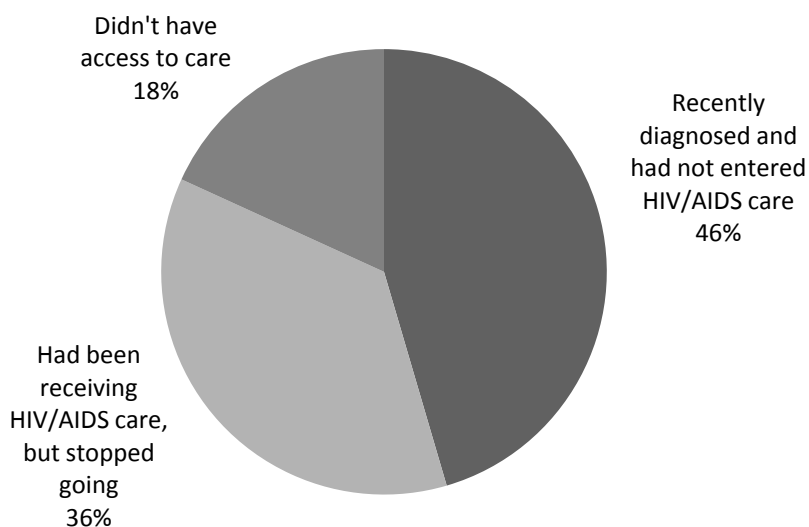
**Figure 6C.12: HIV Positive for Five Years or More (N=83)**



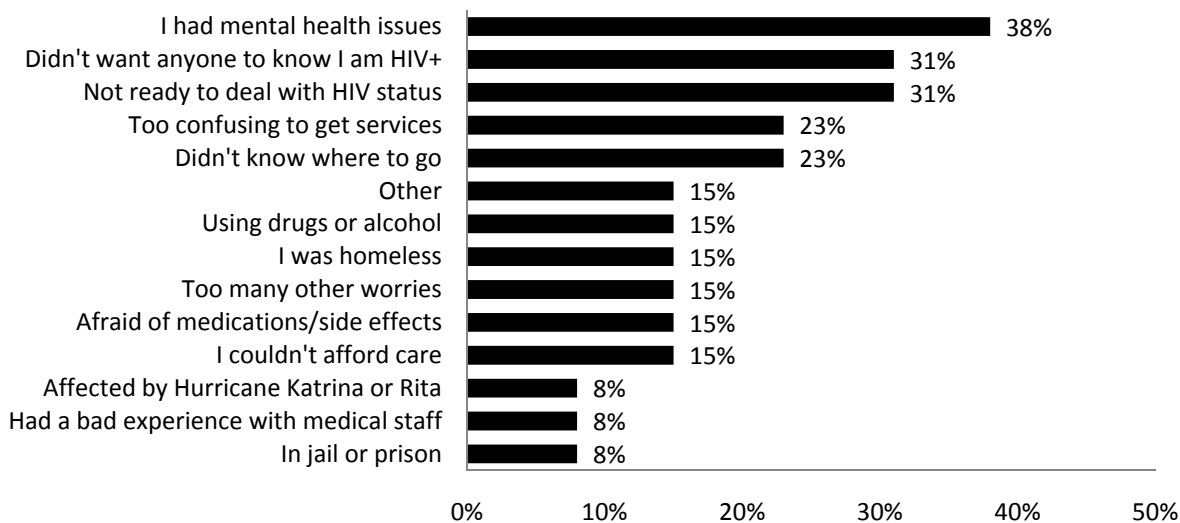
**Figure 6C.13: Percentage of Respondents HIV Positive for At Least Five Years Who Have Been Out of Treatment for at Least 12 Months (N=60)**



**Figure 6C.14: Reason for Being Out of Care (N=11)**

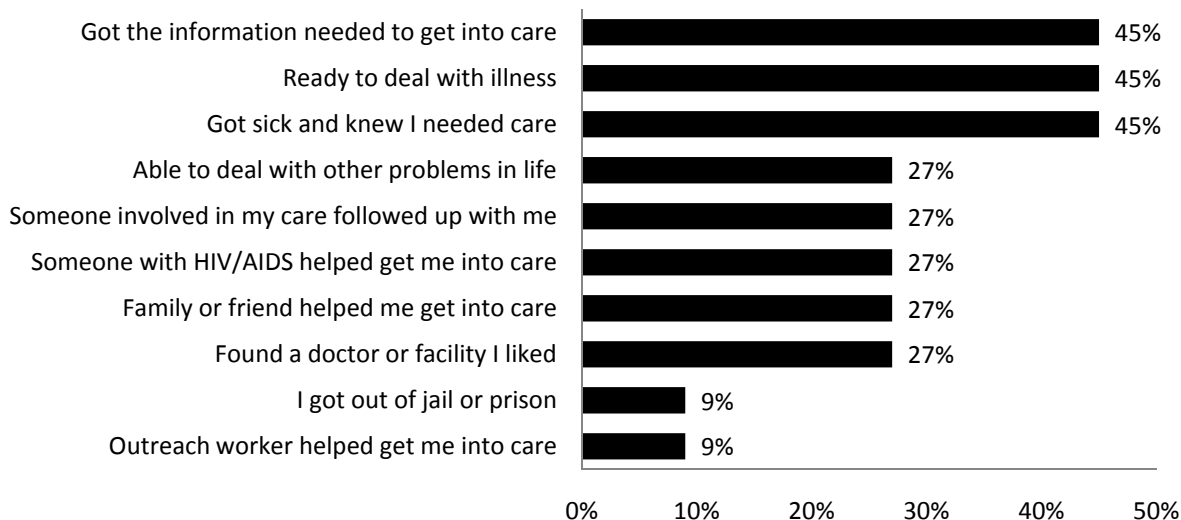


**Figure 6C.15: Barriers to Receiving HIV/AIDS-Related Medical Care When Out of Care (N=13)**



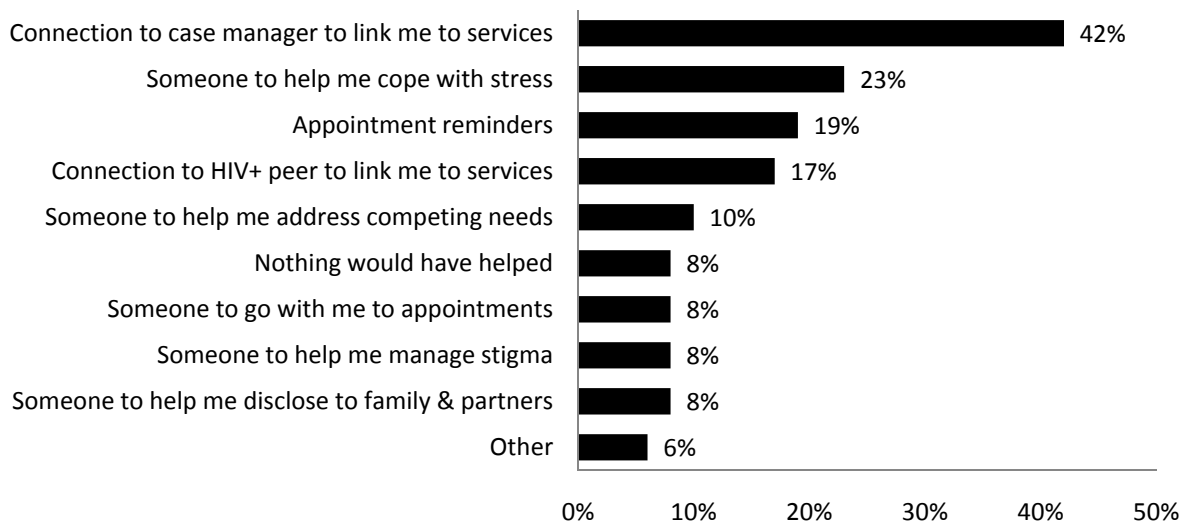

**Figure 6C.17: Assistance That Would Have Helped Respondent Get Back Into Care (N=52)**

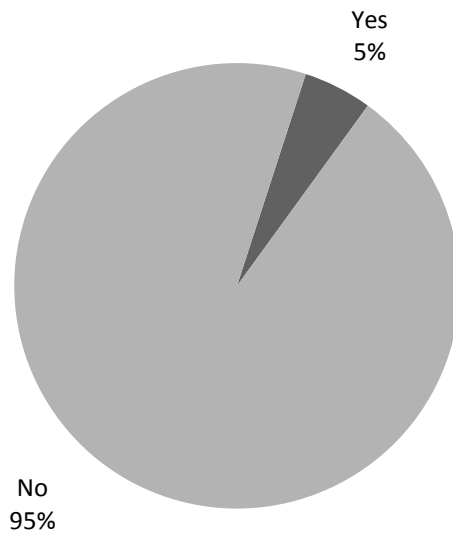

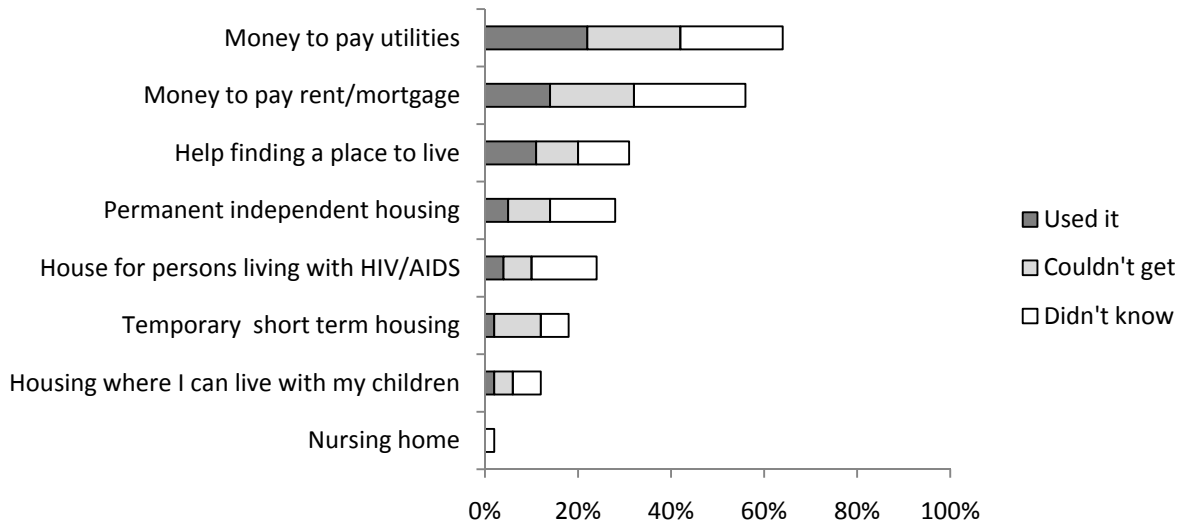

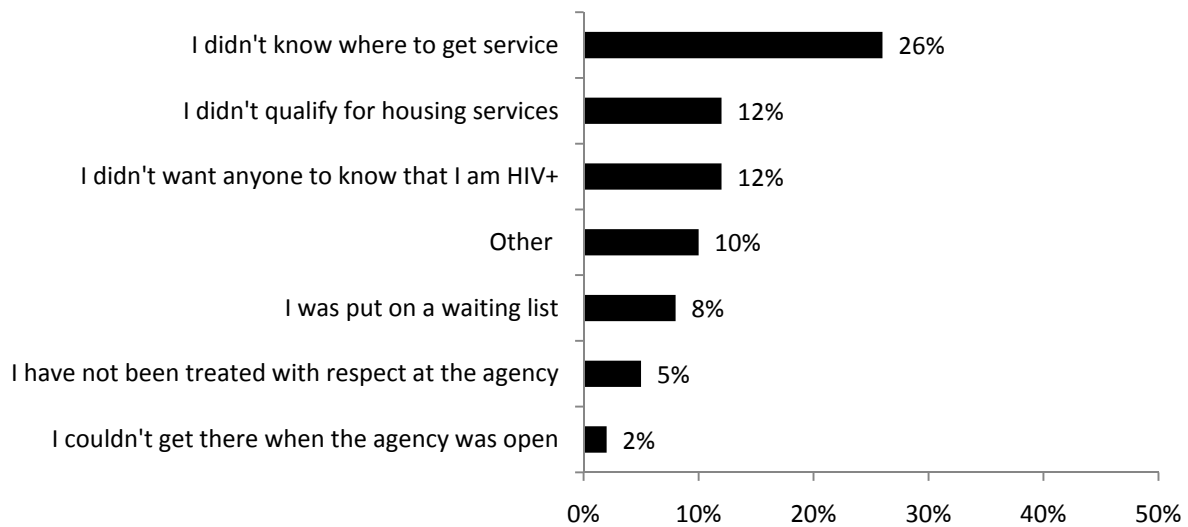
**Figure 6D.1: Need and Use of HIV/AIDS-Related Housing Services in the Last Six Months**

**Figure 6D.2: Barriers to HIV/AIDS-Related Housing Services in the Last Six Months (N=61)**



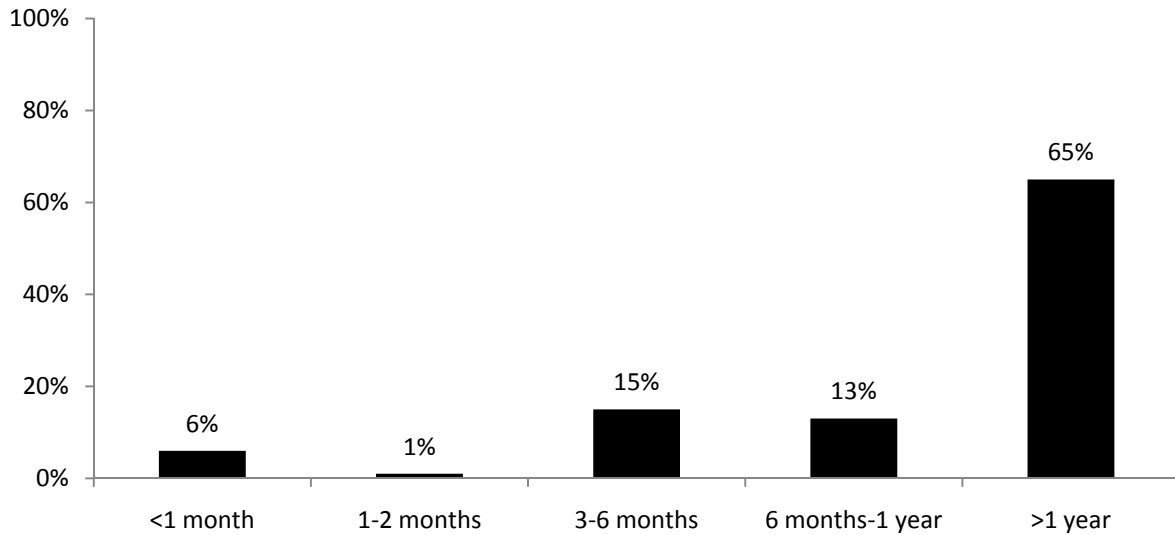

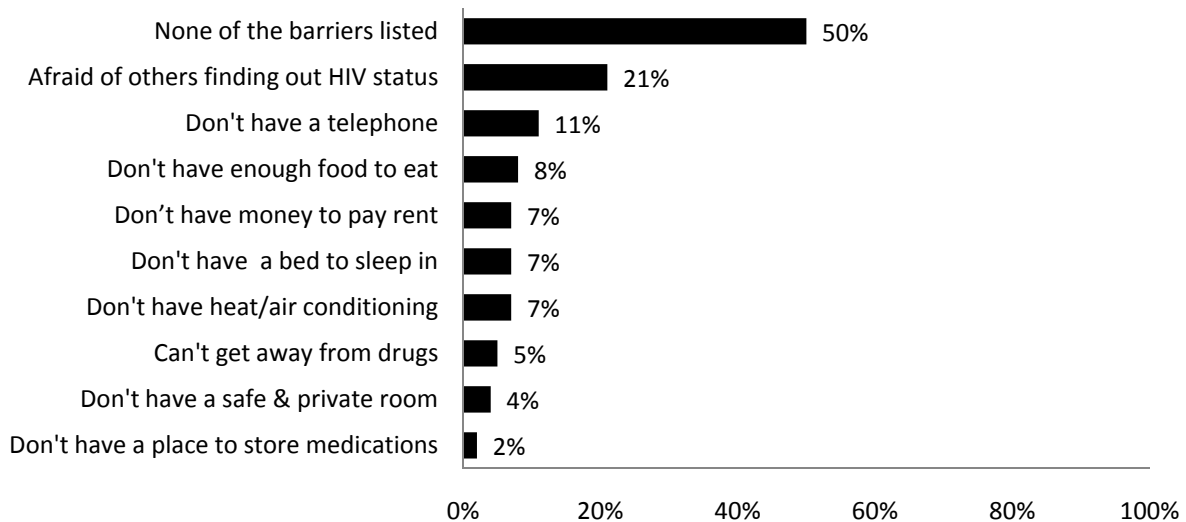

**Figure 6D.3: Length of Time at Current Residence (N=80)**

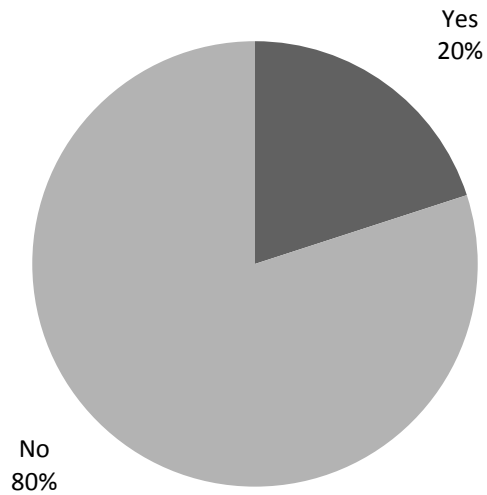


**Figure 6D.4: Housing Related Barriers That Stop Respondent from Taking Care of Their HIV/AIDS (N=84)**

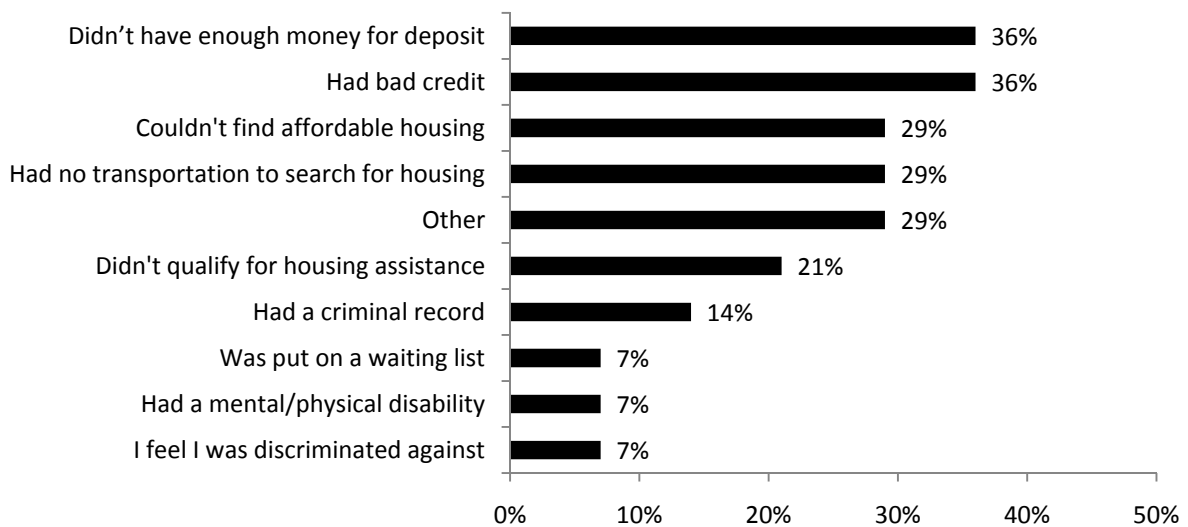

**Figure 6D.5: Problems Obtaining Housing in Last Six Months (N=70)**

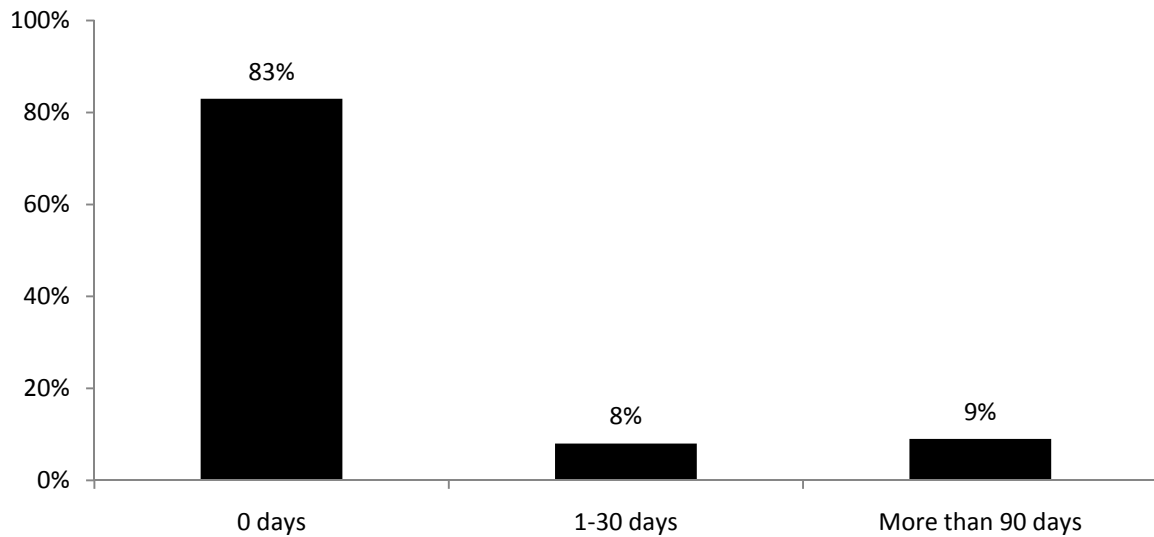


**Figure 6D.6: Barriers to Obtaining Housing (N=14)**



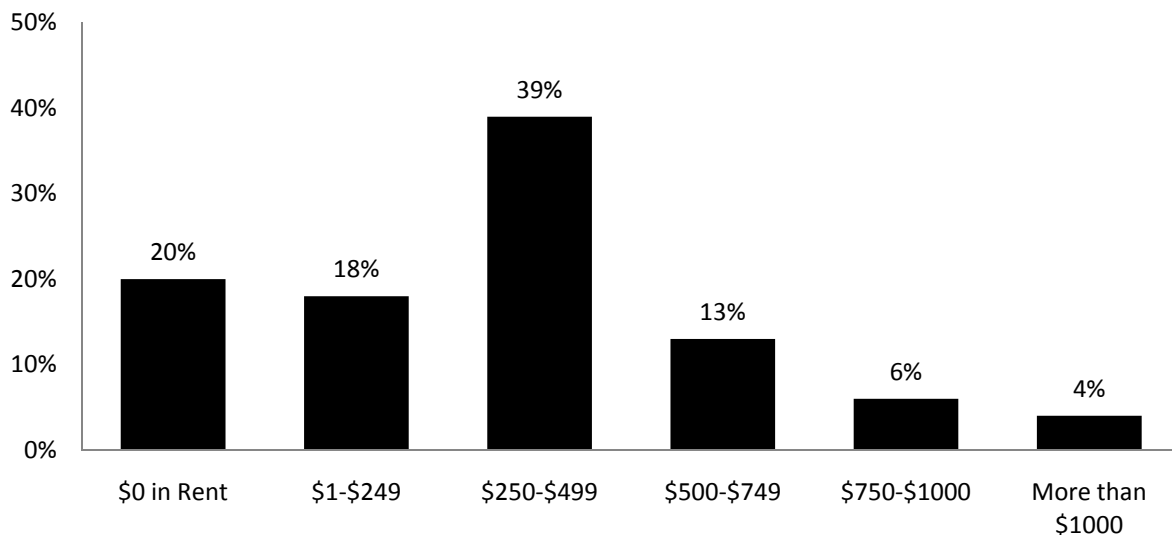

**Figure 6D.7: Nights Spent Homeless or Without a Place to Sleep (N=64)**



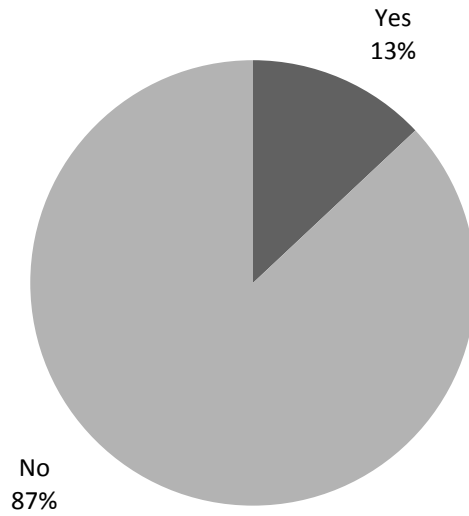

**Figure 6D.8: Monthly Rent/Mortgage Contributions (N=71)**

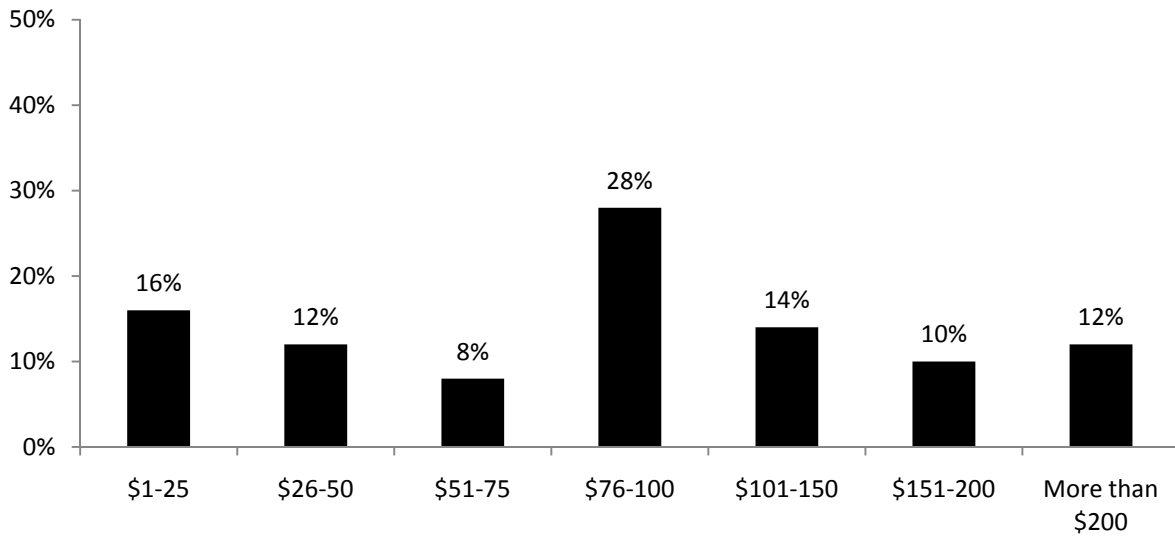

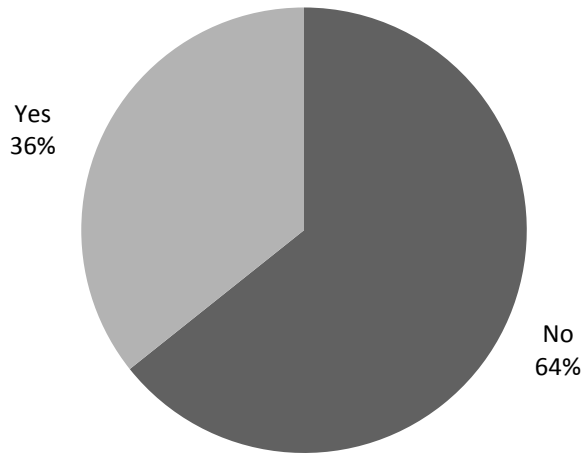
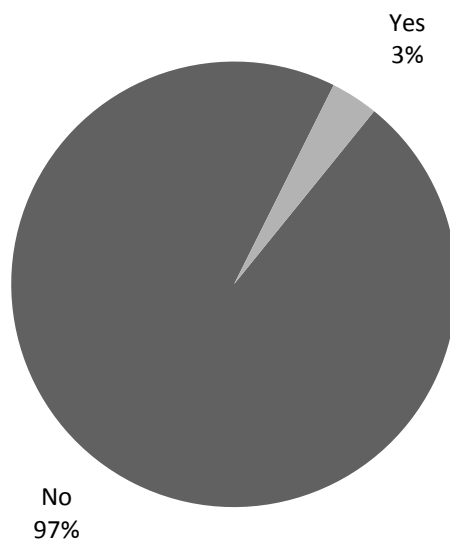
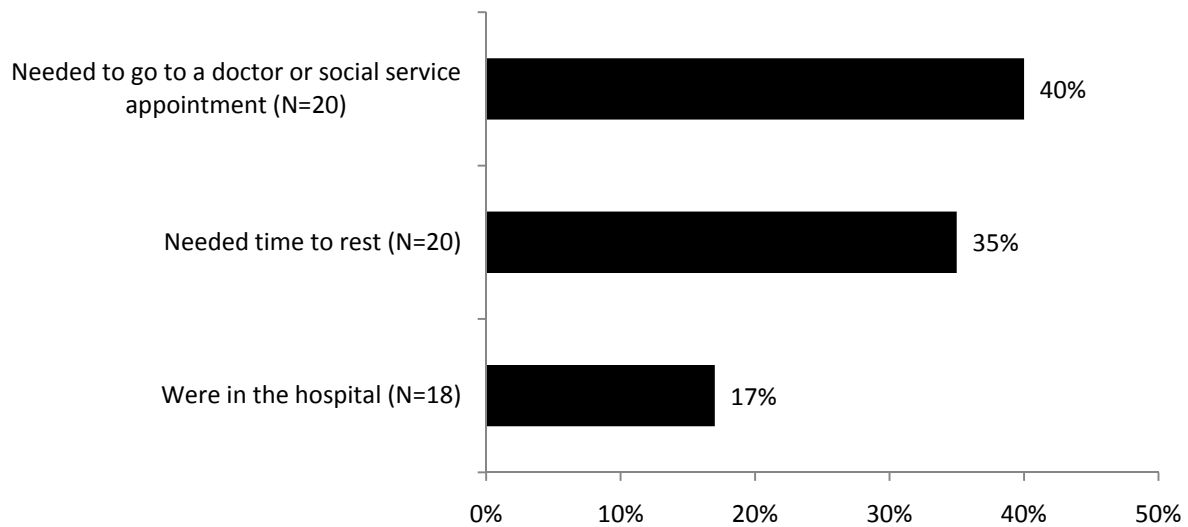


Figure 6E.2: Percentage of Respondents with HIV Positive Child (N=19)

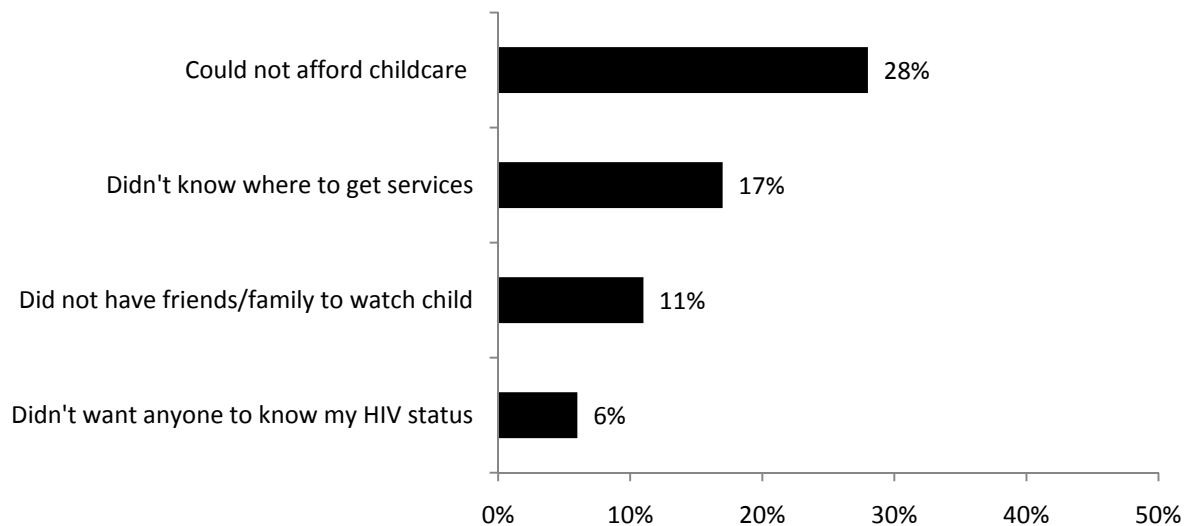


**Figure 6E.3: Reasons for Needing Help Caring for Children During Past Six Months**

**Figure 6E.4: Barriers to Accessing Childcare Services (N=18)**

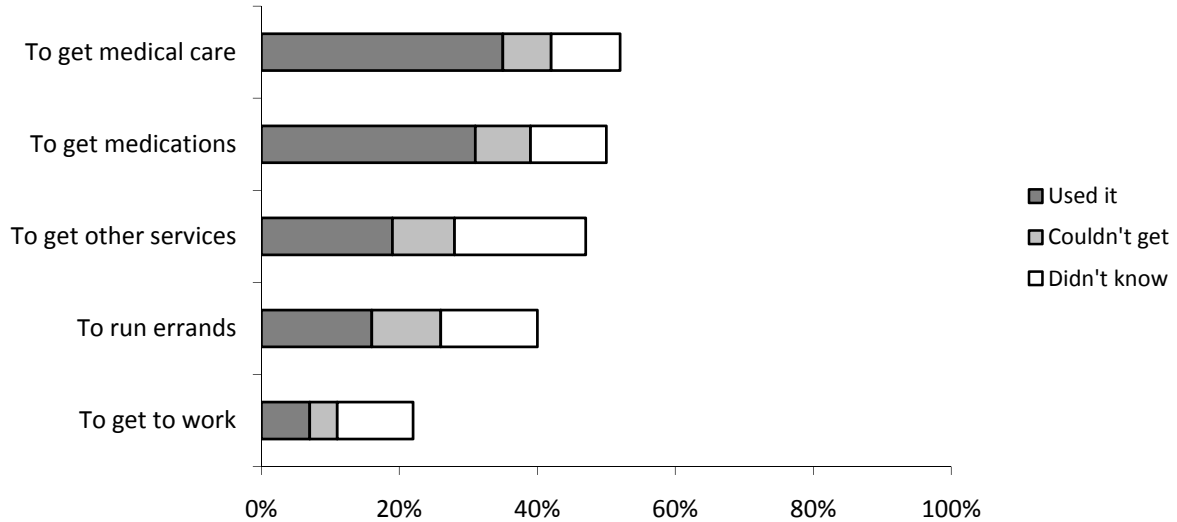

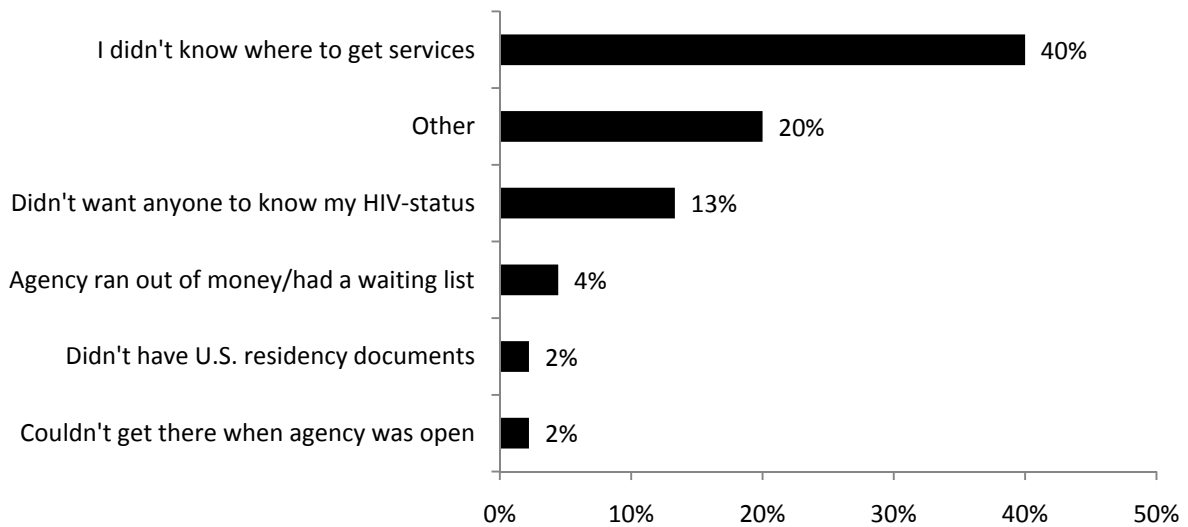
**Figure 6F.1: Need and Use of HIV/AIDS-Related Transportation Services in the Last Six Months**

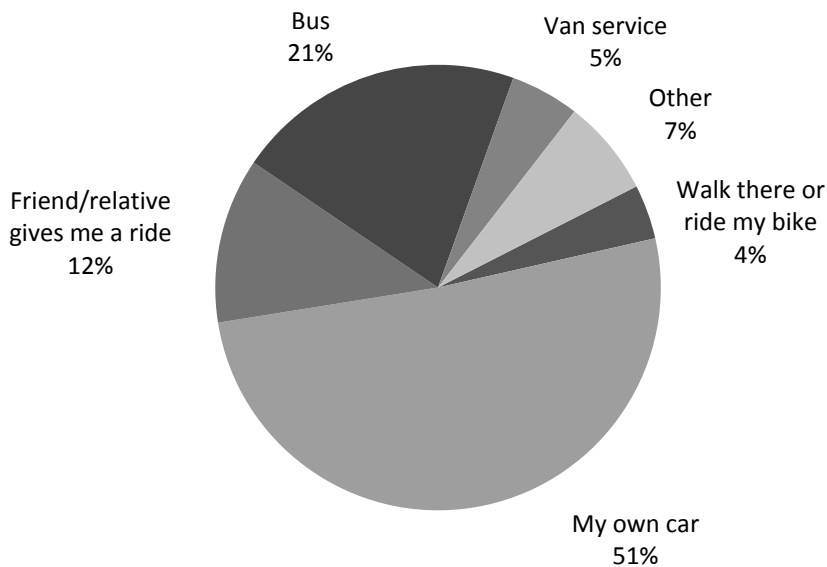

**Figure 6F.2: Barriers to Accessing HIV/AIDS-Related Transportation Services in the Last Six Months (N=45)**

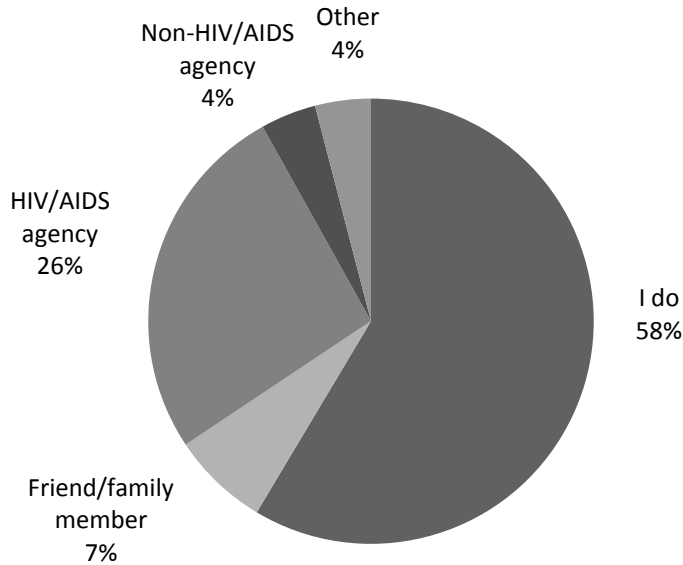

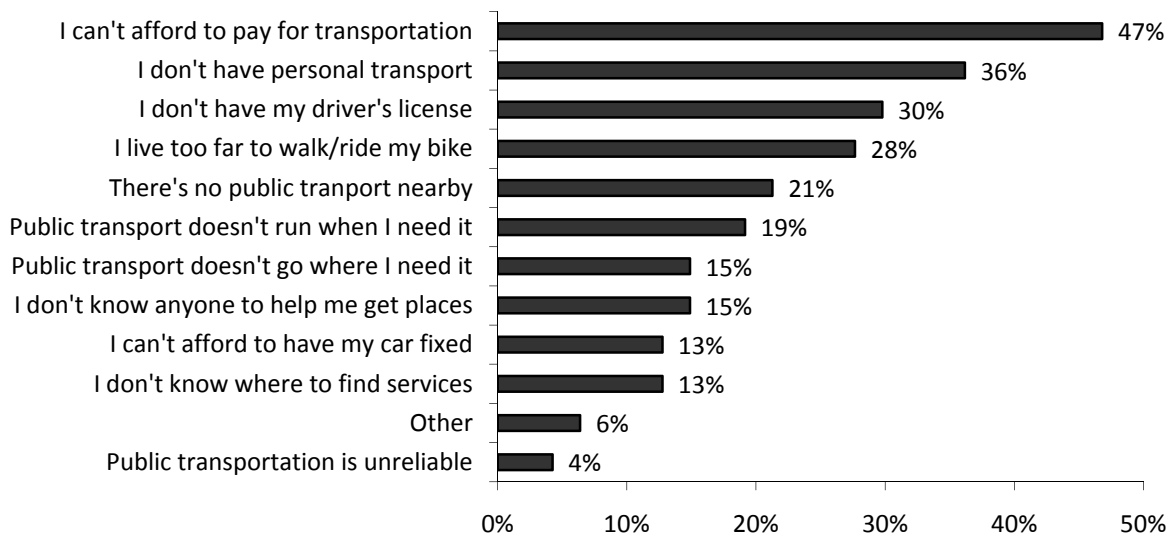
**Figure 6F.3: Usual Means of Transportation to HIV/AIDS Services (N=76)**



**Figure 6F.4: Who Pays for Transportation Services (N=69)**



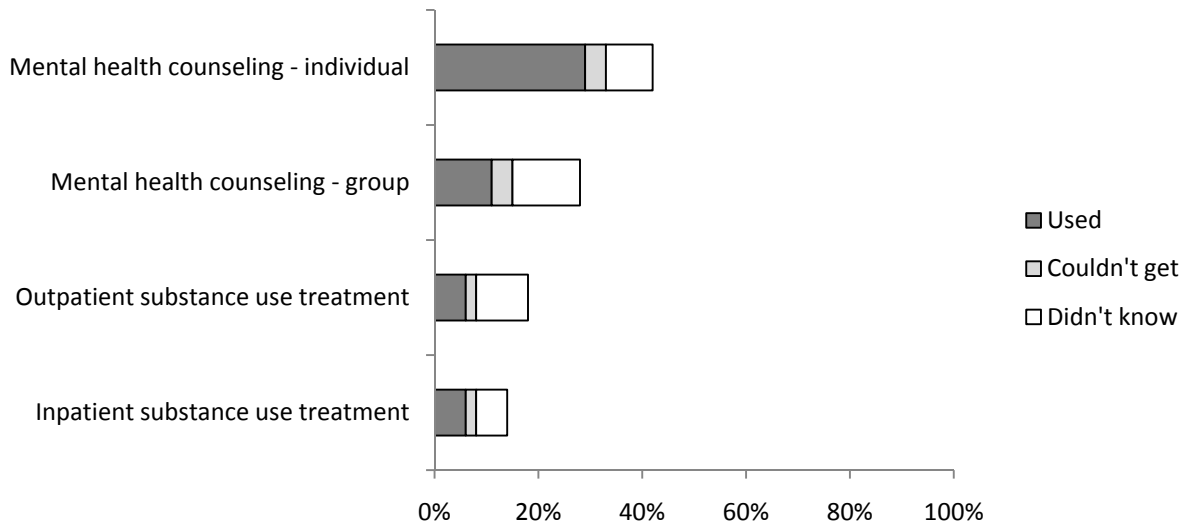
**Figure 6F.5: Barriers to Getting Places in General (N=47)**

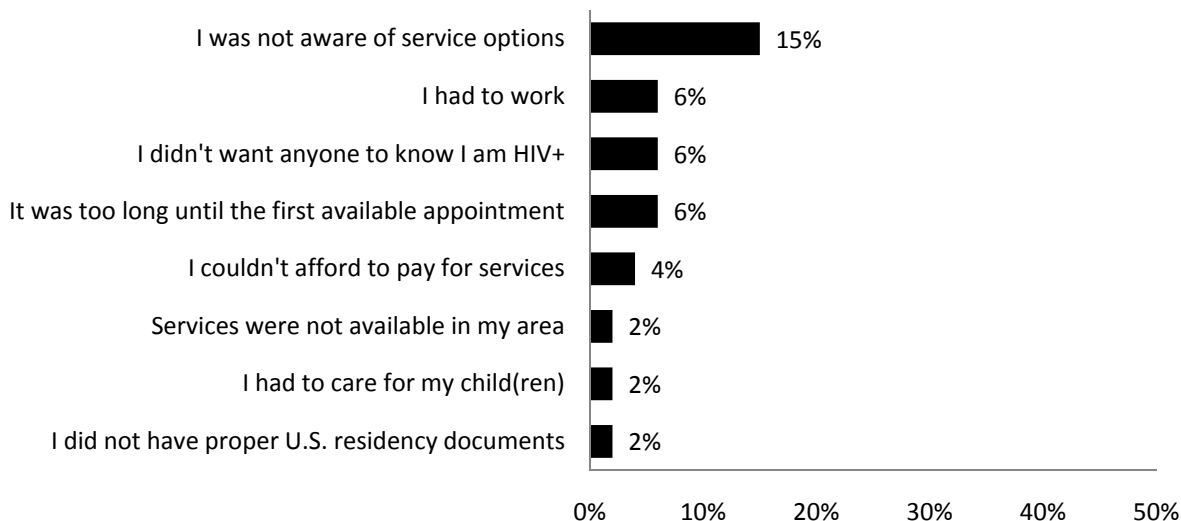
**Figure 6G.1: Need and Use of HIV/AIDS-Related Mental Health/Substance Use Services in the Last Six Months**

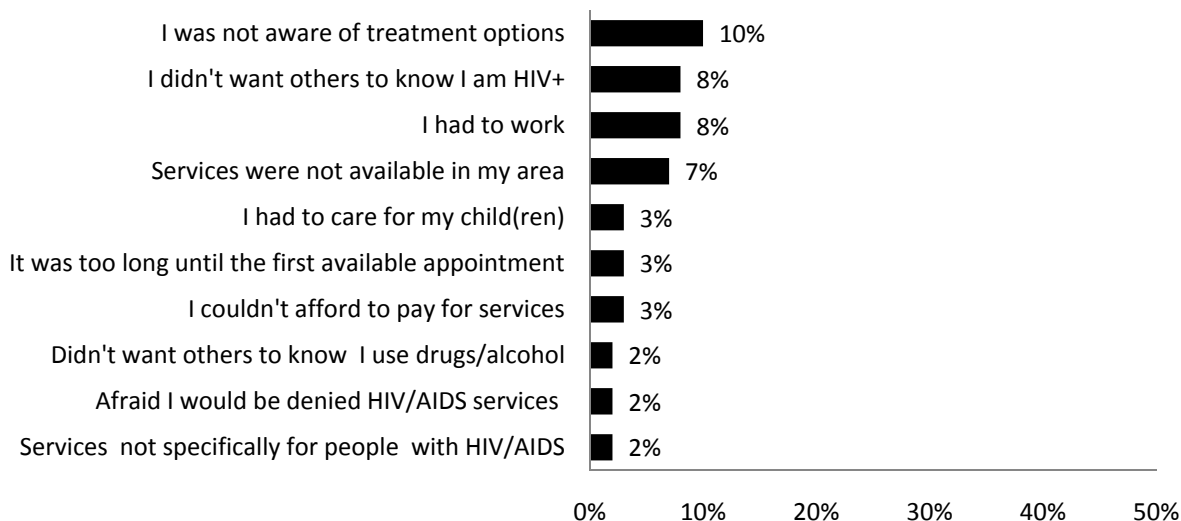

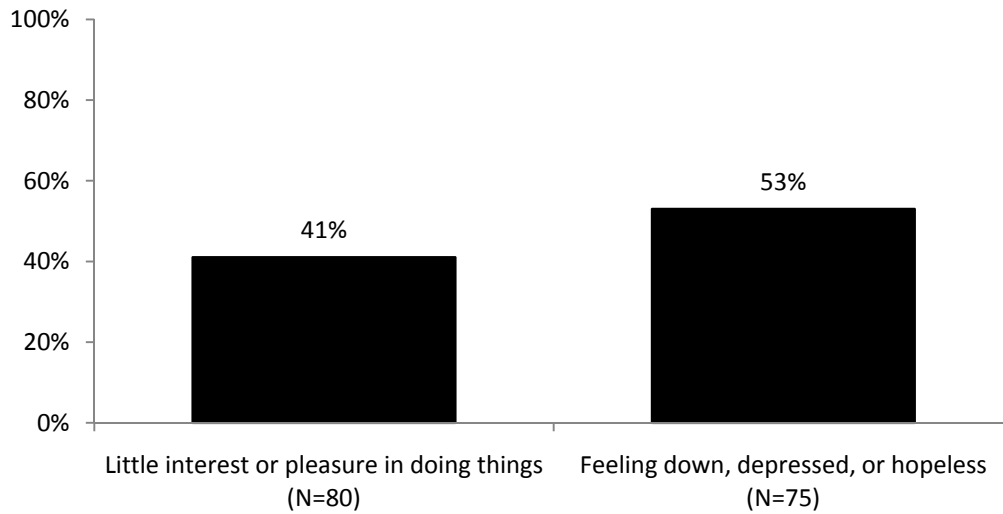
**Figure 6G.3: Barriers to HIV/AIDS-Related Substance Use Services in the Last Six Months (N=59)**



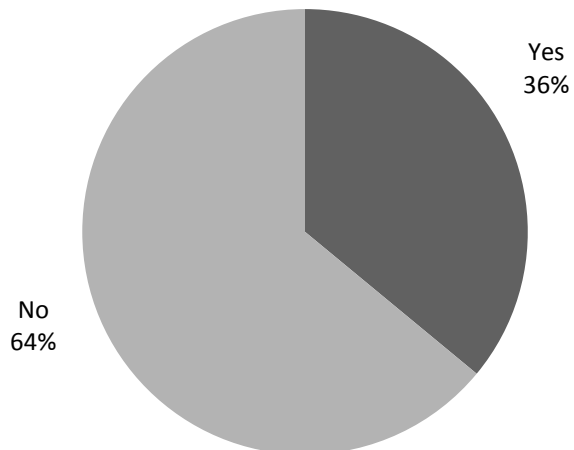

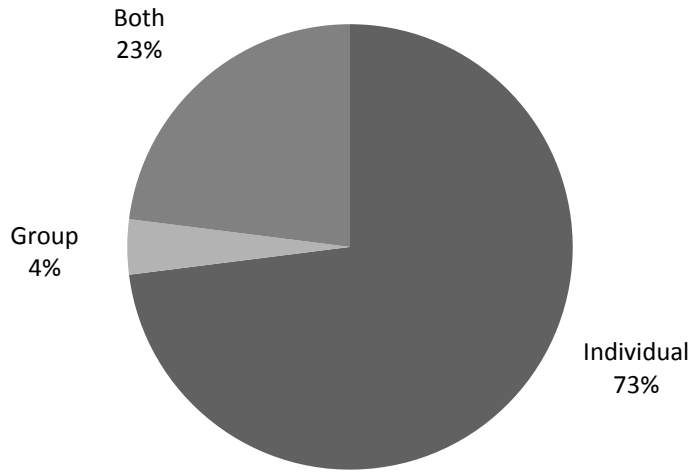
**Figure 6G.4: Report Feeling These Emotions Over the Last Two Weeks**



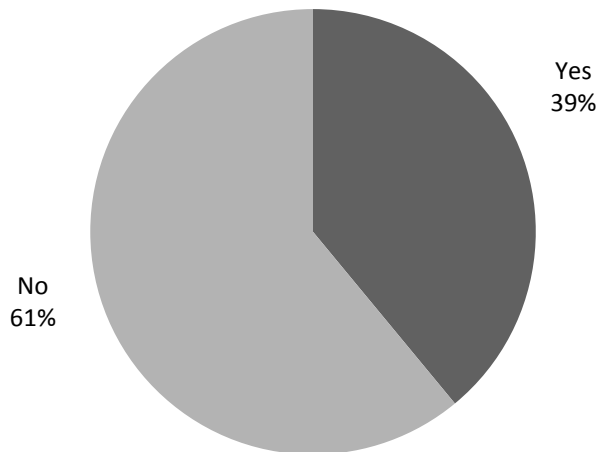
**Figure 6G.5: Received Mental Health Services in Last Six Months (N=77)**



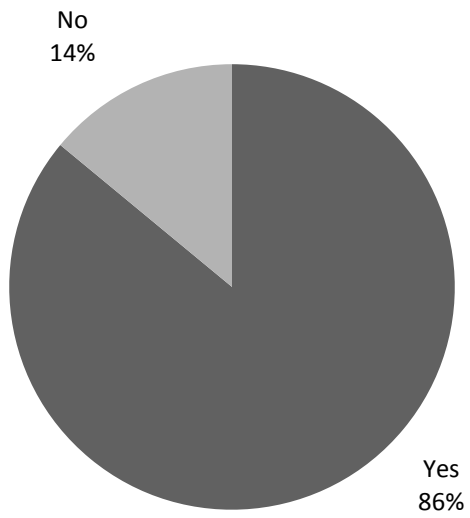
**Figure 6G.6: Types of Mental Health Counseling Received (N=26)**



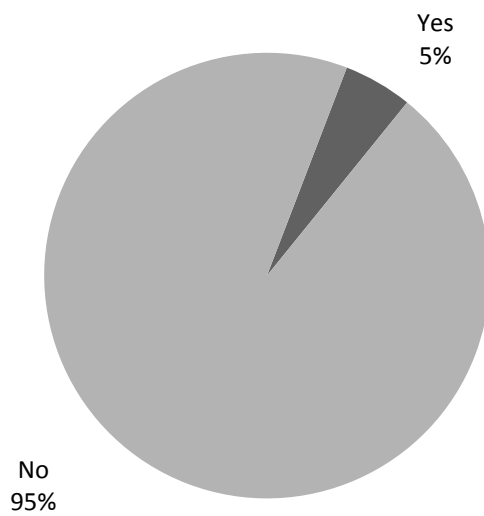
**Figure 6G.7: Received Prescriptions for Mental Health Reasons (N=76)**



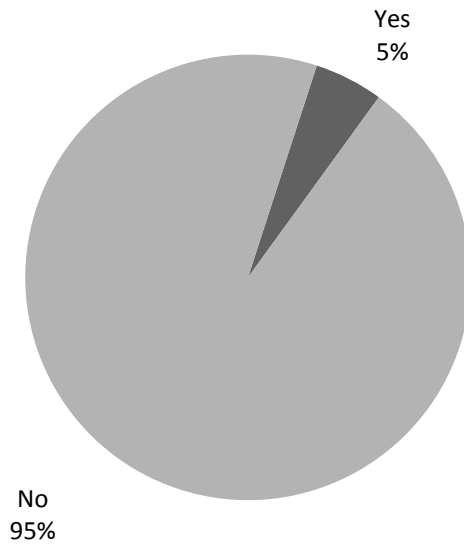
**Figure 6G.8: Received Mental Health Medications Needed (N=29)**



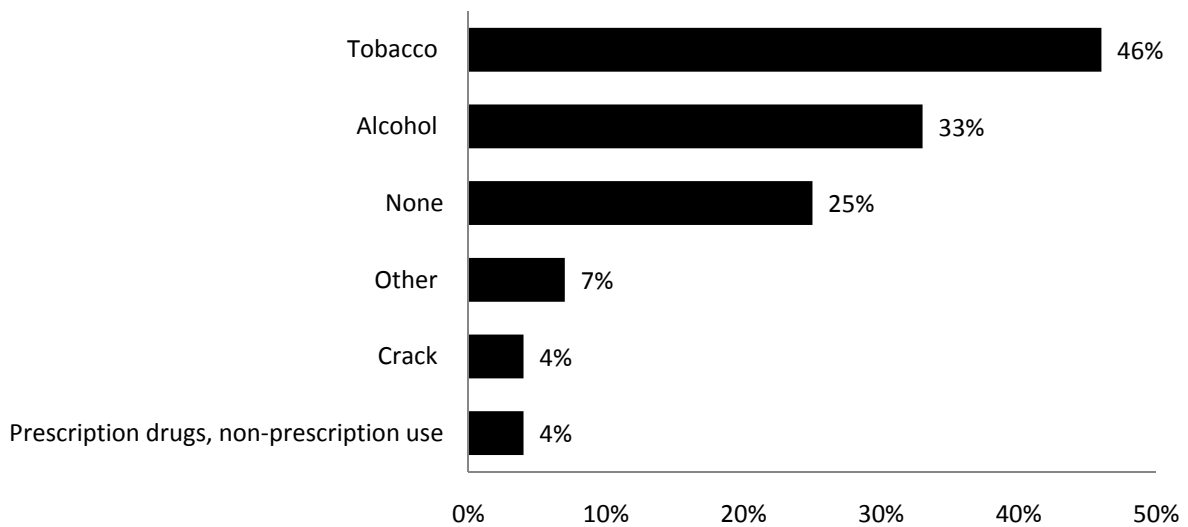
**Figure 6G.9: Hospitalized for Mental Health Reasons in Last Six Months (N=78)**

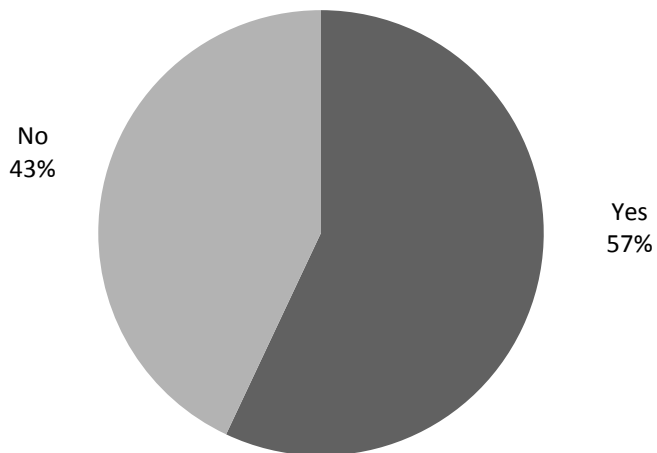
**Figure 6G.14: Used a Clean Needle Last Time**

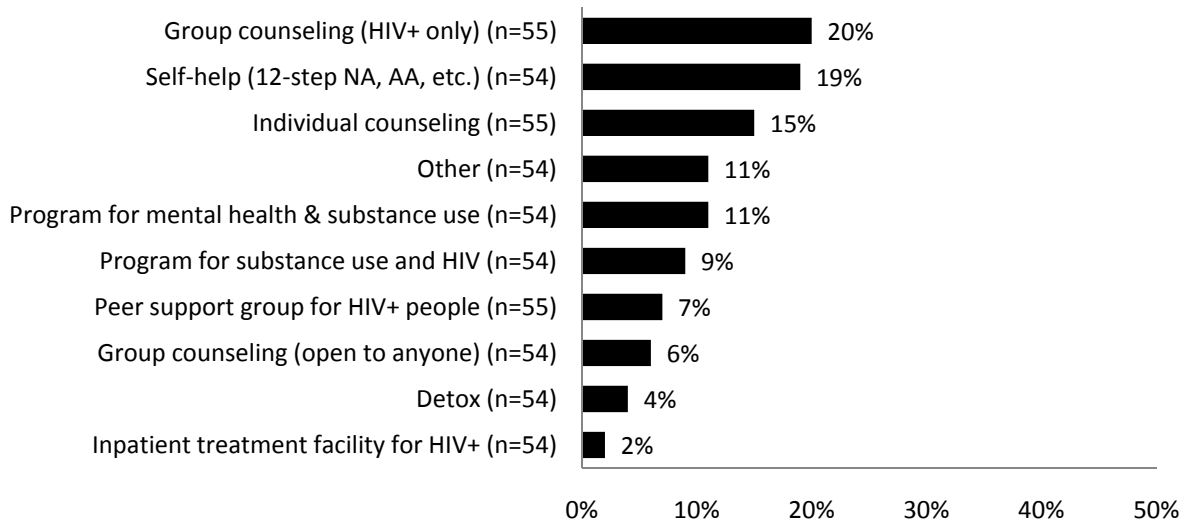
**Figure 6G.15: Knows Where to Get Clean Needles**

**Figure 6G.16: If Using Substances, Expresses a Desire to Stop (N=53)**



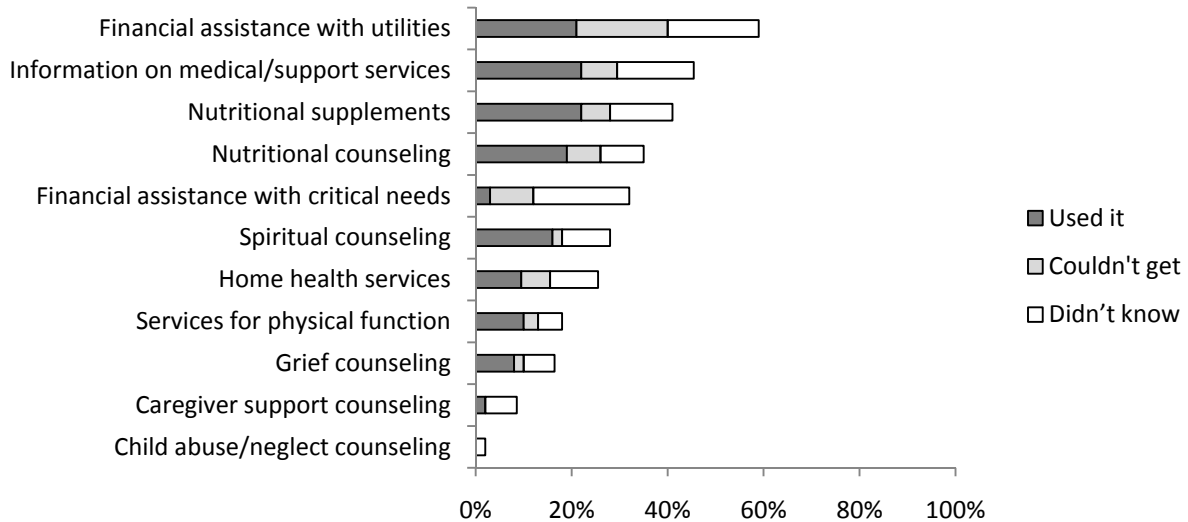
**Figure 6G.17: Services Would Most Likely Use to Help With Substance Use**

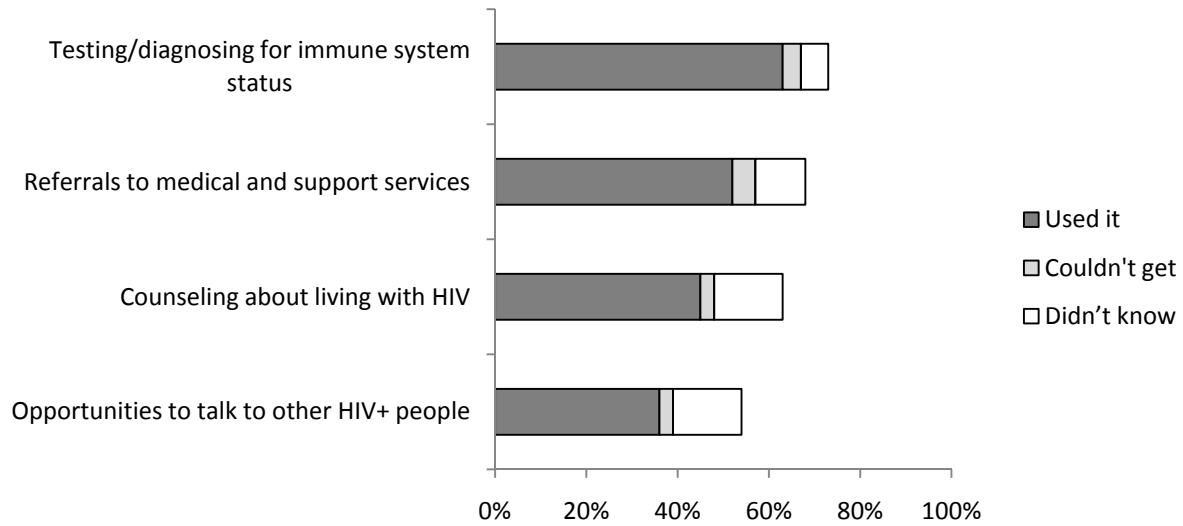

**Figure 6H.2: Need and Use of Other HIV/AIDS Services Early in HIV Diagnosis**

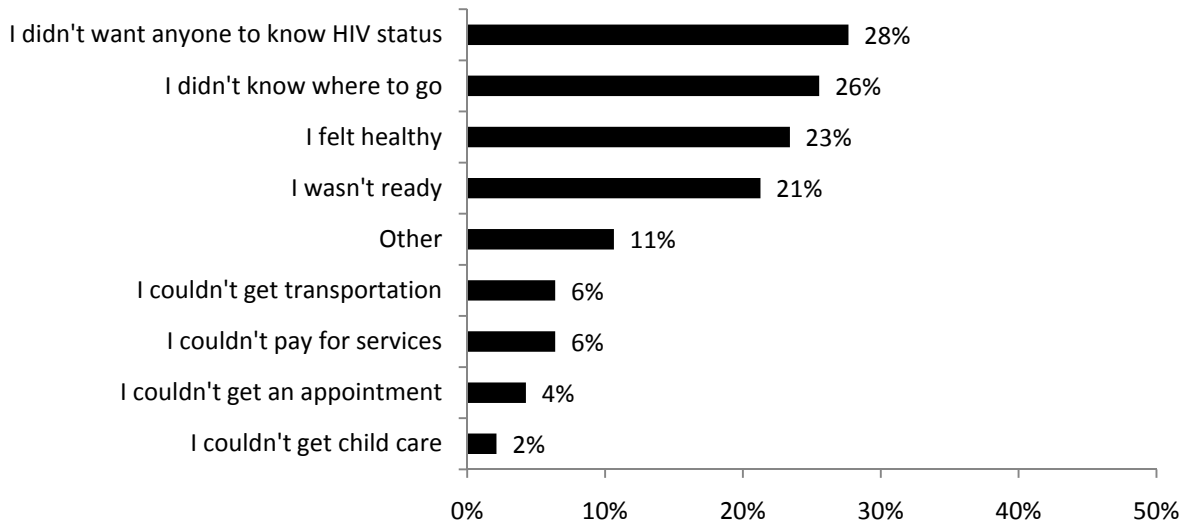

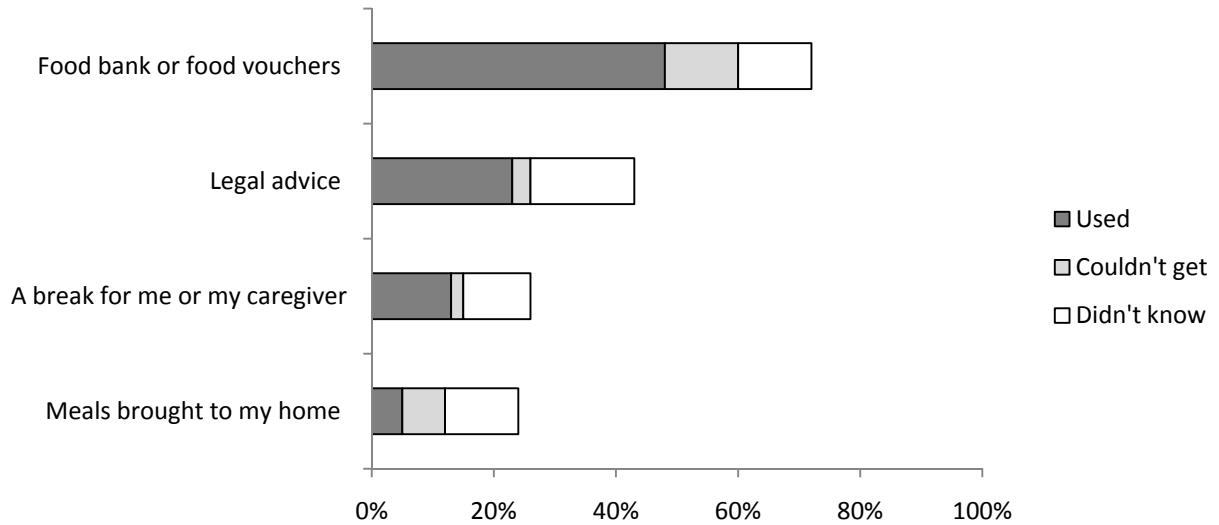
**Figure 6H.3: Barriers to HIV/AIDS-Related Services Early in HIV Diagnosis (N=47)**

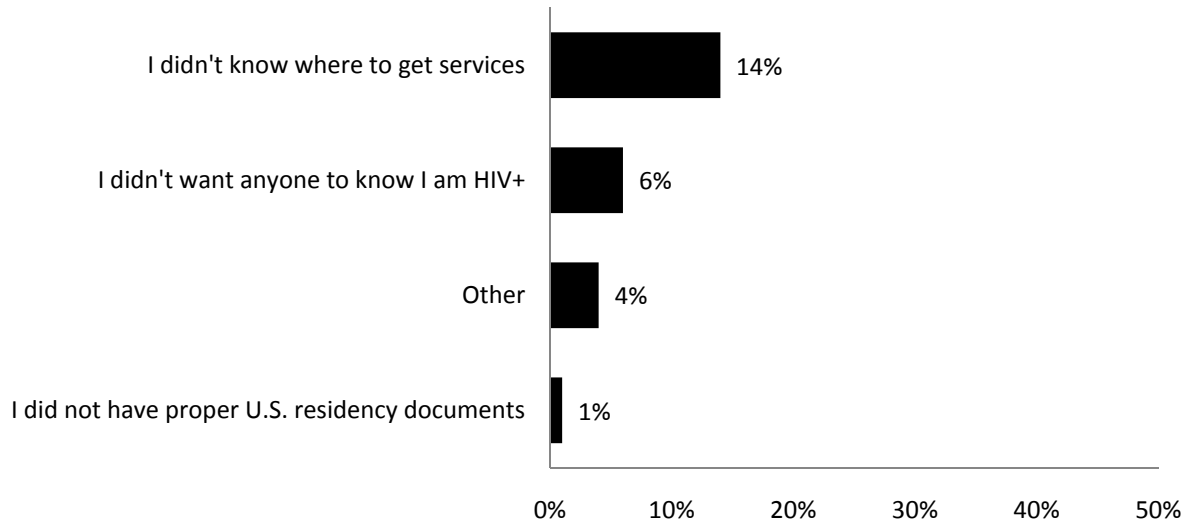
**Figure 6I.1: Need and Use of HIV/AIDS-Related Support Services in the Last Six Months**

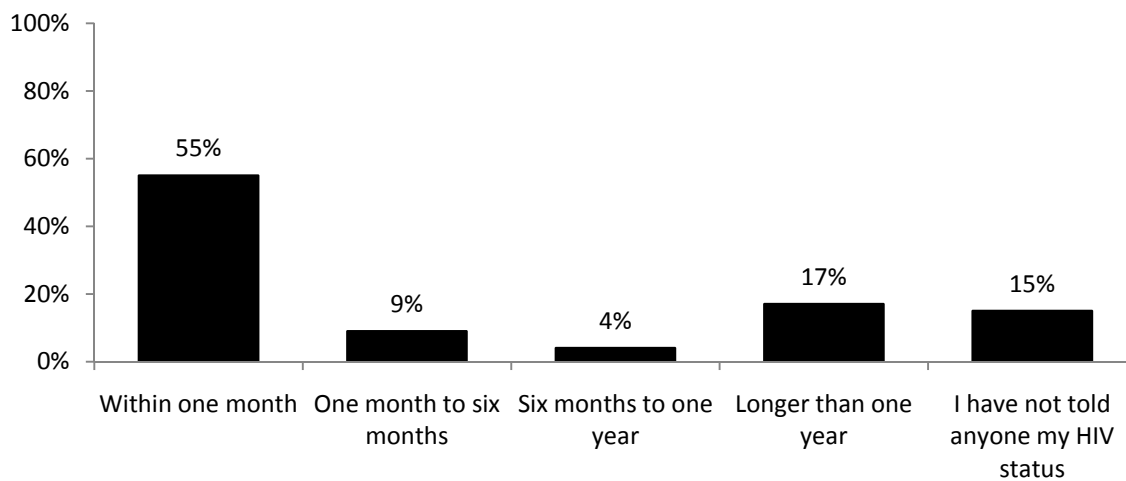

**Figure 6I.2: Barriers to HIV/AIDS-Related Support Services in the Last Six Months (N=84)**

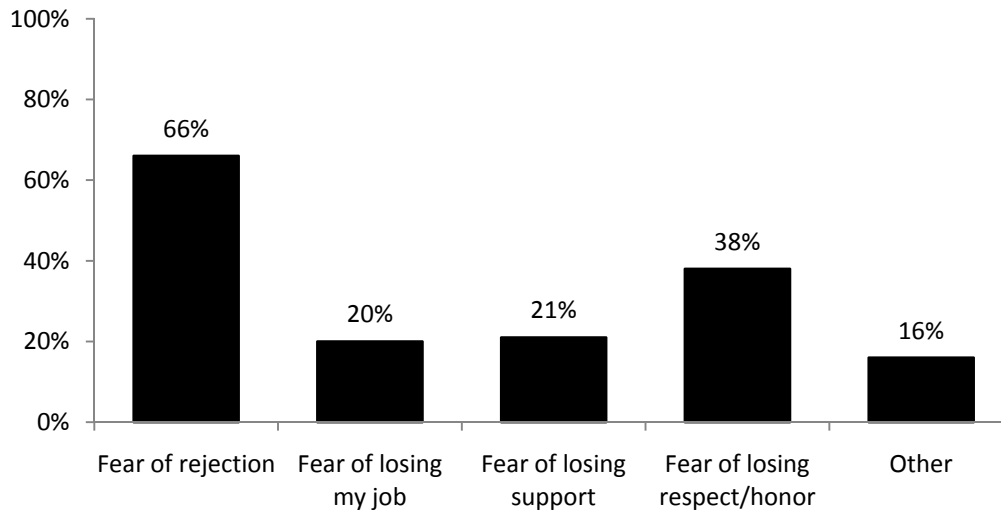

**Figure 6I.3: Time Between HIV Diagnosis and Disclosure of Status (N=78)**

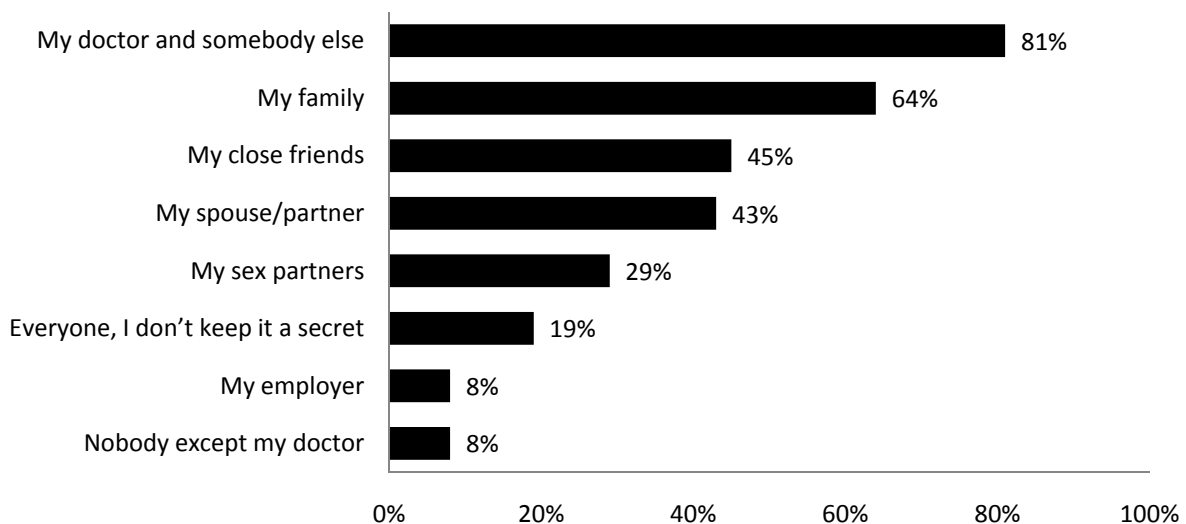


**Figure 6I.4: Reasons for Not Disclosing HIV Status Earlier (N=56)**



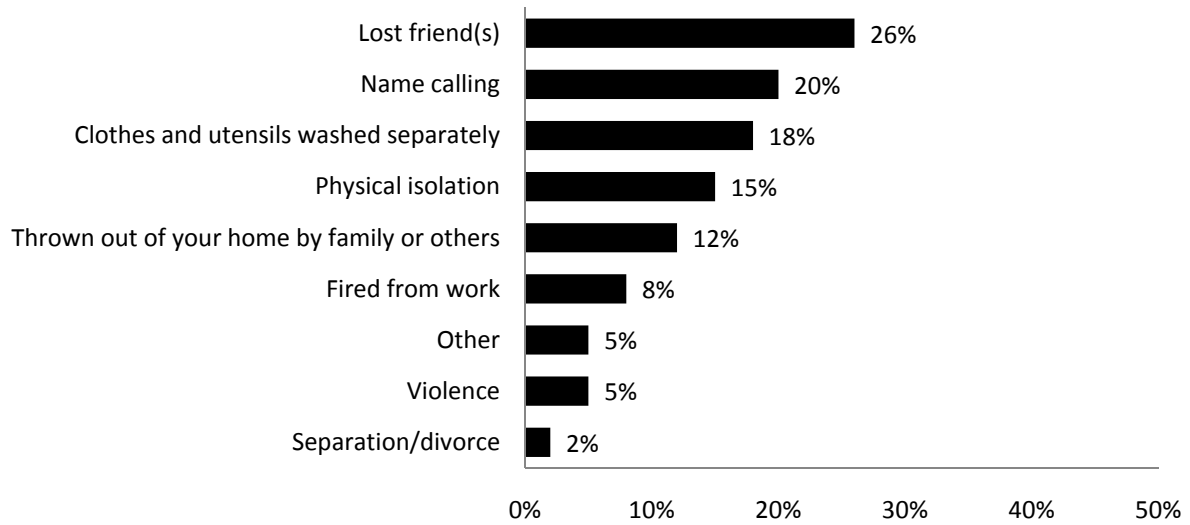

**Figure 6I.5: Others Who Know Respondents' HIV Status (N=84)**



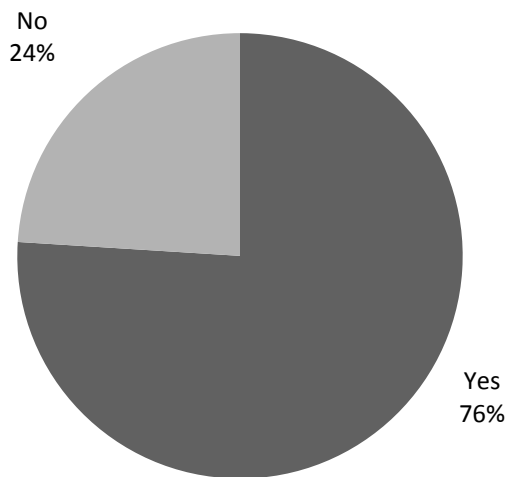

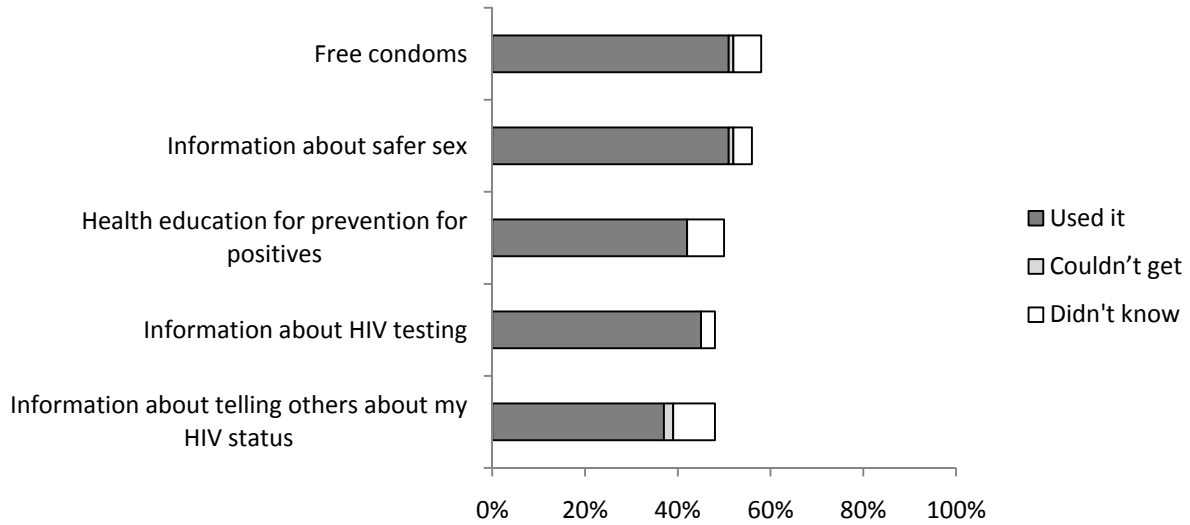
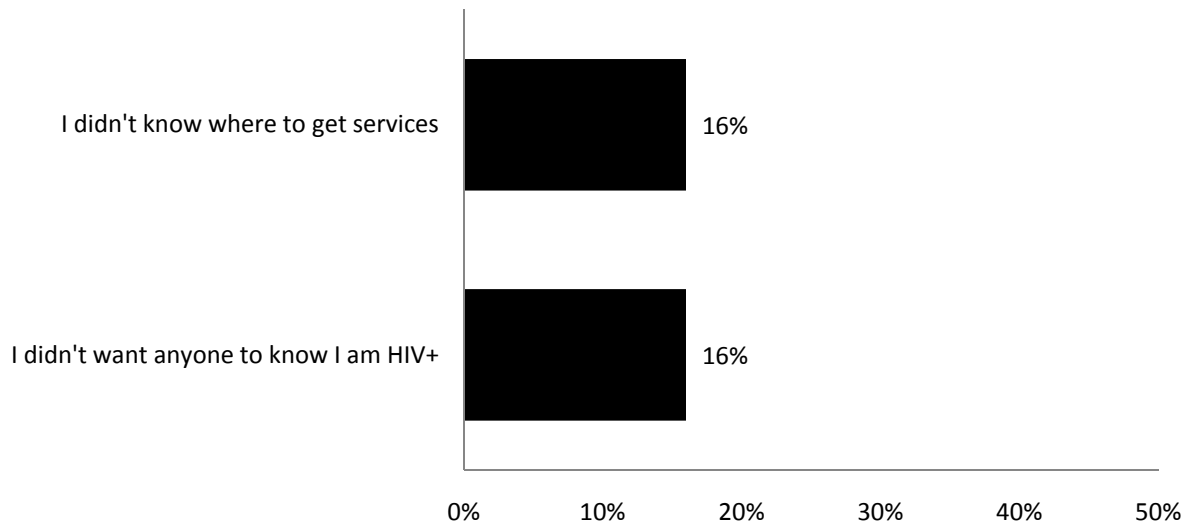

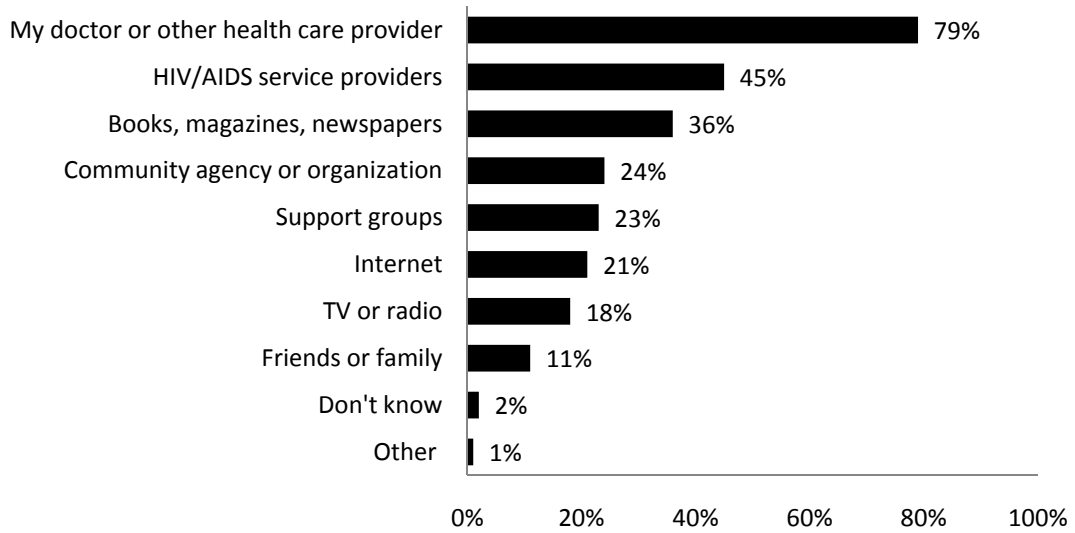
**Figure 6J.2: Barriers to HIV/AIDS-Related Prevention Services in the Last Six Months (N=38)**

**Figure 6J.3: Identified Source of HIV/AIDS information (N=84)**

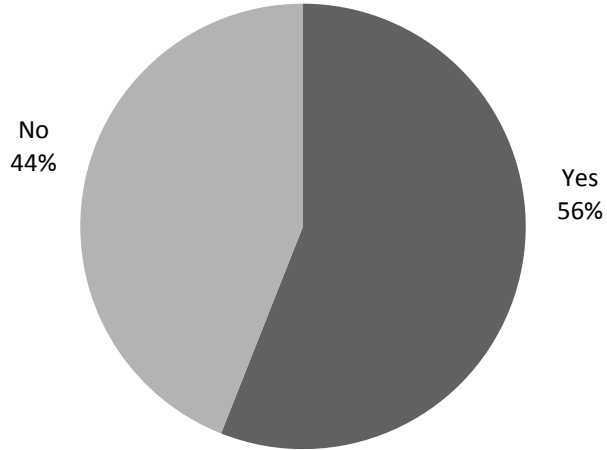

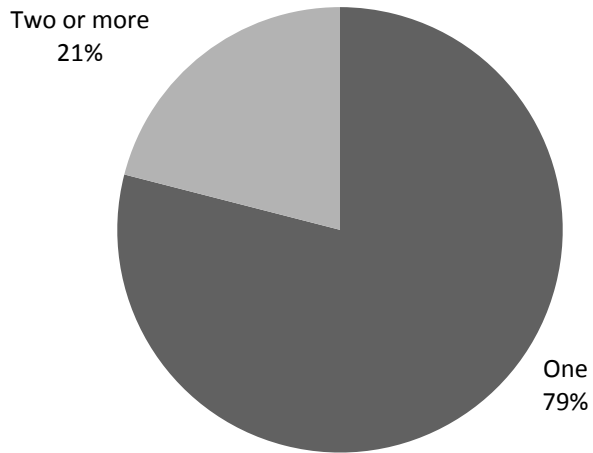

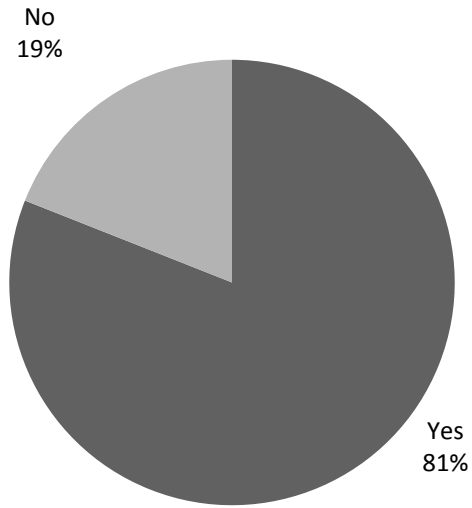
**Figure 6J.4: Had Sex in Last Three Months (N=77)**



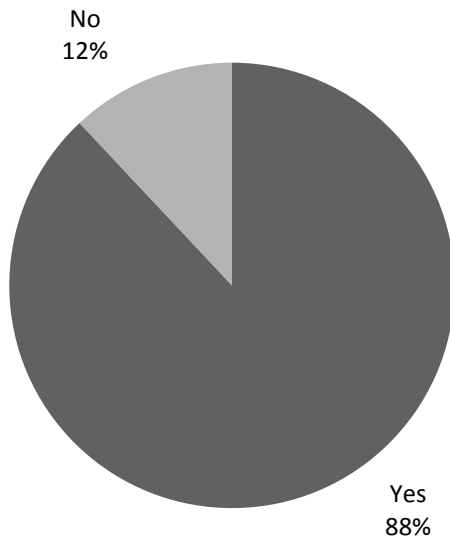
**Figure 6J.5: Number of Sex Partners in the Last Three Months (N=42)**



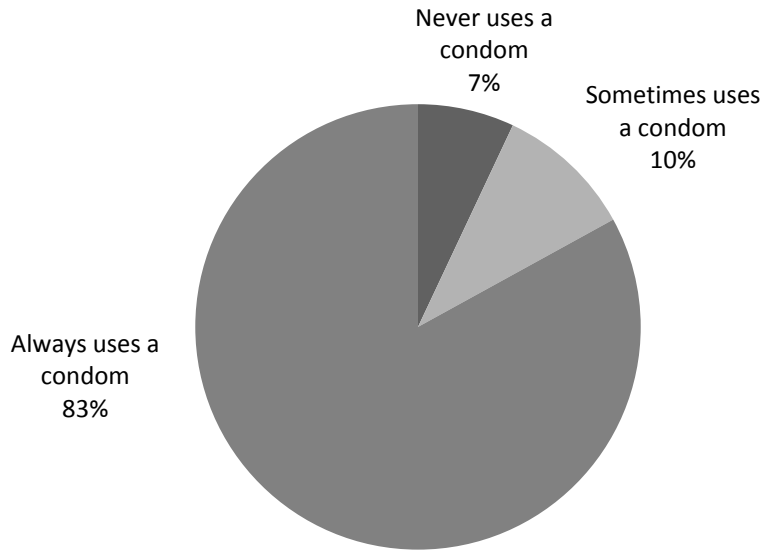
**Figure 6J.6: Have Condoms with Them or at Home (N=77)**



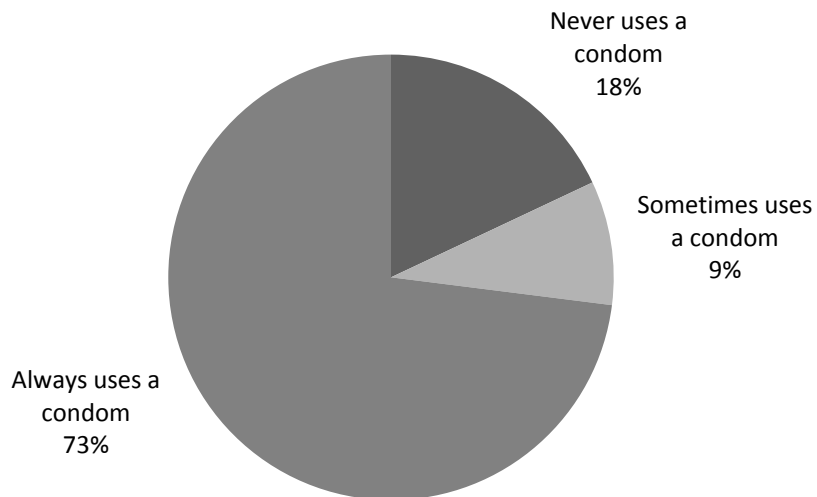
**Figure 6J.7: Used Condom Last Time Had Sex in Last Three Months (N=42)**



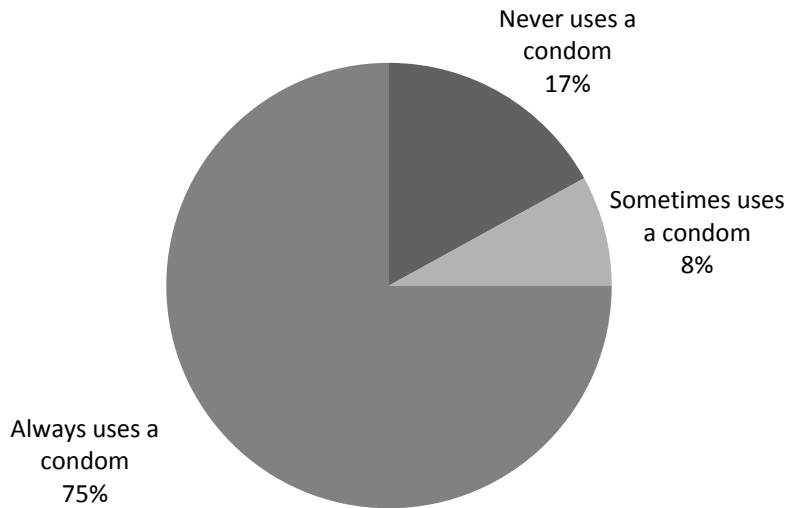
**Figure 6J.8a: Condom Use in the Past Three Months with Male Partner (N=29)**

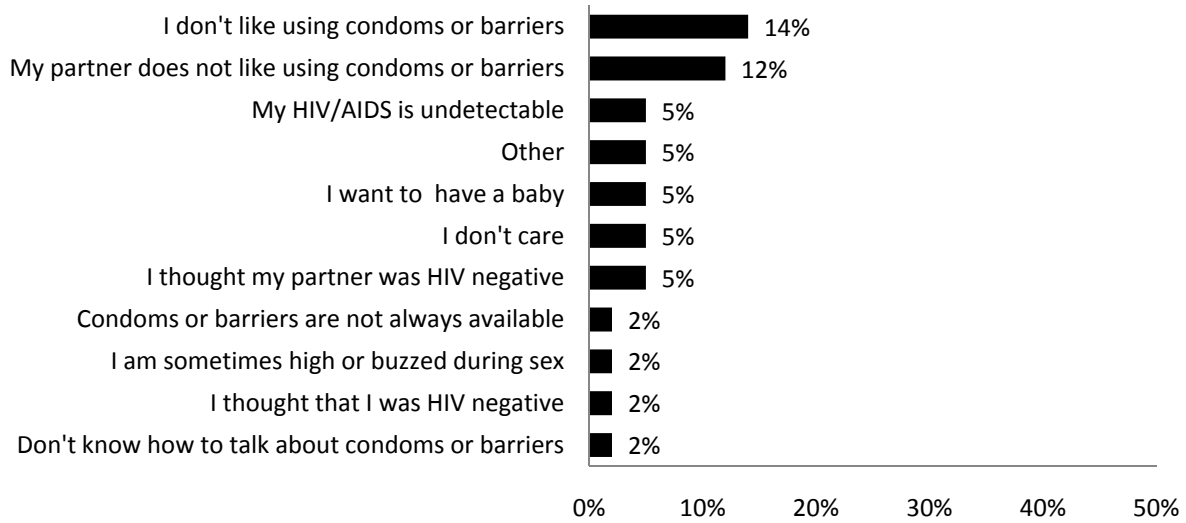
**Figure 6J.8e: Condom Use in the Past Three Months When Had Sex in Exchange for Money or Drugs**

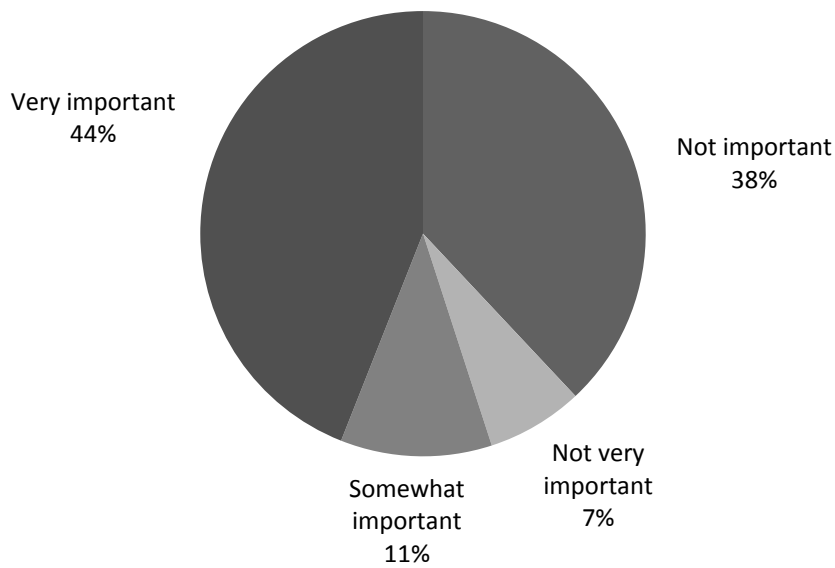

**Figure 6J.9: Reasons for Not Using Condoms in the Last Three Months (N=43)**

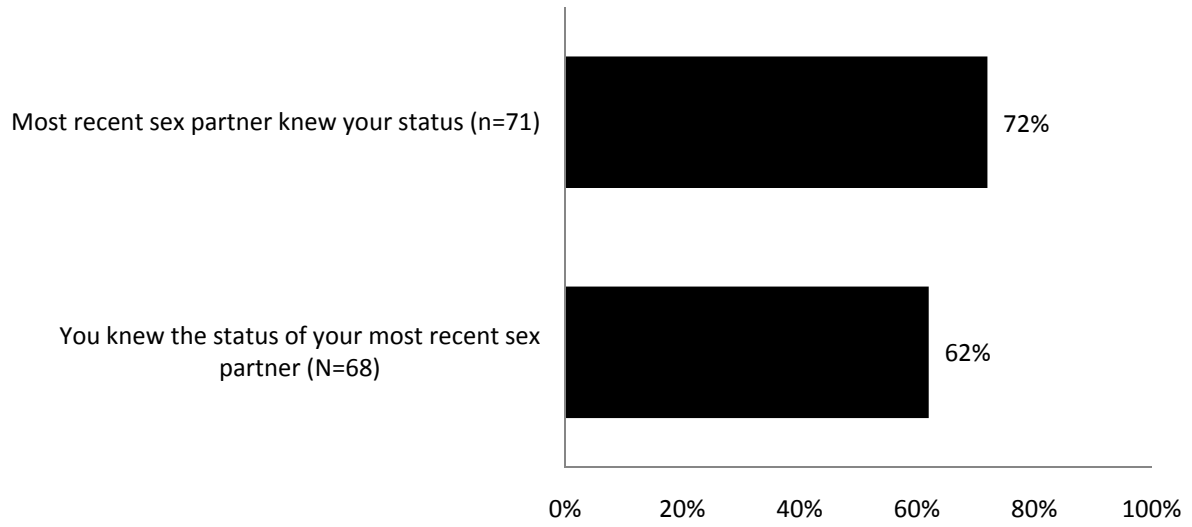

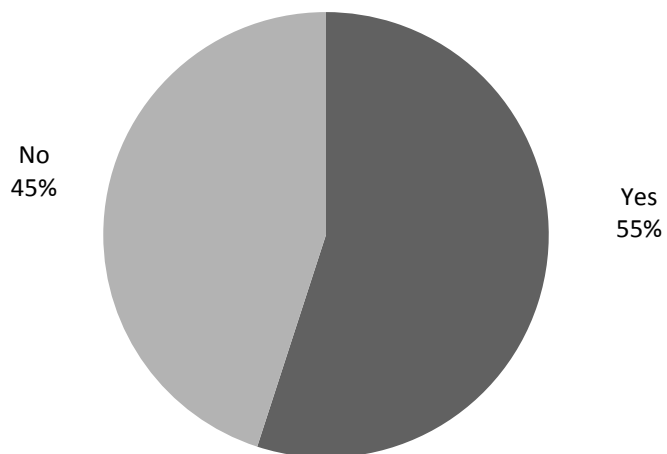
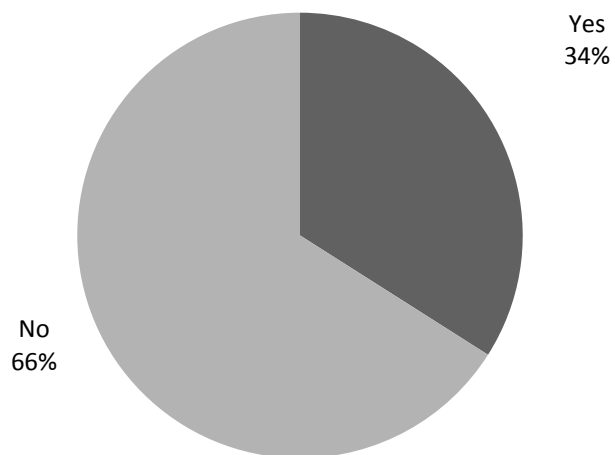


Figure 6K.2: Currently Participate on HIV Planning or Advisory Committee (N=35)
