

2026 Regional Sexual Assault Response Plan

OPH Region 8

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Region 8 has created this Sexual Assault Response Plan (SARP) in compliance with ACT No. 229 of the 2015 Louisiana Regular Legislative Session, which addressed the treatment and billing of survivors of a sexually oriented criminal offense. The plan was developed using state laws, information gathered from regional surveys, and the Region 8 Sexual Assault Planning meeting in September 2015. This plan is reviewed and updated annually to incorporate legislative changes, partner updates, and other relevant revisions. The August 2025 update includes clarifications to existing policies and procedures, as well as the integration of provisions from Act No. 267 of the 2025 Regular Legislative Session, which enacted R.S. 40:1216.1(E)(2) and R.S. 46:2168.1. These statutes address human trafficking, establish procedures for the treatment of trafficking victims, create the Human Trafficking in Emergency Departments Task Force, and require the inclusion of the resulting protocol in regional sexual assault response plans.

Additionally, this update incorporates provisions from Act No. 289, which revises R.S. 36:702(9) to provide for statewide coordination of sexual assault examiners under the authority of the Attorney General, with an emphasis on improving access to Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) services in rural areas. This coordination may be supported through legislative appropriations or grant funding. Act No. 289 also affirms that all licensed hospitals and healthcare providers in Louisiana must offer every sexual assault survivor information about the treatment options outlined in R.S. 40:1216.1(A).

The revised plan was distributed to stakeholders in each parish to ensure awareness and alignment with these updates.

FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PLAN, THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS APPLY:

1 "Emergency contraception" means only drugs approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration with mechanisms of action that likely include the prevention of ovulation, sperm capacitation, or fertilization after sexual intercourse and do not meet the definition of a legend drug as defined in R.S. 40:1060.11.

2 "Forensic Medical Exam" (FME):

(R.S. 15:622 and R.S. 15:623), a forensic medical examination means an examination provided to the survivor of a sexually oriented criminal offense by a healthcare provider for the purpose of gathering and preserving evidence of a sexual assault for use in a court of law. An FME shall include the following:

- a. Examination of physical trauma;
- b. Patient interview, including medical history, triage, and consultation; and
- c. Collection and evaluation of evidence, including but not limited to the following:
 - i. Photographic documentation;
 - ii. Preservation and maintenance of chain of custody;
 - iii. Medical specimen collection;
 - iv. When determined necessary by the healthcare provider, an alcohol-and-drug-facilitated sexual assault assessment and toxicology screening;
- d. any testing related to sexual assault or recommended by healthcare provider; and
- e. any medication provided during the FME which may include emergency contraception and HIV or STI prophylaxis .

3 "Healthcare provider" means either of the following:

a. A physician, sexual assault nurse examiner, or other healthcare practitioner licensed, certified, registered, or otherwise authorized and trained to perform a forensic medical examination.

b. A facility or institution providing healthcare services, including but not limited to a hospital or other licensed inpatient center; ambulatory surgical or treatment center; skilled nursing facility; inpatient hospice facility; residential treatment center; diagnostic, laboratory, or imaging center; or rehabilitation or other therapeutic health setting.

4 "Healthcare services" means services, items, supplies, or drugs for the diagnosis, prevention, treatment, cure, or relief of a health condition, illness, injury, or disease ancillary to a sexually oriented criminal offense.

5 "Sexual assault collection kit" includes all evidence collected during a forensic medical examination.

6 " Sexually oriented criminal offense" has the same meaning as defined in R.S. 15:622.

7 "Unreported sexual assault collection kit" means a sexual assault collection kit where a law enforcement agency has not received a related report or complaint alleging that a sexual assault has occurred.

PURCHASE AND STORAGE OF SEXUAL ASSAULT COLLECTION KITS PRIOR TO USE:

Louisiana State Police purchase and pay for all evidence collection kits, all hospitals within each

parish having an emergency department shall store unused sexual assault collection kits for use in forensic medical examinations (FME) in clean, dry supply rooms.

PROVIDERS CONDUCTING FORENSIC MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS:

Region 8 recognizes the use of Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANEs) or physicians with advanced forensic training as best practice for conducting forensic medical examinations (FMEs). These services will be utilized in every parish where available.

SANE services are directly available in Ouachita, Jackson, and Lincoln Parishes. Survivors from the remaining parishes—Morehouse, Union, West Carroll, East Carroll, Madison, Tensas, Franklin, Caldwell, and Richland—may access SANE services in one of these three parishes, as agreed upon by the coroners.

- Survivors from Caldwell, Morehouse, Richland, Franklin, Ouachita, West Carroll, East Carroll, Madison, and Tensas Parishes will be examined in Ouachita Parish.
- Survivors in Jackson and Lincoln will be examined in those parishes.
- Survivors from Union Parish may receive examinations in either Ouachita or Lincoln Parish, depending on need.

Additionally, Region 8 is served by pediatric-trained and certified SANEs, ensuring appropriate care for child survivors.

The Wellspring is a founding member and lead partner of 6 rural task forces to address sexual and domestic violence in the following parishes: East and West Carroll, Morehouse, Franklin, Richland and Caldwell. Stakeholders from Madison and Tensas Parishes are included in these groups. As a result of these partnerships, survivors of sexual violence in East and West Carroll and Franklin Parishes may, with survivor consent, also be sent to Ouachita Parish to have FMEs conducted by a SANE.

Ouachita Parish Coroner’s office/SANEs conduct FMEs for all parishes within Region 8. Region 8 strives to meet RS 36:702(9) to provide for statewide coordination of sexual assault examiners under the authority of the Attorney General, with an emphasis on improving access to Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) services in rural areas. This coordination may be supported through legislative appropriations or grant funding.

Hospital/healthcare providers:

All licensed hospitals and healthcare providers in Louisiana shall offer every victim of sexually oriented crimes information regarding receipt of forensic medical treatment as presented in this plan per ACT 289 of the 2025 legislative session, RS 40:1216.1(A).

Each parish within Region 8, with the exception of Tensas Parish, has at least one hospital with

an emergency department that is required by law to provide information regarding FMEs to survivors of sexual assault. Tensas Parish refers survivors to Franklin Parish for FMEs. For Ouachita Parish, which contains more than one hospital with an emergency department, it should be up to the survivor to decide which hospital to visit to seek services.

St. Francis Medical Center in Ouachita Parish (Monroe) shall serve as the lead hospital for providing adult and pediatric FME. St. Francis began the first SANE program in NELA as a hospital-based program, prior to the current community-based program. The hospital is located in Ouachita Parish and may accommodate survivors from surrounding areas. However, the remaining hospitals in Ouachita Parish including Glenwood Regional Medical Center, and Ochsner LSU Medical Center Monroe, as well as those in other parishes served by SANEs, are capable of providing these services. SANE services are available directly to survivors in 3 parishes (and by survivor travel to these parishes) as outlined above and in the chart on page 9.

Acute pediatric survivors are served in the hospitals and then referred to a specialist for any further FME. At this time, Teresa Daniel, RN-BC, CEN, SANE-A, SANE-P serves in that capacity for the Children's Advocacy Center in Monroe, Louisiana which serves Caldwell, East and West Carroll, Franklin, Madison, Morehouse, Ouachita, Richland and Tensas Parishes while Pine Hills Children's Advocacy Center in Ruston, Louisiana serves Jackson, Lincoln and Union parishes in Region 8

Transportation of Survivors:

Transportation of survivors from any facility unable or not best able to provide FME to another facility that is qualified to do so may take place by the survivor's personal automobile, by law enforcement (unless the survivor chooses not to report to law enforcement) or by EMS.

Sexual Assault Advocates:

Some parishes (currently Jackson, Lincoln, Ouachita) have advocates available to respond to the hospital to be present with the survivor during the FME. The hospitals and/or law enforcement in the previously mentioned parishes may contact Pine Hills Advocacy Center in Ruston to request advocates in Jackson and Lincoln Parishes. The Wellspring may be contacted to provide advocates in Ouachita Parish. Other parishes may possibly be served in the future by The Wellspring.

Sexual assault advocates will respond to adolescent/adult survivors of sexual assault at Jackson, Lincoln, and Ouachita Parish hospitals on a 24/7 basis. Upon arrival, advocates explain their role to survivors including confidentiality considerations. The survivors choose whether or not they would like the advocate to remain through the duration of the FME and any law enforcement interviews that may take place at the hospital. If the survivor declines services, they are left information regarding resources, follow-up care, and possible effects they may experience as a result of the assault. If desired, advocates remain present to discuss the rights of the survivor, their options in terms of reporting and seeking forensic and medical care, answer questions, address safety issues, provide information about resources and provide

emotional support throughout their contact.

SEXUAL ASSAULT EXAMINATION PROCESS GUIDELINES

Purpose: To provide guidance to the Forensic Examiner during the medical-forensic care of a patient who presents with a chief complaint of sexual assault and an evidence kit is requested, whether by police or by blind report. These guidelines are written with the understanding that each case presentation is different, as well as the tolerance level of each patient. Therefore, this policy should be viewed only as a guide to assist the examiner in decision making during the medical-forensic examination rather than a strict policy. The examiner should always use his or her best judgment, in conjunction with his or her forensic education and the patient's tolerance level when performing a sexual assault medical-forensic examination.

Policy/Guidelines:

The Forensic Examiner should be a Physician or Registered Nurse who has completed additional advanced training in order to provide comprehensive medical-forensic care to patients with a chief complaint of sexual assault. This care includes, but is not limited to, examination of physical trauma, patient interview (including medical history, triage and consultation), collection and evaluation of evidence, including but not limited to photographic documentation, preservation and maintenance of chain of custody, medical specimen collection, and, when determined necessary by the healthcare provider, an alcohol- and drug-facilitated sexual assault and toxicology assessment, any testing related to sexual assault or recommended by healthcare provider, and any medication provided during the FME which may include emergency contraception and HIV or STI prophylaxis.

The first priority in the care of any patient, including the patient whose chief complaint is sexual assault, is to treat life-threatening injuries. Although some portions of the forensic examination may be, at times, appropriately performed while life-sustaining measures are taking place, the forensic examination is likely to take place once treatment for life-threatening injuries has been rendered. The patient presenting to the Emergency Department with a chief complaint of sexual assault has the option to receive medical care only or to receive a medical-forensic examination either with or without law enforcement involvement, depending on the circumstances of the case and the age/mental capacity of the patient. See Louisiana State Statutes for further information.

Procedure/Protocol:

1) When a patient presents to the Emergency Department with a chief complaint of a sexual assault, the patient shall be triaged to assess the urgency of the patient's condition and severity of any injuries present.

Hospitals in Caldwell, East Carroll, Franklin, Jackson, Lincoln, Madison, Morehouse, Richland, Ouachita, Union and West Carroll Parishes:

- When appropriate (in accordance with the ER Protocol), the triage nurse will contact the Ouachita Parish Coroner to request a SANE, as well as a Victim Advocate (The Wellspring in Ouachita Parish and Pine Hills Advocacy Center in Jackson and Lincoln Parishes). The

Emergency Department staff shall follow the appropriate guidelines for caring for the sexual assault patient prior to the Forensic Examiner's arrival.

- If the patient is aged 17 or younger, law enforcement and/or the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services will determine if a referral for an acute FME will be made and they will consult with and request a SANE or refer to the Children's Advocacy Center or Pine Hills Advocacy Center for forensic interview and FME.

2) Once the Forensic Examiner arrives, he or she shall gather all necessary equipment for the medical-forensic examination as well as ensure the working order of all supplies. The examiner shall introduce himself/herself to the patient and explain the role of a Forensic Examiner. He or she shall ensure the patient's understanding of reporting and treatment options before proceeding with the informed consent process and examination. If present, the Survivor Advocate may assist the examiner with providing explanation and assessing understanding of reporting and treatment options prior to the informed consent process. Once the patient acknowledges understanding of the examination process and expresses a desire to proceed with examination, the examiner shall open the Sexual assault collection kit and proceed with the informed consent process. The examiner is responsible for providing informed consent surrounding the sexual assault examination. This includes, but is not limited to, providing the patient with all the necessary information surrounding the examination procedure, declination of any portion of the examination, consequences that may be associated with declination of any portion of the examination, as well as the ability to terminate the examination at any point, etc. Once informed consent has been obtained, he or she shall proceed with the examination of the patient.

3) The examiner shall begin the examination in a manner appropriate for the patient. This guideline is written with the understanding that each patient's needs, tolerance, and ability to answer questions related to the medical-forensic history as well as receiving medical assessments and intervention will vary. In most cases, the examiner will begin the examination by completing the medical-forensic history portion of the sexual assault collection kit paperwork to the best of his/her and the patient's ability.

4) Once the examiner has obtained sufficient information, he or she shall proceed with the physical assessment as well as evidence collection and maintenance. The examiner shall proceed in a manner appropriate for the patient and the medical-forensic history provided by the patient and/or guardian using the instructions provided in the sexual assault collection kit paperwork and training as a guide for the collection process and technique. The survivor shall be provided with a card with the sexual assault collection kit number and Louisiana State Police website to follow the path of the kit.

5) Once the assessment and evidence collection has been completed, the examiner shall provide the patient and/or guardian with the appropriate education and follow-up instructions including but not limited to STI and HIV prophylaxis, Emergency Contraception, medical follow-up care, risks specific to sexual assault patients, assessing and addressing safety concerns, etc. If available, the Victim Advocate may assist with providing follow-up instructions and

addressing safety concerns with the patient but is not a substitute for providing medical related follow-up care.

6) The examiner shall provide a report to the hospital medical staff responsible for the patient's care, if applicable, and discharge instructions. The examiner should provide a verbal report regarding the examination, assessment, concerns, etc. to the physician, physician's assistant, or nurse practitioner, if applicable, assigned to the patient. If no physician or physician substitute is available, the examiner may provide verbal reports to the RN or charge nurse responsible for the patient's care. A SANE/RN Forensic Examination shall never substitute for a Medical Screening Exam per the Emergency Dept. Physician. The hospital medical staff shall be responsible for providing all medications as well as discharge, when appropriate, from the hospital.

In accordance with RS 40:1216.1(8)(a-b), all licensed hospitals and healthcare providers in Louisiana shall adhere to the following procedures in the event that a person presents himself or herself or is presented for treatment as a survivor of a sexually oriented criminal offense:

- The survivor shall be provided with information about emergency contraception, which shall be developed and made available electronically to all licensed hospitals in this state through the Louisiana Department of Health's website and by paper form upon request to the department.
- The treating healthcare provider shall inform the survivor of the option to be provided with emergency contraception at the hospital or healthcare facility and, upon the completion of a pregnancy test yielding a negative result, shall provide emergency contraception upon the request of the survivor.
 - ⊖ "Emergency contraception" means only drugs approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration with mechanisms of action that likely include the prevention of ovulation, sperm capacitation, or fertilization after sexual intercourse. ~~and do not meet the definition of a legend drug as defined in R.S. 40:1060.11.~~

7) The examiner shall complete the remaining sexual assault collection kit documentation as well as seal each evidence envelope in the appropriate manner. All entities, including the healthcare provider/SANE and law enforcement having custody of the sexual assault collection kits, shall provide all required information to the statewide tracking system that was developed and put into place by the Louisiana State Police in accordance with ACT 193 and launched 7/1/2024.

8) The examiner shall contact the law enforcement agency with jurisdiction in order to release the kit as evidence. Once the appropriate law enforcement officer has become available, the examiner shall complete the chain of custody forms appropriately, replace the completed sexual assault collection kit paperwork in the kit, seal the kit in the presence of the law enforcement officer and release it to the officer. The appropriate law enforcement official shall have no more than two hours from the receipt of the notification to retrieve any evidence collected by the hospital. None of the hospitals, nor the Ouachita Parish Coroner's Office have sufficient evidence storage space that would provide for chain of custody.

9) Should an appropriate law enforcement agent be unavailable to receive the sexual assault evidence kit as evidence, the examiner shall follow hospital protocol or contact the coroner in order to proceed with release of the kit as evidence in an appropriate manner.

10) The examiner shall follow the appropriate guidelines set forth by their Coroner/Hospital for proper maintenance of all examination records including, but not limited to, photographs, sexual assault evidence kit paperwork, consent forms, etc.

11) If any person who is seventeen years old or younger presents himself or herself or is presented for treatment as a survivor of a sexually oriented criminal offense, the hospital or healthcare provider shall immediately notify the appropriate law enforcement official and the Department of Children and Family Services, Child Protection Services, as appropriate. The appropriate law enforcement official shall have two hours from the receipt of the notification to retrieve any evidence collected by the hospital.

COLLECTION AND STORAGE OF SEXUAL ASSAULT COLLECTION KITS FOLLOWING USE:

Code number for unreported sexual assault collection kits:

For survivors who do not wish to report the incident to law enforcement, any evidence collected shall be assigned a code number and the hospital or healthcare provider shall maintain code records for a period of at least twenty years from the date the survivor presented for treatment (ACT No. 669). The hospital or healthcare provider shall assign the code number by affixing to the evidence container a code to be used in lieu of the survivor's identifying information to maintain confidentiality. The code number is to be used for identification should the survivor later choose to report the incident. The healthcare provider shall provide all information required by the statewide tracking system operated by the office of state police, pursuant to R.S. 15:624.1.

Collection of completed kits from healthcare providers:

At the time of completion of the FME, the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) or emergency department physician that conducted the FME will notify the appropriate law enforcement agency to collect the kit within two hours-following chain of custody guidelines.

The provider conducting the FME will notify either the law enforcement entity to which a report has been made, and that is currently investigating the report or to the law enforcement entity having jurisdiction over the location of the hospital. This applies to both reported and unreported sexual assault collection kits.

Law enforcement is responsible for the collection of completed sexual assault collection kits following chain of custody guidelines within two hours of notification of completion. Law enforcement is also responsible for storage of these kits whether or not the crime has been reported to law enforcement. Additionally, law enforcement will deliver kits to the crime lab according to state law. ACT No. 229 stipulates that within 30 days of receiving a sexual assault

collection kit for a reported case, the criminal justice agency shall submit the sexual assault collection kit to a forensic laboratory for testing.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING PROTOCOL

ACT No. 267 of the 2025 Regular Legislative Session provides for R.S. 40:1216.1(E)(2) and enacts R.S. 46:2168.1, relative to human trafficking; to establish procedures for treating victims of human trafficking; to establish the Human Trafficking in Emergency Departments Task Force within the office of human trafficking prevention; to require the task force to prepare a protocol; and to provide for inclusion of the protocol in the regional sexual assault response plans. This Sexual Assault Response Plan will be amended to add the Human Trafficking Protocol upon its development and adoption by the Human Trafficking in Emergency Departments Task Force.

BILLING FOR FME:

The survivor will be provided a copy of the Louisiana Department of Health provided pamphlet that details the billing process for services rendered pursuant to RS 40:1216.1., currently entitled "Sexual Assault Bill of Rights".

No hospital or healthcare provider shall directly bill a survivor of a sexually oriented criminal offense for any healthcare services rendered in conducting a FME, including the healthcare services rendered in accordance with RS 40:1261.1(5) paragraph (2)(a) Forensic examiner and hospital or healthcare facility services directly related to the exam, including integral forensic supplies. (b)Scope procedures directly related to the FME including but not limited to anoscopy and colposcopy.

The healthcare provider who performed the forensic medical exam and the healthcare facility shall submit a claim for payment for conducting a forensic medical exam directly to the Crime Victim Reparations Board to be paid in strict accordance with the provisions of R.S. 20 46:1822. A survivor of a sexually oriented criminal offense shall not be billed directly or indirectly for the performance of any forensic medical exam.

These provisions shall not be interpreted or construed to apply to either of the following:

- (a) A healthcare provider billing for any medical services that are not specifically set forth in this Section or provided for diagnosis or treatment of the survivor for injuries related to the sexual assault; or
- (b) A survivor of a sexually oriented criminal offense seeking reparations in accordance with the Crime Victims Reparations Act, R.S. 46:1801 et seq. for the costs for any medical services that are not specifically set forth in this Section or provided for the diagnosis or treatment of the survivor for injuries related to the sexual assault.

A request for reimbursement by a healthcare provider or healthcare facility for the performance of a forensic medical exam shall not constitute reparations and therefore shall be

immediately payable and not require approval from the crime victim reparations board as a condition of payment. The board shall direct payment to be made to a healthcare provider or healthcare facility no later than thirty calendar days from the date the attestation is submitted to the board by the healthcare provider or healthcare facility.

Each hospital or healthcare provider will develop a plan for submitting claims for payment of services not covered as part of the FME to any of the following: Louisiana Medicaid, Medicare, or Tricare programs if the survivor is enrolled as a beneficiary in any of these programs.

Survivors may submit claims for their portion of costs unrelated to the FME and fees not covered or subject to deductibles, coinsurance or copays to the Louisiana Crime Victims Reparations Board.
