


All Drug Poisoning Deaths United States, 1/2018 to 12/2021 12-month provisional counts


Opioid Poisoning Deaths United States, 1/2018 to 12/2021 12-month provisional counts


Synthetic Opioid (Fentanyl) Poisoning Deaths United States, 1/2018 to 12/2021 12-month provisional counts


All Drug Poisoning Deaths Louisiana, 1/2018 to 12/2021 12-month provisional counts




All Drug Poisoning Deaths by Month Louisiana, 2019-2021*






Opioid Poisoning Deaths by Month Louisiana, 2019-2021*






Synthetic Opioid Poisoning Deaths by Month Louisiana, 2019-2021*






Stimulant Poisoning Deaths by Month Louisiana, 2019-2021*






Drug Poisoning Deaths by Category Louisiana, 2019-2021*






Emergency Department Overdose Visits by Chief Complaint Louisiana, 2018-2021




Percent Change Among Total Drug-involved vs. Opioid-involved Deaths Louisiana, 2012-2021






Drug Deaths by Specific Opioid Drugs Louisiana, 2014-2021

State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System (SUDORS)

- LA-SUDORS began collecting data on fatal opioid-related overdoses in 2018 for a subset of parishes.
- Program expanded nationwide to collect data on ALL drug overdose deaths as part of CDC's Overdose Data to Action (OD2A) program.
- Data from death certificates, medical examiner reports, and toxicology testing results for decedents* from Louisiana are abstracted and entered into the SUDORS online system.

The Bureau of Health Informatics (BHI) in the Office of Public Health (OPH) is supporting these strategies by leveraging data from multiple internal and external source

researchers, and decision makers to understand, analyze, and apply data to statewide opioid abuse reduction enorts. Its goal is to evaluate the impact of programmatic and policy efforts and track the behavior of what is now considered a public health epidemic nationwide.

Data within this system is interactive, and can be viewed in different formats, such as table, graphs and maps. The data displays, which have been carefully designed and reviewed by health experts and data specialists, allow various indicators to be explored geographically and over time.
